OR</u> - Vaccination certificate • <u>Exception</u> is made for passengers travelling from (Japan / China / Thailand / North America / South America / Canada / London (Heathrow) /Rome / Paris / Frankfurt / New Zealand / Australia/South Korea) PCR test will be 96 hours before departure time. • All children "regardless their nationalities" <u>under 12 years old are exempted from PCR test.</u> • <u>The submitted PCR certificate will be accepted if it meets these requirements:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Includes the hour and the date of sampling, on which the 72 hours will be counted.</u> • Issued by an authorized accredited laboratory <u>and stamped with the laboratory's stamp OR with a QR code</u> "instead of the laboratory stamp" and does not contain scraping, cancellation or addition. • Certificate is accepted (Paper / electronic) in Arabic, English or <u>French language.</u>(the certificate must contain a readable QR code) • <u>Accepted Vaccination certificate is either :</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Approved vaccination Certificate (Paper / electronic). the certificate must contain a readable QR code) OR</u> - <u>A vaccination certificate approved and certified by the Egyptian Embassy in the country of issuance OR</u> - <u>Vaccination certificate which is mutually recognized between Egypt and (Maldives / Serbia / Malta / Turkey / Philippine /UK / Australia / Hungary /Iraq) by The Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</u> • <u>Passengers are required to be fully vaccinated with one of the vaccines approved by World Health Organization and The Egyptian Medicines Authority.</u>

- Passengers can travel to Egypt after 14 days of receiving the 2 doses of (Pfizer / AstraZeneca / Moderna / Sinopharm / Sinovac / Sputnik) or after 14 days of receiving the first dose of Johnson & Johnson.
- **Transit Passengers** (who are not entitled for Hotel Accommodation and **will be staying** at Cairo Airport till their onward Flight) don't require having a PCR Test upon Arrival.
- **Transit Passengers** (who are entitled for Hotel Accommodation and **will not be staying** at Cairo Airport till their Onward Flight) must be in Possession of Negative PCR Test even if their Final Destination don't need require a Negative PCR Test to be able to accommodate them in Hotel.
- International Passengers (who are travelling directly) to (Sharm el Sheikh / Taba / Hurghada / Marsa Alam) airports who failed to submit a valid PCR test (72 hours before flight departure time), shall undergo the PCR test upon arrival to those airports with charge of 30 USD. “Those passengers will be isolated in their hotels till the PCR test result is received and “In case the PCR is positive, passenger will be self-isolated in his / her room at the hotel and to coordinate with the Egyptian Ministry of health”.
- Passengers travelling from (India / Bangladesh / Pakistan / Bhutan / Myanmar / Nepal / Sri Lanka / Brazil / Latin America / Vietnam) will NOT need the ID NOW COVID-19 test. Aforementioned test will be only applying to the emergency cases and to passengers participating in mass human gatherings, or providing the test to passengers in accordance with the health conditions of the country of travel.
- **Lifting flight ban between Egypt and (South Africa, Namibia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Lesotho, Eswatini and Mozambique) (“PCR / vaccination certificate” before arrival is still required)** in addition to ID NOW test upon arrival
 - Egyptair will be responsible to collect the fees of (ID NOW test upon arrival).
 - A- If ID NOW test result is negative,** the passenger will be allowed to enter and will be followed up for 14 days.
 - B- If ID NOW test result is positive,** the passenger will **NOT** be allowed to enter (this doesn't apply on the Egyptian passengers) and the airline will be responsible to return positive cases immediately. (Egyptian positive cases will be directed to the concerned hospitals)
- Passengers arriving from (Sharm el Sheikh / Taba / Hurghada / Marsa Alam / Luxor) will be subjected to PCR test in addition to the negative result of ID NOW test upon arrival.
- For passengers who are fully vaccinated in Egypt, the **electronic** vaccination certificate issued from The Egyptian Ministry of Health and holding its logo is the only acceptable vaccination certificate.
- (PCR-NAA/IGg-IGm) tests are NOT acceptable by Egyptian authority.
- Passengers arriving from Cameroon ONLY can present a copy / electronic PCR certificate.
- **PCR test certificate EXPIRES as soon as the passenger used it to travel outside Egypt (as it can't be used again to return back).**

All other travelers (Residents, GCC Citizens, or Visitors) must complete 7 days hotel quarantine with no exceptions; PCR test will be on day 1 and day 6. This applies to all quarantine sites. For fully vaccinated FIFA Arab Cup fans with Fan ID, they must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Book DQ hotel quarantine for 2 days. PCR test on arrival at the hotel. In case the game they are coming for is within the supposed 2-day quarantine period, they must undergo PCR test at the airport so they can be released within same day of arrival. Please arrange with representatives of MOPH (the clinic team) at the airport to promptly collect the test samples and send to laboratory for fast turn-around of the results. <p>Effective from 06th October 2021:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All passengers arriving to Qatar must install “EHTERAZ” application on their cell phones.

- Non-residents of Qatar must register via the pre-registration platform on www.ehteraz.gov.qa website and upload all relevant documents such as PCR test result, vaccine certificate and other relevant documents at least 3 days before arrival. Although pre-registration is optional for citizens and residents of Qatar, the Ministry of Public Health recommends that all individuals entering Qatar pre-register to ensure the best experience upon arrival in Qatar.
- Qatar has classified countries into two lists, **Green and Red**, in addition to a secondary list of **Exceptional Red Countries** based on international and local health risk indicators and the epidemiology of Covid-19 in the different countries.
- All passengers must sign an Undertaking and Acknowledgement Form before arriving in Qatar. The form is available on the Ministry of Public Health website, pre-registration platform website (www.ehteraz.gov.qa) and airline online booking form. Citizens and residents who are fully vaccinated inside the State of Qatar arriving from one of the Green List countries are exempt from this requirement.

Policies for those coming from Green list countries:

- **Group A: Citizens, GCC citizens and residents of Qatar:**
 - Passengers who are fully vaccinated by a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, The following categories will be exempt from quarantine:
 - Everyone aged 12 years and above.
 - Children aged 11 years and below accompanied by one or both of their parents/family members who are fully vaccinated.
 - After arrival:
 - Conduct a PCR test within 36 hours of arriving in Qatar as follows:
 - Citizens and residents: Go to one of the Primary Health Care Corporation health centers or a private clinic/hospital.
 - GCC citizens: Go to one of the private clinics/hospitals licensed by the Ministry of Public Health to conduct the PCR test.
 - Children under the age of (4) are excluded from this test procedure.
 - **Passengers who are not vaccinated or who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses:**
 - Passengers will undergo home quarantine for 7 days, as follows:
 - Everyone who has not completed the required vaccine doses.
 - GCC citizens (non-residents) coming to stay with first-degree relatives residing in Qatar (on the condition that they provide proof of the relationship and national address data).
- Before arrival:

- Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
 - After arrival:
 - A PCR test is required on the sixth day of quarantine and the individual will be released on the seventh day if the result of the COVID-19 test is negative.
 - Citizens and residents: Go to one of the Primary Health Care Corporation health centers or a private clinic/hospital.
 - GCC citizens: Go to one of the private clinics/hospitals
 - **Group B: Visitors to Qatar:**
 - Passengers who are fully vaccinated by a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, the following categories will be exempt from quarantine:
 - Passengers aged 12 years and above.
 - Children aged 11 years below and accompanied by one or both of their parents/family members who are fully vaccinated
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar.
 - Unvaccinated travelers or those who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses:
 - Passengers will undergo home quarantine for 7 days, as follows:
 - First-degree relatives including children under the age of 18 (pre-issued family visas).
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
 - After arrival: A PCR test is required on the sixth day of quarantine and the individual will be released on the seventh day if the result of the COVID-19 test is negative.
 - Unvaccinated travelers or those who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses:
 - Travelers will undergo hotel quarantine for 7 days, as follows:
 - All types of visas except Category B.
- Policies for those coming from RED list countries**
- Group A: Citizens, GCC citizens and residents of Qatar
 - Travelers who are fully vaccinated by a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, the following categories will be exempt from quarantine:
 - Passengers aged 12 years and above.
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
 - After arrival: Have a PCR test within 36 hours of arriving in Qatar in a Primary Health Care Corporation health center or a private clinic/hospital.

- Passengers who are not vaccinated or who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses, the following categories will be subject to home quarantine for 7 days as follows:
 - Passengers aged 12 years and above.
 - Children aged 11 years and below.
 - GCC citizens (non-residents) coming to stay with first-degree relatives residing in Qatar (on the condition that they provide proof of the relationship and national address data).
- Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
- After arrival:
 - A PCR test is required on the sixth day of quarantine and the individual will be released on the seventh day if the result of the COVID-19 test is negative.
 - Citizens and residents: Undergo the testing in a Primary Health Care Corporation health center or a private clinic/hospital.
 - GCC citizens (non-residents): Undergo the testing at a private clinic/hospital licensed by the Ministry of Public Health.
- Group B: Visitors to Qatar:
 - Travelers who are fully vaccinated by a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, the following categories will be subject to hotel quarantine for two days or until the test result appears:
 - Travelers aged 12 and above.
 - Children aged 11 years and below (non-vaccinated) accompanied by or both of their parents/family members who are fully vaccinated.
 - The following categories will be subject to home quarantine for two days or until the test result appears:
 - First-degree relatives, including children less than (18) years of age arriving to Qatar.
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar.
 - After arrival: A PCR test on arrival at the quarantine hotel.
 - Unvaccinated travelers or those who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses:
 - The following categories will be subject to **home** quarantine for 7 days:
 - First-degree relatives, including children under the age of 18 (pre-issued family visas).
 - The following categories will be subject to **hotel** quarantine for 7 days:
 - Holders of all types of visas except (pre-issued family visas).
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar.
 - After arrival: A PCR test is required on the sixth day of quarantine and the individual will be released on the seventh day if the result of the COVID-19 test is negative.

Policies for those coming from the Exceptional Red List countries (EGYPT is included):

- **Group A: Citizens, GCC citizens and residents of Qatar**
 - Passengers who are fully vaccinated by a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, the following categories will be subject to hotel quarantine for two days:
 - Travelers aged 12 years and above.
 - Children aged 11 years and accompanied by one or both of their parents/family members who are fully vaccinated.
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
 - After arrival: Conduct a PCR test within 36 hours of arriving in Qatar as follows:
 - Have a PCR test at the quarantine hotel.
 - Serology Antibody test at the quarantine hotel for vaccinated persons outside Qatar with one of the vaccines approved by the Ministry of Public Health.
 - Passengers who are not vaccinated or who have not completed the necessary vaccination doses (This category will be subject to hotel quarantine for 7 days).
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar
 - After arrival: A PCR test is required on the sixth day of quarantine and the individual will be released on the seventh day if the result of the COVID-19 test is negative.
- **Group B: Visitors to Qatar: (Visa holders (of all kinds): (Unvaccinated travelers - entry is not allowed)**
 - Fully vaccinated travelers, the following categories will be subject to hotel quarantine for two days:
 - Passengers aged 12 years and above who are fully vaccinated.
 - Children aged 11 years and below (non-vaccinated) accompanied by one or both of their parents/family members who are fully vaccinated.
 - Before arrival: Undergo a PCR test with a negative result 72 hours before arrival in Qatar.
 - After arrival:
 - Have a PCR test at the quarantine hotel.
 - Serology Antibody test at the quarantine hotel for vaccinated persons outside Qatar with one of the vaccines approved by the Ministry of Public Health
- **Ehteraz application policies:**
 - Passengers travelling to Qatar must download and activate the Ehteraz app on their mobile devices upon arrival at Qatar's entry ports.
 - Diplomats, administrative card holders and VIP visitors arriving on official state visits are excluded from this measure.

