Financial Aid

For students who demonstrate need and complete the financial aid application, the University provides institutional. Students can reapply for financial aid every academic year if they continue to demonstrate financial need. Fellowships

AUC offers over 30 competitive fellowships for fully admitted graduate students with full-time status. Many fellowships are available to students from any discipline, whereas other fellowships are discipline-specific. While all fellowships recognize high-achieving applicants, some also consider financial need.

African Graduate Fellowships (3.2 GPA minimum)

- Awarded for two academic years and the intervening summer session
- Covers tuition, student services and activities fees, housing, monthly stipend, medical services and health insurance

University Fellowships (3.2 GPA minimum)

- Awarded for one semester; subject to review every semester
- Covers tuition fees for up to three courses (9 credit hours), a monthly stipend and student services and activities fees

International Graduate Fellowships (3.2 GPA minimum)


- Awarded for two academic years and the intervening summer session; subject to review every semester

HOW TO APPLY

Applications for admission are submitted online only.

Application Requirements

- Application fee
- Online application form, which can be accessed at www.applyweb.com/auc/index.fil
- A statement of purpose of no fewer than 500 words
- An updated CV that includes work experience and academic background
- Official transcript(s) with proof of degree completion
- A minimum of two letters of recommendation
- A clear copy of a valid passport
- Two recent passport-size photos
- For the Master in Business Administration program, satisfactory valid GMAT results (500 is the minimum acceptable score)
- For the Master of Science in finance, satisfactory valid GMAT or GRE results
- For the Master of Arts in economics or economics in international development, satisfactory GRE results
- For all PhD programs, satisfactory valid GRE results
- For the Master of Arts in journalism and mass communication, nonedited writing samples
- For the Master of Arts in philosophy, a 1000-word writing sample demonstrating critical thinking

- Fall priority admission deadline: December 15
- Fall priority fellowship deadline: January 1
- Fall regular admission deadline: April 1
- Fall regular admission deadline: April 15
- Spring admission deadline: October 1
- Spring fellowship deadline: October 15

To qualify for a student visa, international students must maintain full-time status (three courses per semester) for the duration of their degree.