- The Health Status on the Eheterz app will remain yellow throughout the quarantine period, until the result of the COVID-19 test comes out negative in accordance with the above quarantine policy.
- The Health Status on the Eheterz mobile app for fully vaccinated persons in Qatar will remain green with a golden frame to indicate that they are excluded from quarantine if the result of the PCR test is negative and that they have completed 14 days from the date of the prescribed doses of the vaccine.
- The Health Status for citizens and residents who have received the vaccine outside Qatar will remain green without a golden frame until their vaccine data is updated in the system.
- The Health Status on the Eheterz app for visitors who have received the vaccine outside Qatar will remain green without a golden frame until their vaccine data is updated in the system.
- **Passengers returning from Umrah:**
 - Citizens and residents arriving from Umrah who are unable to obtain a valid PCR test from the departure country are allowed to board their flights provided they undergo a PCR test upon arrival at Hamad International Airport or Abu Samra border crossing for a specific fee for each test.
 - According to Saudi Arabia's rules, only people who receive vaccine doses licensed by the Ministry of Public Health can perform Umrah and visit Mecca.
 - People planning to travel to Umrah should review the policies and procedures announced by the Ministry of Endowments and Islamic Affairs

PCR:

- Passengers must take a PCR test result at a medical centre accredited by the health authorities in the country of departure. The test result must be negative and must be done 72 hours before arrival in Qatar.

Travelers who have recovered from COVID-19:

- For citizens and residents of Qatar who have recovered from COVID-19 infection, or those from any GCC country who have recovered from the virus who have subsequently received at least one dose of a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health, the immunity period for a person recovered from COVID-19 is 12 months starting from the 14th day of the date of recovery, or 14 days after receiving the vaccine dose in case of recovery.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passengers recovered from COVID-19 in any GCC country must provide an official certificate confirming the previous COVID-19 infection and vaccination status <p><u>Vaccine:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Approved Vaccines:</u> (Pfizer / BioNTech - Moderna (SpikeVax) - AstraZeneca (Covishield / Oxford / Vaxzevria) - Jansen / Johnson & Johnson) • <u>Conditionally Approved vaccines:</u> (Sinopharm vaccine – Sinovac - Sputnik V) • Serology Antibody test with a positive result is mandatory before travelling to Qatar for people with two doses of a conditionally approved vaccines and 14 days after the second dose, in which case only the passenger will be considered fully immune. • People who have received two doses of a conditionally approved vaccine followed by one dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine and after 14 days from the last dose will be considered fully immune. • Passengers who are fully immunized outside Qatar with a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Public Health of Qatar are required to submit the original vaccine certificate and other supporting documents written in Arabic or English proving that they have obtained the vaccine, as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The name of the traveler must be identical to that on the passport. • Dose dates by vaccine type (one dose for Jansen vaccine and two doses for other vaccines). • Type/name of vaccine. • The serial number of the vaccine batch (if any)
3	KSA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Effective 1st December 2021, Allowing</u> direct entry to the Kingdom from the following countries: (Indonesia, Pakistan, Brazil, Vietnam, <u>Egypt</u>, India), without the need to stay (14) days outside these countries before entering the Kingdom. • <u>Institutional quarantine</u> procedures must be applied for a <u>period of (5) days</u>, regardless of passengers' immunization status outside the Kingdom, with the continued application of exceptions issued regarding some groups in this regard. • <u>EgyptAir is allowed to transport passengers coming from non-restricted countries holding a valid work visa or a valid residency permit, and must assure that above travelers hold proof of confirmed booking at one of the institutional quarantine facilities approved by the Ministry of Municipal, Rural Affairs and Housing, by showing the (QR Code) of the booking before boarding the aircraft. EgyptAir staff are required to verify above passengers' registration on the "Arrivals platform, and they shall be exempted from the institutional quarantine, stated in GACA Circular No. (4/67201) dated 10/05/2021.</u>

- Non-Saudi spouses of Saudi Arabian citizens, their non-Saudi children, parents, and accompanying domestic workers traveling to the Kingdom from other countries are exempted from the requirement of mandatory Covid 19 (PCR) test before entering the Kingdom.
- **Suspension** of entry to the Kingdom for non-citizens who come directly or indirectly from: (**South Africa / Namibia / Botswana / Zimbabwe / Mozambique / Lesotho / Eswatini / Nigeria / Malawi / Zambia / Madagascar / Angola / Seychelles / Mauritius / Comoros**), except for those who have spent a period of no less than (14) fourteen days in another country from which they are allowed to come.
 - Home quarantine will be applied for a period of (5) days to Saudi citizens coming from the mentioned country, provided PCR examination on the first day and the fifth day regardless of Immunization status.
- **Effective 04th December 2021**, Direct entry from all countries is allowed for passengers who have received one dose of the vaccine inside the Kingdom, provided institutional quarantine procedures are applied on them for a period of (3) days.
- Suspension of entry to KSA coming from (UAE / Argentina) is removed and Saudi citizens are allowed to travel to these countries.
- All passengers coming to KSA must be informed about downloading (Tawakkalna App.) and registering within 8 hours of arrival.
- Resident permit holders, who have received two doses of Covid-19 Vaccine **inside the Kingdom** (which is registered on the Application SEHHATY, so it must be printed) before their departure from the Kingdom are allowed to enter, provided they comply with all other precautionary measures and health requirements in the Kingdom.
- Passengers holding E-GOV VISIT VISA for seasons events for participation in Riyadh international Book Fair are allowed to enter Riyadh.
- The following categories of **workers in the Educational sector, public and private**, are allowed to come directly to the Kingdom from the arrival-suspended countries, and shall comply with institutional quarantine including their (companions and families):
 - a. Faculty members and persons of equivalent status in universities, colleges, and institutes.
 - b. Teachers in public education.
 - c. General Training Authority in the General Institution for Technical and Occupational Training and Training Institutes.
 - d. Scholarship students.
- Individuals who have received one dose or have completed vaccine doses inside the Kingdom are exempted from institutional quarantine.

- All precautionary measures applied in the Kingdom must be complied with and violators will be subject to penalties.
- Failure to comply with circulars issued by GACA is an explicit violation of government orders, and legal procedures will be applied on the violators and they will be held responsible.
- Visit Visa for Families and Companions of Resident Educational Staff are accepted.
- **Instructions for Madinah:**
 - Direct entry to KSA from or through Egypt is allowed under condition of 05 days institutional quarantine regardless passengers' immunization status.
 - Effective from 4th of December 2021, all passengers who received one dose of vaccine inside KSA 03 days institutional quarantine is require.
 - PCR is a mandatory for all passengers.
- Passengers travelling from any point via Cairo holding **tourist visa** to KSA are allowed to travel without institutional quarantine under condition to be fully vaccinated ((Pfizer-Astrazınca-Moderna-Jhonson) and holding valid PCR.
 - Other vaccination or non-vaccinated must be institutionally quarantined for 5days in addition to valid PCR
- **Instructions for Jeddah:**
 - Direct entry to kingdom from / through Egypt is allowed under condition of 05 days institutional quarantine regardless Passengers immunization status outside kingdom.
 - For passengers who received one dose of vaccine inside kingdom 03days institutional quarantine required.
- Passengers travelling from any point via Cairo holding **tourist visa** to KSA are allowed to travel without institutional quarantine under condition to be fully vaccinated ((Pfizer-Astrazınca-Moderna-Jhonson) and holding valid PCR.
 - Other vaccination or non-vaccinated must be institutionally quarantined for 5days in addition to valid PCR
 - All types of visas are acceptable as per Jeddah airport immigration director
- **Instructions for Dammam:**
 - All visa types are allowed under the following conditions:
 - Passengers who have received two doses of Covid-19 Vaccine inside the Kingdom are exempted from institutional quarantine.

- Residents who have received two doses of Covid-19 Vaccine inside the Kingdom are allowed to accompany his wife and sons without institutional quarantine (even if they are not vaccinated)
- Passengers who have received one dose inside the Kingdom will be subjected to 3 days institutional quarantine.
- Passengers who haven't been vaccinated or have vaccinated outside the Kingdom will be subjected to 5 days institutional quarantine.
- (Medical / educational) staff as previously mentioned.
- **Tourist visas** are allowed to travel to Dammam under the following conditions:
 - Not obtaining any doses inside the Kingdom; requires a 5-day institutional quarantine.
 - Obtaining a single dose inside the Kingdom; requires an institutional quarantine for 3 days.
 - Obtaining two doses inside the Kingdom; does not require an institutional quarantine.
- **Instructions for Riyadh:**
 - All valid Residents and visas are accepted.
 - All non-vaccinated or vaccinated passengers (outside the Kingdom) will be subjected to 5 days institutional quarantine.
- Passengers travelling from any point via Cairo holding **tourism visa** to KSA are allowed to travel without institutional quarantine under condition to be fully vaccinated with (Pfizer-AstraZeneca-Modena-Johnson) "02" Dose should be completed "14" Day and holding valid PCR (Mandatory).
 - Passenger should complete all the Arrival Procedures (Update in Muqim Website before arrival and copy of Arrival Registration of KSA should be with Passenger
 - If Any Passengers with No Vaccine or with "01" Dose of Vaccine will NOT be accepted and will be deported on same flight.
- Effective from 4th of December 2021, all passengers who received one dose of vaccine inside KSA, 03 days institutional quarantine is require.
 - A resident who has received two doses inside the Kingdom, whether medical, educational, or diplomatic staff, (provided he obtains a proof a vaccination inside the Kingdom) as previously mentioned
 - Saudi citizens and their families are subjected to home quarantine.
 - Passengers Holding Tourism VISA to KKIA (RUH) Must Hold below:
 - "02" Dose of Vaccine (Approved by MOH-KSA) fully Vaccinated after "14" Days from "02" Dose Outside Kingdom.
 - Institutional Quarantine for "05" Days mandatory.
 - Return Ticket.

- PCR (Negative) “72” Hrs.
- **Instructions for Qassim:**
 - All types of visa accepted under condition of validity.
 - Passengers who received 02doses inside kingdom are allowed to enter with no Quarantine.
 - Passengers who received 01dose inside kingdom will be subject to 03days Quarantine.
 - Passengers unvaccinated any dose inside kingdom are subject to 05days Quarantine.
 - Regarding educational and medical public sections families, (official sector only) Parents first degree Fathers/ sons/ husbands/ wives are allowed with no quarantine which is applicable to previous instructions.
 - Regarding educational sector, It is not allowed for fathers and mothers to come without institutional quarantine 05 days (just husband and wives are allowed with no institutional quarantine, they will be subjected to home quarantine.
- Passengers travelling from any point via Cairo holding **tourism visa** to KSA are allowed to travel without institutional quarantine under condition to be fully vaccinated with (Pfizer-AstraZeneca-Modena-Johnson) “02” Dose should be completed “14” Day and holding valid PCR (Mandatory). Except for restricted countries.
 - Passenger should complete all the Arrival Procedures (Update in Muqim Website before arrival and copy of Arrival Registration of KSA should be with Passenger)
 - Other vaccination or non-vaccinated must have institutional quarantine 5days in addition to valid PCR.
 - Passengers must hold return ticket.
- **Effective 9th August 2021,**
- Allowing the transport of Saudi Citizen's on international flights to the **permitted countries** with the condition of receiving the full doses of the approved vaccines in the Kingdom, The following categories are excluded:
 - a. Children under the age of (12), who will be required to obtain a valid health insurance policy, approved by the Saudi Central Bank (SAMA), to cover the risks of the coronavirus (COVID_19).
 - b. Individuals who recovered from the coronavirus, provided that they have spent less than (6) months from being infected with the virus.
 - c. Recovered citizens from (COVID-19) and they have received one dose of the approved vaccines in the Kingdom.
- Egyptair must not board Saudi citizens traveling on direct or indirect flights to Indonesia without prior permission from the concerned authorities.

- As a result of temporary travel restriction for passengers coming from Egypt, It is not allowed to carry any passengers to Kuwait via Jeddah airport except (Saudi citizen / diplomats / health practitioners)

Effective from 3rd of February 2021;

- Temporarily suspending entry into the kingdom for passengers coming from (Indonesia, Pakistan, Brazil, Turkey, Lebanon, India) and it includes those coming from other countries if they have passed through any of aforementioned countries during (14) days preceding the request to enter to the kingdom. **This doesn't apply to Saudi citizen, diplomats, health practitioners and their families.**
- Saudi citizens, diplomats, health practitioners and their families coming from the aforementioned countries or who passed through them in any of those countries within (14) days prior to their return to the kingdom shall be quarantined in their homes for a period of (14) days in the kingdom.
- Allowing the entry of Saudi family members and their accompanying workers who have been in the suspended countries.
- Egyptair must NOT board Saudi citizens traveling (direct / indirect) flights to (Vietnam / Afghanistan) without prior permission from the concerned authorities.
- Suspending entry of non-citizens coming from (Ethiopia / Vietnam / Afghanistan) unless who stayed 14 days outside these countries.

Effective from 17th May 2021 (01:00AM):

- Saudi citizens are allowed to travel abroad and return to the Kingdom.
- Fully lifting of the suspension on all international flights.
- Fully opening of all kingdom airports.

(Above instructions doesn't apply to countries in which the concerned committee decides to suspend travel to or from due to COVID-19 outbreak)

- **All non-Saudi passengers are allowed to travel outside The Kingdom** (this doesn't include the countries where the new strain of Covid-19 has appeared)
- Egyptair is permitted to carry GCC citizens from KSA.
- Egyptair is permitted to carry non-Saudi passengers holding a valid visa (Exit / Entry / Residence "Iqamah" / Visit) from KSA.
- All non-Saudi nationals holding **TOURIST** visas are NOT allowed to enter KSA until the date of lifting the suspension of international flights completely.
- Non Saudi citizens travelling from UK are allowed to enter KSA if he / she spent not less than 14 days in any country outside these countries (PCR test is required after these 14 days). (Saudi nationals are exempted in some urgent cases)

- The above mentioned instructions shall not violate any conditions or approved requirements related to the restrictions or ban on travel for reasons that are not related to preventing the spread of COVID-19.
- All above doesn't apply to countries in which has been decided by the competent committee to take the necessary measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the Kingdom by suspending travel to / from those countries as a result of the outbreak of COVID-19 in it.
- **Passengers who need to travel from K.S.A before completing the approved quarantine period are permitted to leave according to the following conditions :**
- **Don't show symptoms of suspected infections of coronavirus**
- **To go directly from quarantine to the airport**
- **The presents of negative PCR test result for a sample taken after arrival in K.S.A with exemption for aircraft crewmember**
- Members of diplomatic missions accredited to K.S.A and their families are allowed to come to K.S.A during (COIVD-19) pandemic taking in to account conducting COVID-19 PCR test 72 hours before the date of departure to K.S.A.
- **Effective 17th May 2021;**
 - 1- Allow to transport all vaccinated Saudi citizens who received (2) doses of the Covid-19 vaccine, and who received (1) dose on condition that 14 days of their first vaccination has passed which matches the status on Tawakkalna App.
 - 2- Allow to transport recovered citizens from Covid-19 on condition that 6 months from their Covid-19 infection has not passed, which matches the status on Tawakkalna App.
 - 3- Allow to transport citizens who are younger than the age of 18, on condition that they provide an insurance policy approved by Saudi Central Bank, which covers the treatment of Covid-19 abroad.
- Non Vaccinated passengers are required to have a valid and authorized health insurance certificate. (this applied also on passengers travelling to KSA for Umrah, Visit and tourism)
- Effective 16th June 2021, Egyptair must ensure that non-citizen passengers and their companions have completed filling out their immunization data before arriving at the Kingdom through the online link: <https://muqem.sa/#/vaccine-registration/home>
- Egyptair Staff can verify the successful completion of the registration process for passengers by one of the following methods:
 - Presenting a successful registration message on the passenger's mobile phone.
 - Printed certificate with the registration number.
 - Verifying the registration using passport number through the website mentioned above.

- **Pets: Not to Transport animals consignments without registering at the website (Anaam) an import permission from the Ministry of Environment Water and Agriculture including those accompanying with passengers.**

PCR:

- All non-Saudi must submit a **negative result PCR test** from a **verified** laboratory aboard and it must be done no later than **72 hours before Scheduled departure to KSA (All Saudi Citizens are exempted from PCR test)**
- The approved laboratories **in KSA** is always updated via, <https://covid19.cdc.gov.sa/ar/approved-covid-19-laboratories-ar/>. Or <https://covid19.cdc.gov.sa/ar/approved-covid-19-laboratories-ar/private-laboratories-ar/>.
- **PCR is not required from children less than 8 years old.**
- All passengers over 8 years old arriving KSA even if they are vaccinated must hold valid PCR test 72 hours before arriving.
- Saudi citizens are exempted from PCR test.
- **Passenger from Age "08" Years till "18" Years Accepted with PCR but should be Accompany with Parents. And Parents should be Vaccinated "02" Dose in KSA. (Do Not Accept any Passengers "08" Years till "18" Years without PCR and Not Accompany with Parents).**

QUARANTINE:

- **All passengers arriving to KSA will be subject to institutional quarantine for 5days. From arrival to the kingdom (3 days for health practitioners with negative PCR by the end of the period) at home.**
- **Egyptair Staff are required to collect the quarantine fees as EMD from all passengers travelling to KSA.**
- **The following categories are exempted from the institutional quarantine:**
 - 1- (Male /Female) citizens, their wives and husbands, sons and daughters of the female citizen, house workers (unvaccinated above categories will be subjected to 5 days self-quarantine and a PCR test will be done in the sixth day of their quarantine)

* Jordanian Military Officers, who are still in their Military Service, must apply for the QR-Code via WWW.VISITJORDAN.GOVE.JO Portal prior to Departure and receive their QR-Code without any payment online. In this case payment of PCR-Test on Arrival will be paid by Jordanian Military.

- Passenger should apply to get the approval from uaeentry.ica.gov.ae
- Vaccination certificate should be upload in uaeentry.ica.gov.ae for the Passengers with valid residence visas, who got all the vaccination doses in UAE and completed 14 days after the second dose.

- **Procedures applied for the transit passengers :**
- Confirm that the final destination is accepting the passenger.
- PCR results will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code and taken within 72 hours prior arrival.
- Follow the precautionary and preventive measures.
- Airlines are responsible to check all the above requirements and approvals before the boarding, and it will bear the consequences in case of carrying passenger doesn't meet the requirements.
- **Effective 26th November 2021 (00:01), all national and foreign carriers must apply rapid PCR test on all arrivals, direct transit flights coming from the Republic of Sudan to United Arab Emirates.(Passengers to perform Rapid PCR test showing negative results done inside the airport before the departure of flight)**

1-Abu Dhabi

- **Due to the appearance of (09) positive cases of Corona virus infection on passengers arrived from Cameron and Ghana on MS916 dated 24 DEC ,2021, So Egyptair operation from Cairo to Abu Dhabi will be suspended from the date of December 29th at 00:01 L.T until December 30st at 2359 L.T**
- All type of visas (tourist , Residents, and visit) issued by other Emirates are allowed to enter Abu Dhabi airport by adhering to the following protocols:
- Regarding the return of residents to the country:
 - No more required for register in ICA Smart Travel - Advance Travel Registration –.
 - As of 20 September 2021, residents must only requested to provide one of the vaccinations certificate approved by World Health Organization, by entering the Federal Authority for Identity and Citizenship link <https://smex-ctp.trendmicro.com:443/wis/clicktime/v1/query?url=https%3a%2f%2fsmartservices.ica.gov.ae&umid=8f0dbf5a-da50-46e5-abb2-598994aff4ca&auth=3369c21a3776f2f25fe87f37174343440915b5dc-d13d618b1464bb79e9c6b6a04533b70cad06e167> under register Arrivals (to get the QR code issued by the website) before arrival to AUH airport.

A- All arrival passengers coming from green countries and fully vaccinated with one of the WHO-approved COVID-19 vaccines :

- Passenger should get ICA approval then register in ICA smart registration website (UAE national are exempted).
- Provide vaccination certificate when departing from the origin destination.
- PCR results will only be accepted from the authorized **labs that generate a QR code**
- PCR negative results taken within 48 hours before departure.
- PCR test upon arrival.
- **Vaccinated** re-take PCR on day 6 and Unvaccinated re-take PCR on day 6 and 9
- Please note that the 'Green List' applies to countries/regions/territories of origin not citizenship.
- **The green countries are** (Albania / Armenia / Australia / Austria / Azerbaijan / Bahrain / Belarus / Belgium / Belize / Bhutan / Bolivia / Bosnia and Herzegovina / Brazil / Brunei / Bulgaria / Burma / Burundi / Canada / Chile / China / Colombia / Comoros / Croatia / Cyprus / Czech Republic / Denmark / Ecuador / Estonia / Finland / France / Georgia / Germany / Greece / Holland / Hong Kong (SAR) / Hungary / Iceland / Indonesia / Israel / Italy / Japan / Jordan / Kazakhstan / Kuwait / Kyrgyzstan / Liechtenstein / Luxembourg / Maldives / Malta / Mauritius / Moldova / Monaco / Montenegro / Morocco / New Zealand / Norway / Oman / Poland / Portugal / Qatar / Republic of Ireland / Russia / San Marino / Saudi Arabia / Serbia / Seychelles / Singapore / Slovakia / Slovenia / South Korea / Spain / Sweden / Switzerland / Taiwan Province of China / Tajikistan / Thailand / Turkmenistan / Ukraine / UK / USA / Uzbekistan)
 - **All** passengers arriving from these countries will be exempted from mandatory quarantine periods.
 - **Fully-vaccinated** passengers from the aforementioned 'Green List' arriving at Abu Dhabi International Airport will need to present a negative PCR test result. This negative PCR test result should be valid up to a maximum of 48 hours from the certificate issue date before departure. Inbound passengers will also need to take a PCR test on arrival at Abu Dhabi International Airport, followed by a PCR test on Day six.
 - **Unvaccinated** passengers from 'Green List' countries will also be required to present a negative PCR test result (valid up to a maximum of 48 hours from the certificate issue date before departure) and take a PCR test on arrival at Abu Dhabi International Airport, followed by a PCR test on Day six and nine.
 - **Fully-vaccinated** passengers from a non-Green List destination will be required to present a negative PCR test result, valid up to a maximum 48 hours from the certificate issue date before

departure, and take a PCR test on arrival at Abu Dhabi International Airport. They will need to take a PCR test on Day four and eight.

- **Unvaccinated** passengers coming from non-green list countries will be required to present a negative PCR test result, valid up to a maximum 48 hours from the certificate issue date, before departure and take a PCR test on arrival at Abu Dhabi International Airport. They will need to quarantine for 10 days from the date of arrival, followed by a PCR test on Day nine.

B- All arrival passengers Coming from other countries (Not in the green list) :

- Passenger should get ICA approval then register in ICA smart registration website (UAE national are exempted).
- Provide vaccination certificate when departing from the origin destination.
- PCR negative results taken within 48 hours before departure.
- PCR results will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code.
- PCR test upon arrival.
- Vaccinated re-take PCR on day 4 and day 8 depending in duration of passengers stay, Unvaccinated should wear medical wristband and re-take PCR on day 9 .
- Unvaccinated passengers who wants to continue his journey to other emirates must take airport taxi only or approved buses.

C- All passengers coming from the below countries: (India, Pakistan, Nigeria, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Uganda, Vietnam , Zambia , Congo, Bangladesh , Liberia , Sierra Leone, Afghanistan). must do:

- Rapid PCR test in airport before departure from origin.
- Passenger should get ICA approval then register in ICA smart registration website (UAE national are exempted).
- Provide vaccination certificate when departing from the origin destination.
- PCR negative results taken within 48 hours before departure.
- PCR results will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code.
- PCR test upon arrival
- Vaccinated re-take PCR on day 4 and day 8 depending in duration of passengers.
- Non vaccinated passengers are subject to institutional quarantine or home quarantine.
- Arrivals who are less than 16 years old, are exempted from the above criteria.
- Adhere to all precautionary and preventive measures in our previous circulars on non-vaccinated passengers and passengers exempt from vaccination.

- **Effective 29th November 2021, till further notice**, Passengers arriving from (Botswana / Eswatini / Lesotho / Mozambique / Namibia / South Africa / Zimbabwe) will not be accepted for travel into AUH.
 - Passengers who stayed for the past 14 days in the above countries are not allowed to travel into AUH.
 - The following cases are excluded from restriction (Official Delegations / UAE Nationals / Diplomatic missions between UAE and these countries/ Golden Visas holders).
 - Official Delegation will require negative PCR test result 48 hours before traveling and (Rapid-PCR Test) 6 hours in the Airport. They will require another PCR test once they arrive and quarantine until they receive the result.
 - UAE Nationals, Diplomatic Missions between UAE and these countries and Golden Visas Holders will also require negative PCR test result 48 hours before traveling and (Rapid-PCR Test) 6 hours in the Airport. They will require another PCR test once they arrive with 10 days quarantine and another PCR on day 9 from arrival.
 - Departure flights are allowed to above mentioned countries except UAE nationals only in the following cases (Official Delegations of UAE / Emergency medical cases / Study missions).

PCR:

- **PCR (with QR code) test is required from approved labs valid only for 48 hours before traveling to AUH. Approved laboratories:(The Approved Laboratories in Egypt is :(all Almokhtabar laboratories) and (Central Public Health Laboratories)**
- **List of approved labs listed on the website (screening.purehealth.ae).**
- Children below 12 years old **are exempted** from the initial PCR test in their Origin countries
- People of determination (medium and high) **are exempted** from the initial PCR test in their Origin countries.

2- Dubai:

Effective from Monday 29th November 2021

suspension of Inbound & Transit Passengers to Dubai from Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe

- **This decision is applicable to the following:**
 - a. All passengers arriving to UAE from the aforementioned countries.
 - b. All transit passenger through UAE Airports from the aforementioned countries.
 - c. All arriving and/or transiting passengers from other countries who have been in the aforementioned countries within fourteen (14) days prior to their entry into the UAE.
- **This does not apply to the following:**
 - a. Employees of Official Missions between UAE and the aforesaid countries.

- b. UAE nationals.
- c. Members of the Diplomatic missions between UAE and the aforesaid countries;
- d. Holders of a UAE Golden Visa.
- e. Passengers who stayed more than 14 days outside the above mentioned 7 countries.

- **All passengers who are exempted shall ensure that the following preventive measures will be complied by them:**

- **Official delegations:**

- a. Hold a VALID Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, 48 hours from the time of collecting the sample. Issued from approved health service providers which use QR code; and a Rapid-PCR Test – mandatory if facility is available – inside the airport, six (6) hours prior to departure.

- b. Undergo a PCR test upon arrival in Dubai and Self-Quarantine until the negative test result is out.

- **UAE Nationals, Members of the Diplomatic missions from Dubai and the aforesaid countries and Holders of a UAE Golden Visa:**

- a. Hold a VALID Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, 48 hours from the time of collecting the sample. Issued from approved health service providers which use QR code; and a Rapid-PCR Test – mandatory if facility is available inside the airport, six (6) hours prior to departure.

- b. Undergo a PCR test upon arrival in Dubai and self-quarantine until the negative test result is out.

- **The outbound passenger flights from Dubai to the above-mentioned countries are permitted, except for UAE nationals who are banned from traveling to the said countered with exception listed below:**

- c. UAE Officials

- d. UAE Nationals exempted and/or granted permission to travel by the appropriate authorities for emergency purposes.

- e. Educational/study missions of UAE Nationals who require to travel to the above-mentioned countries.

With immediate effect,

- **Cancelling the GDRFA Approval for Residents** issued in Dubai for all passengers coming from all Countries (**including Egypt** – no need for GDRFA return permit anymore) **except** for Passengers coming from following 16 countries: (Bangladesh / Congo / Ethiopia / India / Liberia / Namibia / Nepal / Nigeria / Pakistan / Sierra Leone / Sri Lanka / South Africa / Uganda / Vietnam / Zambia / Indonesia).

- **Resident Passengers** coming from above mentioned countries must be **vaccinated** with 2 COVID-19 doses in UAE and upload this UAE Vaccination Card to the site of the GDRFA to obtain the Approval, OR; alternatively, if they are vaccinated in their Countries, they are still can be able to apply but to pass 14 days or more after 2nd dose. This Requirement is just a Guidance to Airlines Staff but Staff need not to check the Vaccination Cards of those Passengers but only to advise passengers if they are suffering getting the GDRFA

approval, as if passenger is not vaccinated or didn't upload the Vaccination card to the GDRFA application, he will not be granted the approval. As a conclusion, Airline Staff to check only the GDRFA approval with Resident passengers coming from those countries.

- This is didn't cancel the requirement of 48 PCR test and the Rapid 6 hours Test which are still required from all passengers (residents and tourists) coming from above mentioned countries. IT IS STILL REQUIRED
- UAE Residents and Visitors arriving from the (Afghanistan / Bangladesh / Congo / India / Liberia / Namibia / Nepal / Nigeria / Pakistan / Sierra Leone / Sri Lanka / South Africa / Uganda / Vietnam / Zambia) are subject to the following Procedures:
 - **Fully Vaccinated** with one of the WHO approved COVID-19 Vaccines if they are above 16 Y old.
 - Holding a pre-approval from the Federal Authority for identity and Citizenship (ICA) or GDRFA and register in ICA Smart registration website or application.
 - Provide Vaccine Certificate when departing from the origin station.
 - Present a Valid Negative Covid-19 Test Certificate which will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code and taken within 48 hours prior to departure
 - Rapid PCR test at the departure airport showing a negative result, 06 hours prior to departure of flight. Rapid PCR Test should be based on Molecular Diagnostic Test done inside the airport of departure prior to boarding.
 - PCR Test upon Arrival.
- Regarding the New Instructions of accepting Passengers from the above 16 Restricted Areas, kindly ensure the following:
 - A- Ensure UAE Resident passengers to hold the UAE ICA or GDRFA Approvals (with the exception those departing from Ethiopia as exempted from this requirement)
 - B- Presenting a 48 hour Valid PCR Negative Test Report with QR Code
 - C- Presenting a Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure, provided with QR code system
- Regarding Point Number (C), Its imperative that Station Managers to ensure that the Rapid test is done **in Airport, not outside the airport**, and if it's done in any Lab not located in Airport, then they should not accept passengers, as well as to ensure that the methodology used for Rapid Test is based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA which is to be written on the report.
- And as guided in Clarification sent on September 08th, 2021, If a passenger is departing from a restricted country via a non-restricted country (Cairo in our Case) then: -

- The transit point (Cairo) must perform a Rapid PCR test in Airport within 6 hours to departure of flight inbound to Dubai, if the passenger does not have a valid Rapid PCR test report from the origin airport; **OR**
- The passenger shall complete a stay for 14 days in the non-restricted country (Egypt).
- For those who are exceeding 180 days outside of UAE, the following 3 categories can return at any time, in condition that Resident is still valid, additional categories are:
 - Investor (as indicated on Resident Permit Sticker as Job)
 - Partner in a Company (as indicated on Resident Permit Sticker as Job)
 - Holders of Golden Resident Permits (verified as validity of 10 Years Resident)
 - Above mentioned can be exempted of the condition of who are exceeding 180 days outside of UAE and no need to present any letters from their companies to return to Dubai.
 - N.B. This is only applicable to those who are travelling Dubai ONLY regardless of the issuance emirate of the Resident Sticker.
- **With IMMEDIATE effect and ONLY Until 21st of November, 2021**, The Inbound passengers, who are eligible to travel to Dubai from the (France / Germany / Spain / Switzerland), shall comply with the following:
 - Passenger shall hold any type of PCR test certificate OR present a vaccination certificate, of which the vaccine was obtained either from the aforesaid countries or the United Arab Emirates, has been administered when departing from the aforesaid countries.
 - The vaccination certificate(s) shall reflect the completion of doses of vaccine, of type that is approved by the WHO, which are accepted by the aforementioned countries and the United Arab Emirates (UAE).
 - The inbound passengers required to complete the recommended doses of the vaccines.

Effective 30th August, 2021:

- All passengers (Including visit visa holders and tourists) inbounded from Restricted areas as listed can be accepted to travel to Dubai normally but with some conditions as listed hereunder in following email.
- Most important to highlight is Egyptair main network points where we had a ban to carry passengers from amongst other 14 points as listed are: Nigeria, South Africa and Uganda, **now can travel normally but with following 3 Conditions:**
 1. Residents ONLY to have Re-entry Permit from ICA or GDRFA according to the Emirate issuing the visa), (Likewise all passengers from other countries) and which is not required for Tourists and Visitors.
 2. All Types of passengers including tourists and Residents to have Negative PCR Report with QR Code, 48 Hours Validity before departure (from sampling time/date)

3. All Types of passengers including tourists and Residents to have Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure, provided with QR code

1. UAE residents, GCC citizens & tourists arriving to DXB/DWC

All UAE residents, GCC citizens, and visitors traveling to Dubai will need to do a pre-travel (before departure) PCR test, irrespective of the country they are coming from.

All Negative COVID19 Certificates must be printed in English or Arabic languages only (No Handwritten Reports). PCR test validity for all other destinations that are not mentioned in the below lists is no more than 72 hours before departure of flight inbound to DXB/DWC. Children under 12 and passengers with moderate to severe disabilities are exempt from PCR.

2. UAE Nationals from all countries arriving to DXB/DWC

All UAE Nationals are **Not** required to conduct PCR test before arriving at DXB/DWC, PCR Test on arrival **only**.

An exemption is also extended to the below categories of passengers from the requirement of mandatory PCR test or GDRFA pre-approval prior traveling to Dubai, from all destinations.

- The inbound passengers escorting a 1st degree UAE nationals' relative.
- Domestic workers escorting a UAE national sponsor during travel.

Given that they are traveling on the same flight with the relative or sponsor.

3. If travelling from one of the countries mentioned below all arriving passengers require a negative **PCR test validity no more than 72 hours** before departure of flight inbound to DXB/DWC, and a **second PCR test** will also be conducted upon arrival in Dubai: (test result must have a QR code for passengers arriving from Egypt, Lebanon or Sudan.)

Middle East and Africa:

Angola, Guinea, Kenya, Somaliland, Tunisia, Djibouti, Iran, Lebanon, Bahrain, Qatar, Egypt, Iraq, Morocco, South Sudan, Eretria, Israel, Sudan, Zimbabwe, Kuwait, Ivory Coast, Rwanda, Syria, Somalia, Ghana, Jordan, Senegal, Tanzania,.

Europe:

Bosnia & Herzegovina, Georgia, Greece, Russia, Croatia, Hungary, Montenegro, Slovakia, Cyprus, Malta, Poland, Ukraine.

Asia:

Azerbaijan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Cambodia, Turkey, Turkmenistan, Kyrgyzstan, Philippines, Indonesia, Myanmar, Thailand.

South America:

Argentina, Brazil, Chile.

4. Holders of type of visa and/or entry permission granted by the appropriate authority in the United Arab Emirates (i.e. employment visa, short stay/long stay visa, visit visa, residence visa newly issued...etc.,) are permitted to travel to Dubai, from the following countries (**Bangladesh / Congo / India / Liberia / Namibia / Nepal / Nigeria / Pakistan / Sierra Leone / Sri Lanka / South Africa / Uganda / Vietnam / Zambia / Afghanistan / Ethiopia**)

- Present the approval granted by the Federal Authority for Identity and Citizenship (ICA) Communicated through a QR code, based on the registration of arriving passenger(s) (Register Arrivals) through website: <https://smartservices.ica.gov.ae>
- GDRFA approval for the holders of visa issued from Dubai, remains as a prerequisite to enter the emirate of Dubai https://smart.gdrfad.gov.ae/Smart_OTCServicesPortal/ReturnPermitService.aspx
- Airlines shall ensure that the passenger(s) comply with the following :
- Hold a QR approval granted by the Federal Authority for Identity and Citizenship approval (ICA) OR an approval granted by GDRFA to enter the United Arab Emirates (UAE); For the holders of residence visa only
- Present a VALID Negative Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample and from an approved health service, which use QR code System; and
- Present a Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure, provided with QR code system
- a second PCR test will also be conducted upon arrival in Dubai: ((**Bangladesh / Nepal / Sri Lanka / Ethiopia / Nigeria / Uganda / Pakistan / India / Vietnam / Afghanistan / South Africa / Zambia / Congo / Liberia / Namibia / Sierra Leone**)
- Airlines who wish to operate to Dubai from points in the restricted countries listed above, shall submit their request for review and approval to Dubai Civil Aviation Authority via email: air.transport@dcaa.gov.ae (48 hours) prior their operation, provided with the following:

- Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) of the airline for the intended operation.
- Full description of the machine to be used for Rapid PCR test report, that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure.
- *NOTE: DCAA approval granted earlier to airlines to operate from point(s) in the above listed countries, will remain valid.

5. Transit passengers from all countries arriving at DXB/DWC

All transiting passengers **excluding the below listed** are not required to present a COVID 19 PCR test certificate unless it is mandated by their final destination

Transiting from restricted countries: (Bangladesh / Congo / India / Liberia / Namibia / Nepal / Nigeria / Pakistan / Sierra Leone / Sri Lanka / South Africa / Uganda / Vietnam / Zambia / Ethiopia)

All passengers who are traveling from the above listed countries and transiting through UAE, shall ensure that the following preventive measures are complied by them:

- a) Obtain necessary entry permission/approval from Country of the final destination;
- b) Hold a VALID Negative Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (72) hours from the time of collecting the sample. Issued from approved health service, which use QR code System;
- c) The airlines shall ensure and/or verify the authenticity of the above requirement(s) prior to the passenger(s) boarding the aircraft and shall not accept any passenger(s) who does not fulfill the aforesaid condition(s) and/or requirements;

If the airline carries any passenger(s) who fails to meet the aforesaid requirements, the airline will be held responsible to return such passenger to the point of embarkation and also any other matters that may arise therefrom.

- Indian National passenger(s), can obtain a visa on arrival (VOA) to enter Dubai effective immediately, provided that they comply with the following:
 - a. The passenger must have a visitor visa or a green card issued by the United States; or
 - b. The passenger is holding a Residence Permit issued by the United Kingdom or European Union.
- c. The holders of a valid visa issued by the United States, United Kingdom or European Union with a minimum validity period of six (6) months;

- If any passenger intends to obtain an entry visa to Dubai as mentioned above, airlines shall verify the eligibility of such passenger, prior to boarding the passenger for Dubai.
- If any airline carries a passenger(s) who fails to comply with the mentioned requirements, the airline will be held responsible to return such passenger to the point of embarkation and also to any other matter that may arise therefrom.
- It has observed that passengers from the restricted countries that require 48 hour PCR and RT PCR within 6 hours before departure have been arriving to Dubai via non restricted countries trying to bypass the requirements. **Kindly be advised of the following rules with regards to RT PCR:**
 1. If a passenger is departing from a restricted country via a restricted country then:-
 - i. The transit point must perform a Rapid PCR test within 6 hours to departure of flight inbound to Dubai, if the passenger has exited the transit airport.
 - ii. If the passenger does not have a valid Rapid PCR test report from the origin restricted country, the transit restricted country must perform a Rapid PCR test within 6 hours to departure of flight inbound to Dubai.
 2. If a passenger is departing from a restricted country via a non-restricted country then:-
 - i. The transit point must perform a Rapid PCR test within 6 hours to departure of flight inbound to Dubai, if the passenger does not have a valid Rapid PCR test report from the origin airport; or
 - ii. The passenger shall complete a stay for 14 days in the non-restricted country.
 3. If a passenger is departing from a non-restricted country via a restricted country then:-
 - i. The transit point must perform a Rapid PCR test within 6 hours to departure of flight inbound to Dubai, if the passenger has exited the transit airport.
- **Effective 15th December 2021(23:59 Dubai time),** Passenger travelling from (**Burundi / Cameroon / Chad / Kenya / Nigeria / Rwanda / Tanzania/ Uganda / Zambia**) to Dubai should comply with the following:
 - A- Destination Dubai:**
 - 1- Present a VALID Negative Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample and from an approved health service, which use QR code System
 - 2- For Direct Passenger(s)-Present a Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure, provided with QR code system.

3- For Transit Passenger(s) - Present a Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted six (6) hours prior to the last point of departure, (which is Cairo in our case) provided with QR code system.

4- Undergo a PCR test upon arrival in Dubai and Self-Quarantine until the negative test result is out.

B- Transit through Dubai:

1- Present a VALID Negative Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample and from an approved health service, which use QR code System;

2- Present a Rapid PCR test report that should be based on molecular diagnostic testing intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA; conducted six (6) hours prior to the last point of departure, provided with QR code system.

- Egyptair is ok to transport Transit passengers via Cairo from Restricted Airports mentioned above, as we are not operating direct flights to such destination from/to DXB, ensuring compliance to all DCAA Requirements before acceptance from origin Station and during transit time in Cairo.
 - Authority grants its approval for Egypt Air to commence its operations from Cairo airport, after conducting rapid PCR test inside the airport, using the machine; Abbott ID NOW.
 - EgyptAir will issue EMD (with the amount of USD70) to all passengers traveling to Dubai via Cairo in return of conducting ID NOW COVID-19 test at Cairo Airport

- **Effective from 15th December 2021 (23:59 hrs LT) and will be effective until further notice:** inbound and transit passenger(s) operation from any point(s) located in the Republic of the Congo (**Congo-Brazzaville**), to the airports in the Emirate of Dubai are suspended,

1. This decision is applicable to the following:

- A- All passengers arriving to Dubai from the Republic of the Congo.
- B- All transit passenger through Dubai Airports from the Republic of the Congo.
- C- All arriving and/or transiting passengers from other countries who have been in the Republic of the Congo within fourteen (14) days prior to their entry into the Emirate of Dubai.

2. This decision does not apply to the following:

- A- Employees of Official Missions between UAE and the Republic of the Congo.
- B- UAE nationals.
- C- Members of the Diplomatic missions between UAE and the Republic of the Congo.
- D- Holders of a UAE Golden Visa.

3. All passengers who are exempted as provided in (point 2) above to enter the Emirate of Dubai, shall ensure that the following preventing measures will be complied by them:-
 - Official delegations:
 - a. Hold a VALID Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample. Issued from approved health service providers which use QR code; and a Rapid-PCR Test, inside the airport, six (6) hours prior to departure.
 - b. Undergo a PCR test upon arrival and Self-Quarantine until the negative test result is out.
 - UAE Nationals, Members of the Diplomatic missions from Dubai and the Holders of a UAE Golden Visa:
 - a. hold a VALID Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample. Issued from approved health service providers which use QR code; and a Rapid- PCR Test inside the airport, six (6) hours prior to departure.
 - b. Undergo a PCR test upon arrival in Dubai and self-quarantine until the negative test result is out.
4. The outbound passenger flights from Dubai to the Republic of the Congo are permitted, except for UAE nationals who are banned from traveling to the Republic of the Congo, with exception listed below:
 - a. UAE Officials
 - b. UAE Nationals exempted and/or granted permission to travel by the appropriate authorities for emergency purposes.
 - c. Educational/study missions of UAE Nationals who require to travel to the above-mentioned countries.
- Inbound passengers from **Sudan** or any Person who has travelled Sudan within the last 14 days to DUBAI, to comply with following:
 - 48 hours Negative PCR test Report calculated from Sample Collection, and with a QR Code.
 - Rapid PCR according to methodology detailed in the protocol that was taken ONLY in Airport of Departure in 6 hours as a maximum before departure. (Rapid Tests take in city is not allowed, shall be in Airport immediately before acceptance) with a QR Code.
 - **Effective from 25th December 2021 commencing at 17:30 hrs. LT. and until further notice.**
 - The following instructions will be applied for Passengers arriving from (**Ghana and Uganda**):
 - EgyptAir staff shall ensure that the passenger(s) comply with the following :

- Present a VALID Negative Covid-19 Test certificate that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, (48) hours from the time of collecting the sample and from an approved health service, which use QR code System; and
- For Direct Passenger(s) - Present a Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test report, (either real time or rapid) that should be testing based on molecular diagnostic intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA, conducted at the departure airport prior to six (6) hours of departure, provided with QR code system.
- For Transit Passenger(s) - Present a Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test report, (either real time or rapid) that should be testing based on molecular diagnostic intended for the qualitative detection of nucleic acid for SARS-COV-2 viral RNA, conducted six (6) hours prior to the last point of departure, provided with QR code system.
- Undergo a PCR test upon arrival in Dubai and Self-Quarantine until the negative test result is released to the passenger.
- This above update related to Inbound/transit Passengers from the aforesaid countries to the Emirate of Dubai, does not apply to the following:
 - Employees of Official Missions between UAE and the aforesaid countries.
 - UAE nationals.
 - Members of the Diplomatic missions between UAE and the aforesaid countries;
 - Holders of a UAE Golden Visa.

3- Sharjah:

Effective 30th August 2021,

- Passengers holding UAE Resident and Tourist Visas are allowed to travel to Sharjah, However Passengers coming from below mentioned Countries are subject to the following procedures as mentioned hereunder: (Bangladesh / Congo / India / Liberia / Namibia / Nepal / Nigeria / Pakistan /Sierra Leone / Sri Lanka / South Africa)

- Procedures to be followed for Passenger travelling from the above mentioned Countries:
 - 1- Fully Vaccinated with one of the WHO approved COVID-19 Vaccines
 - 2- Holding a pre-approval from the Federal Authority for identity and Citizenship (ICA) or GDRFA
 - 3- Provide Vaccination Certificate when departing from the origin destination.
 - 4- Present a Valid Negative Covid-19 Test Certificate which will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code and taken within 48 hours prior to departure
 - 5- Rapid PCR test at the departure airport showing a negative result, 06 hours prior to departure of flight. Rapid PCR Test should be based on Molecular Diagnostic Test done inside the airport of departure prior to boarding.
 - 6- PCR Test Upon Arrival.
- UAE Residents returning to Sharjah no longer need entry Permits issued by **(ICA)**. However, the Federal Authority for Identity and Citizenship of UAE has recommended those wishing to travel upload their data-ID number, passport, and nationality - on the <https://uaeentry.ica.gov.ae> link to verify the authenticity of their travel documents .
- **Till 31/03/2021**, Passengers who are out of UAE for more than 06 months (180 days) can return to Sharjah UAE provided that their Resident Visa is still valid.
- Passengers whose residence visa is expired can return to Sharjah UAE, provided that API has approved issuance of boarding pass for travelling to Sharjah.
- **Effective 29th November 2021, till further notice**, Passengers arriving from (Botswana / Eswatini / Lesotho / Mozambique / Namibia / South Africa / Zimbabwe) will not be accepted for travel into Sharjah.
 - Passengers who stayed for the past 14 days in the above countries are not allowed to travel into Sharjah.
 - The following cases are excluded from restriction (Official Delegations / UAE Nationals / Diplomatic missions between UAE and these countries/ Golden Visas holders).
 - Official Delegation will require negative PCR test result 48 hours before traveling and (Rapid-PCR Test) 6 hours in the Airport. They will require another PCR test once they arrive and quarantine until they receive the result.
 - UAE Nationals, Diplomatic Missions between UAE and these countries and Golden Visas Holders will also require negative PCR test result 48 hours before traveling and (Rapid-PCR Test) 6 hours in the Airport. They will require another PCR test once they arrive with 10 days quarantine and another PCR on day 9 from arrival.
 - Departure flights are allowed to above mentioned countries expect UAE nationals only in the following cases (Official Delegations of UAE / Emergency medical cases / Study missions).
- **Effective 17th December 2021 (0800 Am Local Time):**

A- Restriction of Passengers coming to UAE from (Republic of Congo / Botswana / Eswatini / Lesotho / Mozambique / Namibia / South Africa / Zimbabwe)

- All Passengers coming from Republic of Congo are Not Allowed to enter or transit U.A.E. this includes those who stayed within 14 days in this Country before travelling to UAE.
- The following Categories are excluded from the above restrictions.
 - A) Official Delegations.
 - B) UAE Nationals, their first-degree relatives, and helpers (house maids) on their sponsorship
 - C) Diplomatic missions between UAE and the Republic of Congo
 - D) Golden Visas holders.
- The following precautionary and preventive measures to be applied on the above-mentioned categories
 - Negative PCR test result 48 hours before traveling
 - Rapid PCR test at the departure airport (whenever possible, If it is available at the airport it is mandatory) showing a negative result, done within 06 hours prior to departure of flight .
 - PCR test upon arrival in Sharjah and Self - Quarantine until the negative test result is out.
- Departure flights and outgoing passengers are allowed to travel to the Republic of Congo except UAE Nationals. UAE Nationals are only allowed to travel to Republic of Congo in the below cases:
 - A. Official Delegations of UAE.
 - B. Emergency medical cases of UAE National
 - C. Study missions of UAE National in this Country

B- Preventative Measures on Passengers coming from the Following Countries

- Passengers Travelling from (Nigeria / Kenya / Rwanda / Ethiopia) are subjected to the following precautionary Procedures:
 - Present a Valid Negative Covid-19 Test Certificate which will only be accepted from the authorized labs that generate a QR code and taken within 48 hours prior to departure of flight
 - For Direct Passengers - Rapid PCR test at the departure airport showing a negative result, 06 hours prior to departure of flight. Rapid PCR Test should be based on Molecular Diagnostic Test done inside the airport of departure prior to boarding.
 - For Transit Passengers - Rapid PCR test at the departure airport showing a negative result, 06 hours prior to the last point of departure. Rapid PCR Test should be based on Molecular Diagnostic Test done inside the airport of departure prior to boarding.
 - PCR Test upon Arrival and self-quarantine till the result is out.

PCR:

- All the **UAE Citizens** who arrive from Cairo Airport to Sharjah Airport are Exempted from the Test of PCR (COVID-19) in EGYPT, and going to make it in Sharjah Airport upon arrival only
- **Effective from 18th April 2021**, Passengers arriving to Sharjah are required to present Negative PCR Test Report from Certified lab in Egypt “which is available on screening.purehealth.ae website (Link <https://screening.purehealth.ae/application>) “**maximum 72 hours** prior to departure time and they are required to (**Printed as a Hard Copy**)
- Passengers below **12 Years old and UAE citizens** are exempted from PCR test.
- **Effective 1st May, 2021**, Passengers arriving from (India / Pakistan / Bangladesh / Ethiopia / **Egypt** / Sudan / Lebanon) are required to have a PCR Test Certificate that **contains a QR Code**.
- **Transit/ transfer** passengers coming from the following countries on board Egyptair flights to Sharjah will be requested to hold a negative result of covid-19 test (PCR test) maximum 96 hours (4 days) prior to departure time(**Printed as a Hard Copy**):(Belarus, Rwanda, India, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Azerbaijan, Eretria, Ethiopia, Iran, Iraq, Kenya, Lebanon, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Philippines, Russia, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Senegal, Syria, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, Uzbekistan) The test should be made in the designated laboratories in their countries.

 - 8- VaxCertph (Philippines)
 - 9- CONECTE SUS (Brazil)

QUARANTINE:

- **quarantine is required from passengers whose PCR tests results proved to be Positive, but Residents has to stay home until results released**
- Self-quarantine forms to be completed and kept with the passenger to be delivered by them to authorities upon arrival.

PCR:

- All passengers entering to Israel (if they have stayed in a territory outside of Israel for more than 72 hours) must present a medical certificate indicating a negative test result for COVID19. The test must be one of the following:
 - a. **PCR test** – conducted within 72 hours of the scheduled time of departure (from the first point of departure)
 - b. **Rapid Antigen test** – conducted within 24 hours of the scheduled time of departure (from the first point of departure) The test should be administrated by a certified sampler (not a home test kit) Only those with a negative test result will be permitted to board the flight. The test result must be in English and include the traveller's passport details.
- All passengers must take a **PCR test upon arrival** in Israel. This requirement applies for all passengers, including vaccinated and recovered persons.
- **Exemption** From Pre-Flight COVID Test:
 - a) Those who have stayed outside of Israel for less than 72 hours.

EgyptAir must insure that there are no travel reservations is made to depart Oman before the mandatory quarantine period ends (7 days with negative result PCR test on the 8th day).
 - The list of countries from which arrivals are prohibited from entering the territory of the Sultanate has been terminated.
 - All Omani citizens, residents of Oman, visa holders of Oman, those who do not require a visa to travel to Oman, and those who can obtain a visa upon arrival are allowed to enter the Sultanate in accordance with the pre-COVID system.
 - All passengers arriving to the Sultanate are required to present a COVID-19 vaccine certificate containing a QR Code stating that they have received two doses of any COVID-19 vaccine approved in Oman Pfizer BioNTech, Oxford AstraZeneca, Covishield AstraZeneca, Sputnik, Sinovac, Moderna, and Sinopharm, or a single dose of Johnson & Johnson. The last dose is required to have been received not less than fourteen (14) days ahead of estimated arrival time. The Ministry of Health publishes and updates the list of vaccines approved in Oman.
 - **Passengers' documents to be verified by aircraft operators prior to travel to the Sultanate of Oman :**
 - If vaccinated:
 - a) Registration in (<https://covid19.emushrif.om/>).
 - b) Vaccination Certificate.

c) A negative result of COVID-19 PCR test, or a reservation for Covid-19 PCR test upon arrival to the Sultanate of Oman.

- **If NOT vaccinated:**

a) Registration in (<https://covid19.emushrif.om/>).

b) Negative result of COVID-19 PCR test

c) Reservation for Covid-19 PCR test upon arrival to the Sultanate of Oman.

d) Confirmed reservation of institutional quarantine except for Omani citizens and other categories excluded from the institutional quarantine.

PCR:

- **Effective 26th December 2021 till 31st January**, Passengers arriving to Oman are required to:

1. Submitting a Vaccination certificate (Receiving two doses of the approved vaccine is required for the above 18 years old of **non-Omani passengers**).

2. Entry to the Sultanate of Oman is only permitted for those who present a certificate of negative COVID-19 PCR test, provided that the test was conducted by no later than **72 hours** prior to arrival, excluding passengers who booked the test on arrival, prior to the issuance of this circular and the arrival date does not exceed 72 hours from the time of the circular.

- Arriving passengers aged 18 and less are exempted from the requirements of the vaccine and the COVID-19 PCR test. Passengers with health conditions that prevent them from receiving the vaccine according to an approved medical certificate are also exempted from presenting vaccine certificates.

- Arriving passengers shall have international health insurance covering the cost of treatment for COVID-19 for a period of at least one month is mandatory except for Omani citizens.

- PCT test when passengers arrive to Muscat airport.

- Omani Citizens who are tested positive after recovering from COVID-19 are allowed to travel to the Sultanate if providing proof that they have completed the prescribed quarantine period before taking the COVID-19 PCR test prior to departure to Oman

- The COVID-19 PCR test shall indicate the medical test result which can be validated and certified with a QR Code.

- Diplomats working in the foreign diplomatic missions accredited to the Sultanate and visitor diplomats are exempted from the COVID-19 PCR test.

- **Departing Passengers from Oman:**

1) Omani citizens shall have health insurance covering COVID-19 valid in the country they are travelling to.

2) Passenger shall comply with the conditions of the country they are traveling to.

PCR/ QUARANTINE:

A. PRE-DEPARTURE FROM COUNTRY OF EXIT:

I. Pre-Boarding:

- Travelers MUST perform a COVID-19 PCR test **not more than 2 days (48 hours)** before boarding/departure. PCR tests done more than 48 hours before departure are not valid and persons will not be allowed to board. Rapid antigen or antibody test are not acceptable; only PCR tests can be used for this purpose. Test validity commences from the time of sample collection. For Travelers with multiple connections before arrival in Nigeria, the PCR test must be valid within 48 hours of boarding from the first point of departure. Travelers must bring along an electronic or hard copy of their negative COVID- 19 PCR test for presentation at the departure airport and upon arrival in Nigeria. A record of their vaccination status will also be required on arrival in Nigeria.
- All intending Travelers (**including diplomats and children less than 10 years old**) MUST register via an online national travel portal (Nigeria International Travel Portal – <https://nitp.ncdc.gov.ng>) and proceed to fill in the online Health Declaration/ Self-Reporting form located on the portal. They should ensure that the information/contact details provided on the form are correct and verifiable. Travelers must provide valid phone numbers, residential addresses, and functional e-mails where they can be contacted. Travelers must also inform Port Health officials on arrival of any change in their health status since completion of the Health Declaration/Self-Reporting Form.
- After filling the online Health Declaration/Self-Reporting Form, Travelers will be directed to upload their negative COVID-19 PCR test on to the portal. **Only children less than 10 years old are exempted from uploading a pre-arrival negative COVID-19 PCR test result.** Once this is successfully done, Travelers will proceed to the payment section of the travel portal. **Only Children less than 10 years are exempted from payment for the repeat test in Nigeria.** Travelers are advised to still bring along an electronic or hard copy of their negative COVID-19 PCR test for presentation at the airport.

➤ **For partially vaccinated and unvaccinated Travelers:**

On reaching the payment section of the portal, Travelers will be requested to select their preferred Laboratory/Sample Collection Centre based on where they will be self-isolating for the period of 7-days in Nigeria. A list of accredited private laboratory providers/Sample Collection Centers across the country are available on the payment platform. The next stage is to choose a bank payment gateway and then proceed

to pay for the **Day 2 (arrival day + 1 day)** and **Day 7 (arrival day + 6 days)** in-country COVID-19 PCR tests. Please **note** that Travelers paying in Naira should use cards issued by a Nigerian bank.

➤ **For fully vaccinated Travelers:**

- On reaching the payment section of the portal, Travelers will be requested to select their preferred Laboratory/Sample Collection Centre based on where they will be located 2 days after arrival in the country for the Day 2 test (arrival day + 1 day). A list of accredited private laboratory providers/Sample Collection Centers across the country are available on the payment platform. The next stage is to choose a bank payment gateway and then proceed to pay for the **Day 2** in-country COVID-19 PCR test. A record of their vaccination status will also be required on arrival in Nigeria.
- Following successful payment, Travelers should download the **Permit to Travel Certificate/ QR Code** using the “Get Permit to Travel” button visible at the top right corner of the portal, save and print the form for presentation at the point of boarding. The Permit to Travel Certificate/ QR code will have a “PAID” label if payment is successful and “UNPAID” label if payment had not gone through yet or is unsuccessful. Any passenger with an “UNPAID” label will not be allowed to travel. A copy of the Permit to Travel Certificate/QR Code will also be sent to the email address provided by the traveller.

II. Boarding:

1. Prior to boarding for Nigeria, Travelers **MUST** present **TWO** documents at their point of departure to be allowed to board.
 - a. A **negative COVID-19 PCR** test done within 2 days (**48 hours**) of departure. Airlines have been directed not to board Travelers with non-PCR COVID-19 tests (such as antigen or antibody tests), a positive COVID-19 PCR test result, or tests performed beyond 48 hours of boarding; and
 - b. **Permit to Travel Certificate/QR Code** - generated from the Nigeria International Travel Portal on completion of a health questionnaire, uploading of a negative COVID-19 PCR result and schedule of PCR tests on Days 2 and 7 on arrival in Nigeria. Travelers failing to show a Permit to Travel Certificate/QR Code will not be allowed to board.
2. Airlines that board Travelers without any of the required documents (a negative COVID-19 PCR test done not more than 48 hours prior to boarding and a Permit to Travel Certificate/QR code, shall be sanctioned as follows:
 - a. Travelers, who are non-Nigerians, will be refused entry and returned to the point of embarkation at cost to the airline

- b. Travelers who are Nigerians or holders of permanent resident permit will be allowed entry but subjected to the procedure outlined in Section D below. In addition, **Travelers arriving with forged (fake) COVID-19 PCR results will be escorted to a designated quarantine facility (government approved hotel) for a mandatory quarantine for a period of 7 days at expense to the traveler and will be prosecuted.**
 - c. Airlines shall be fined **USD 3,500** per traveler for failure to comply with any of the preboarding requirements.
 - d. Airlines who consistently fail to comply with the above requirements may be banned from coming to Nigeria.
3. At the time of boarding, Travelers will be required to undergo temperature screening and asked about COVID-19 symptoms. Travelers with temperature >38C and other COVID-19 related signs and symptoms shall not be allowed to board the flight.

B. ON ARRIVAL IN NIGERIA

- All Travelers are required to strictly adhere to instructions given by Port Health Services at the arrival terminal. Travelers who fails to adhere to instructions will be sanctioned by relevant security personnel.

All Travelers arriving in Nigeria will be required to:

1. Go through the routine Port Health screening and present electronic or print-out evidence of **preboarding COVID-19 PCR test, Permit to Travel Certificate/ QR Code; and Vaccination Certificate (where applicable); and**
2. Present their international passports for clearance through the Nigerian Immigration Service System's Migrants Identification Data Analysis System (MIDAS).

For partially vaccinated and unvaccinated in-bound Travelers:

- Proceed on **mandatory 7 days** self-isolation/quarantine in their selected in-country destination address. Travelers are to avoid physical interaction with friends, family members, colleagues, and other members of the public during the period of self-isolation. Travelers should check their emails/text messages regularly for updates regarding the arrangement for their repeat COVID-19 PCR test from the laboratory of their choice. During this period the traveler may be contacted by the COVID-19 Response team to ascertain state of self-isolation, Days 2 & 7 testing appointment and health status.
- Show-up at the laboratory/sample collection centers on the **2nd and 7th day of arrival**. Samples will be taken, and a COVID-19 PCR test done. The selected private laboratory will send a reminder text message, email, or phone call to the traveler a day before the appointment date.

- Persons who test negative for COVID-19 after 7 days of self-isolation/quarantine will be allowed to exit self-isolation on receipt of their result.

For fully vaccinated in-bound Travelers:

Show-up at the laboratory/sample collection centers on the **2nd day of arrival**. Samples will be taken, and a COVID-19 PCR test done. The selected private laboratory will send a reminder text message, email, or phone call to the traveler a day before the appointment date.

C. NOTE:

- Travelers who fails to show up at the sample collection centers on Days - 2 and 7 of arrival (as applicable) will be sent text reminders and their details forwarded to the State Public Health Department teams and Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) for active follow-up.
- Travelers who fails to show up for testing will have travel restrictions placed on their passports for at least 6 months and will not be able to travel abroad during this period. Non-Nigerian passport holders will have their visas revoked and will be deported from the country.
- Test results will be provided within 24 hours and the State Public Health Departments & NCDC will be informed; accordingly, if test result is not received after 24hrs, the traveller may contact the private Laboratory for his/her test result.
- Partially vaccinated or unvaccinated persons who test negative for COVID-19 after 7 days shall end self-isolation on receipt of a negative test result but must continue to self-monitor for symptoms until Day 14; and MUST continue to observe Non-Pharmaceutical Intervention measures (e.g., wearing face mask, maintaining social distance, regular washing of hands and use of alcohol-based hand sanitizers);
- Fully vaccinated persons who test negative for COVID-19 after the post-arrival Day 2 test MUST continue to observe Non-Pharmaceutical Intervention measures (e.g., wearing face mask, maintaining social distance, regular washing of hands and use of alcohol-based hand sanitizers);
- Travelers reporting or developing symptoms of COVID-19 on arrival in Nigeria, or during screening will not be allowed to self-isolate and will be placed in institutional quarantine; and
- Persons who test positive for COVID-19 after the post-arrival Days 2 and 7 test (as applicable) shall be managed based on national guidelines for COVID-19 treatment.

D. PROCEDURE FOR TRAVELERS ARRIVING WITHOUT A VALID PCR RESULT:

- Any traveler arriving in Nigeria without a valid COVID-19 PCR result (i.e., no COVID-19 PCR test result, a forged COVID-19 PCR test result or COVID-19 antigen or antibody test result) will be subjected to the following measures:

If holding foreign passport and non-resident in Nigeria, the traveler will be denied entry into the country and returned to the point of embarkation at cost to the airline. 2. Traveler's passport will be collected by relevant authorities and will not be released to him/her until after successful completion of mandatory quarantine period; and d. A COVID-19 PCR test will be conducted by a designated private laboratory within 24 hours of arrival at the quarantine facility at expense to the passenger. If the test result is Positive for COVID-19, the passenger will be transferred to an isolation facility and managed according to National treatment guidelines. If test result is negative, passenger will CONTINUE with mandatory isolation at the quarantine facility until a satisfactory Day-7 COVID-19 PCR test is done. <p><u>II. GUIDELINES FOR OUTBOUND PASSENGERS</u></p> <p>All passengers travelling out of Nigeria are required to provide:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Evidence of full COVID-19 vaccination, or b. In the case of positive quarantine, the person concerned is transferred to the health isolation center for virus carriers, at the expense of the person concerned.
- When registering at the airport of departure, the reservation document and the confirmation of release (Voucher) must be presented, which must include:
 - a. Expenses for transportation between the airport and the quarantine center,
 - b. expenses for accommodation for ten (10) days at the quarantine center,
 - c. Expenses for conducting a PCR analysis during the last 24 hours of the compulsory quarantine strain.

- Air carriers must not accept the registration of any passenger unless he presents the reservation confirmation document and voucher, with the necessity of verifying as much as possible of the authenticity of the document.
- In the event that one of the air carriers accepts a passenger on its flight to Tunisian, who does not hold a reservation document and confirms the release of the voucher), it either bears the expenses of housing him in one of the compulsory quarantine centers for the required period or ensures his return on the plane to the country of arrival.
- **Excluded from the compulsory quarantine are:**
 - Passengers under 18 years who are unaccompanied or accompanying minors of persons vaccinated against the SARS 2 virus, with the need for them to be subject to the self-quarantine for a period of 10 days.
 - Diplomats, members of nominal missions accredited in Tunisia and their family members residing in Tunisia, provided that when registering for travel, a diplomatic passport or a note verbal issued by the relevant embassy or organization containing all the necessary data or valid share cards in Tunisia must be presented, with the need for them to be subject to self-quarantine for a period of 10 days.

- Any Passenger who refuses to pay to undergo the COVID-19 test will be subjected to the following: Passenger's passport will be seized, and passenger handed over to State Security Agencies, Passenger will be taken into fourteen (14) day quarantine at a designated location at the passenger's cost.
- All arriving passengers who test positive for COVID-19 will undergo mandatory isolation and treatment at a designated health facility or isolation centre, at a cost to passengers, EXCEPT Ghanaian citizens. The isolation will be for a period of seven (7) days. However, the final discharge of cases will be based on existing case management guidelines and protocols.
- All passengers testing negative will be advised to continue to observe COVID-19 safety precautions following arrival in Ghana.

- Airlines who board passengers without proof of payment for the COVID-19 test and would/could NOT pay for the test in Ghana, will be fined US\$3,500 per passenger.
- Non-Ghanaian passengers may be refused entry and returned to the point of embarkation at a cost to the Airline.
- Ghanaian passengers will have their passports seized; the passenger handed over to State Security Agencies and taken into a fourteen (14) day quarantine at a designated location at the passenger's cost.

Exemptions :

- Children under 5 years of age will not be required to undergo testing on Arrival at the Kotoka International Airport.
- **Children between the ages of 5-12 years will be required to pay for testing at the new rates**
- **Visiting heads of state and senior government officials of the rank of minister are exempted from the mandatory COVID-19 test on arrival however members of their delegation are required to take the COVID on arrival at the airport.**
- Passengers who arrive under emergency circumstances such as diverted flights will not be required to undergo testing if they do not leave the airport or remain in isolation in their hotel.
- For passengers who transit through other countries before arriving in Ghana, the first country of departure will be the reference point. (Connecting flights should not deny passenger boarding, as long as the journey has not been terminated in any of the transit countries.)

Transit Passengers :

- Passengers transiting and transferring through Accra will not be required to take the COVID-19 test in Accra.

- For the purpose of containing the spread of the COVID-19 virus, to persons who intend to enter the national territory and who in the previous fourteen days have stayed or transited in (**Belgium, France, the Netherlands, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Czech Republic and Spain**) without prejudice to the provisions of the decree of the President of the Council of Ministers of 7 September 2020, as extended by the decree-law of 7 October 2020, n. 125, the following alternative preventive measures apply:
 - Obligation to present to the carrier at the time of boarding and to anyone appointed to carry out checks on the attestation of having undergone, in the 72 hours prior to entry into the national territory, a molecular or antigen test, carried out by means of swab and negative result).
 - **Entry and transit in Italy is forbidden** to people who have stayed or transited in the following countries in the previous 14 days: (Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Brazil, Bosnia Herzegovina, Chile, Kuwait, North Macedonia, Moldova, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic, Serbia, Montenegro, and Kosovo), also direct and indirect flights to/from countries referred are also suspended. Exception to this rule is for Italian citizens or nationals of EU and Schengen Member States, UK, Andorra, Monaco, San Marino or the Vatican City State and their close family members, provided that they were resident in Italy since before July 9, 2020.
 - **Effective from 24th May 2021**, all passengers entering Italy from foreign states in list B,C,D and E is required to fill in the DPLF (digital passenger locator form). For further information and DPLF visit

- Passengers who have stayed in/transited through countries listed in list E (**EGYPT is included**) in the previous 14 days, must:
 - complete the DPLF digital Passenger Locator Form, which replaces the previous self-declaration.
- **The travel regulations to/from this list as following.**
 - 1.The journeys towards the Countries included in the **list E** of Annex 20 (DPCM 2MAR21) are only permitted for one of the following reasons or conditions:
 - a) Work reasons
 - b) Absolute urgency
 - c) Health reasons
 - d) Study reasons
 - e) Return to one's home, residence or dwellings (also a close partner's residence in a proven relationship is acceptable)
 2. The entry into the national territory by the persons who in the 14 days preceding the arrival have stayed or transited in one of the Countries included in list E above is allowed on condition of abidance by the measures indicated in paragraph 3 below and exclusively for one of the following reasons or conditions :
 - a) Work reasons
 - b) Absolute urgency
 - c) Health reasons
 - d) Study reasons
 - e) Return to one's home , residence or dwellings (also a close partner's residence in a proven relationship is acceptable)
 - f) EU , Schengen Agreement , Andorra , Principality of Monaco, San Marino and Vatican State citizenship
 - g) Relatives of the persons having citizenship in one of the Countries listed under f) above
 - h) Long-term residents or citizen of third Countries entitled to resident status
 - i) Relatives of the persons listed under h) above
 - l) Entry into the national territory to reach the home, residence or dwellings of a person listed under f) and h) above, even if not a cohabitant, with whom there is a proven and stable relationship.
 - m) Athletes, coaches, referees , sport journalists and assistants for sport events of national interest

- **From these countries it is not possible to enter Italy for tourism reasons**
- **The police form must be handed over to the border police upon arrival**
- **The carrier's form must be kept by the carrier, available to the USMAF, Ministry of Health for any health checks.**
- Travel to/from the countries **in list E** (EGYPT) is only allowed for specific reasons, such as: (work / health reasons / study reasons / absolute urgency / return to one's domicile, home, or residence).
- Travelling for tourism is therefore not permitted.
- The re-entry/entry into Italy, in case of stay/transit in the previous 14 days from this group of countries, is always allowed to Italian/EU/Schengen citizens and their family members, as well as to holders of long-term resident status and their family members (Directive 2004/38/EC). It is also confirmed the possibility of entry into Italy, from List E countries, for persons who have a proven and stable emotional relationship (even if not cohabiting) with Italian/EU/Schengen citizens or natural persons who are legally resident in Italy (long-term residents), who need to reach their partner's home/domicile/residence (in Italy).
- Athletes, technicians, competition judges and officials, foreign press representatives and accompanying persons participating in competitive sports competitions, recognized to be of pre-eminent national interest with a provision of the Italian National Olympic Committee (CONI) and the Italian Paralympic Committee (CIP) and regulated by a specific safety protocol adopted by the sports organization responsible for the event.
- **Effective 29th April 2021 till 21st June 2021**; Ban on entry and transit in Italy of natural persons from (**India / Bangladesh / Sri Lanka**).
- The new order prohibits entry to Italy for people coming from India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka or who have stayed in the countries in the preceding fourteen days. The entry ban does not apply to the following persons:
 - Italian citizens registered as residents in Italy since before April 29, 2021 and who do not display any symptoms of COVID-19, and the persons referred to in Art. 51, paragraph, 7 letter n) of the Prime Ministerial Decree of 2 March 2021.
 - Italian citizens registered on the Registry of Italians Resident Abroad (AIRE);
 - **Only** Italian Citizens and persons in possession of a formal written authorization from the Ministry of Health can enter Italy.
- On the basis of the provisions of the Ordinance, the entry into Italy of natural persons coming from or who have stayed in the previous fourteen days in India, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka is prohibited, with the exception of Italian citizens who do not show symptoms of COVID 19 and of the subjects referred to in

art. 51 paragraph 7 letter. n of the Prime Ministerial Decree of 2 March 2021 (n) to officials and agents, however named, of the European Union or of international organizations, diplomatic agents, administrative and technical staff of diplomatic missions, consular officers and employees, military personnel , including those returning from international missions, and of the Police Forces, to the personnel of the Information System for the security of the Republic and of the Fire Brigade in the exercise of their functions).

- Entry is conditioned, in addition to the declaration obligations already provided for by the Prime Minister's Decree of 2 March 2021 and the Ordinance of the Minister of Health April 16, 2021, by:
- Obligation to present the certification of having undergone a molecular or antigenic test carried out in the 72 antecedents and negative result;
- Obligation to undergo a molecular or antigen test upon arrival at the airport;
- Obligation to undergo, regardless of the negative result of the test, isolation at a COVID Hotel or other place indicated by the health authority or civil protection for a period of ten days;
- Obligation to undergo a further molecular or antigen test after the quarantine period.
- Passengers arriving in Italy who do not meet the required requirements will be rejected with transport costs for repatriation to be borne by the carrier.
- **Instructions of countries in LIST (D):**
 - List D countries includes (Saudi Arabia, Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, United Arab Emirates, Japan, Jordan, Kosovo, Israel, Kuwait, New Zealand, Qatar, Rwanda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (including Gibraltar, the Isle of Man, Channel Islands and British bases on the island of Cyprus and excluding territories not belonging to the European continent), Republic of Korea, Singapore, United States of America, Ukraine, Uruguay, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Macao Special Administrative Regions and the States.

A- Entry into Italy without self-isolation

- Anyone who has stayed or passed through one of the countries on List D in the 14 days prior to entering Italy without self-isolation (5 days) must comply with the following regulations:
- Fill out the Passenger Locator Form prior to entering Italy. This form replaces the self-declaration made to the travel company and can be shown in both digital and paper format
- take a negative molecular or antigen swab test in the 72 hours prior to entering Italy; in the case of arrivals from the UK and Northern Ireland and British Isles, the swab test must be taken in the 48 hours prior to entering Italy
- Present the COVID-19 Green Certificate, or equivalent certificate, certifying the completion of the vaccination cycle to the transport operator at the time of boarding and to anyone appointed

to carry out the checks. Persons who have stayed in or passed through Canada, Japan and the United States of America in the fourteen days prior to their entry into Italy, can also show a COVID-19 Green Certificate certifying recovery or a certificate issued by the competent health authorities certifying recovery. These certificates can be shown digitally or on paper.

B- Entry into Italy with self-isolation requirement (5 days)

- This prevention measure shall be applied only to people entering Italy without showing either a negative swab test or a vaccination certificate. Travellers who do not present the vaccination certificate must:
- Fill out the Passenger Locator Form prior to entering Italy. This form replaces the self-declaration made to the travel company and can be shown in both digital and paper format
- take a negative molecular or antigen swab test in the 72 hours prior to entering Italy; in the case of arrivals from the UK and Northern Ireland and British Isles, the swab test must be taken in the 48 hours prior to entering Italy
- Notify the Prevention Department of the local health authority of their entry to Italy. See COVID-19 Numeri verdi regionali for the contact details of local Italian health authorities
- travel to their final destination in Italy by private transport only
- remain in self-isolation at the address indicated on the Passenger Locator Form for a total of 5 days
- take another molecular or antigen swab test at the end of the 5 days in self-isolation
- All children under the age of 6 entering Italy are always exempt from pre-departure swab tests; they are also exempt from fiduciary isolation in the event that the accompanying parent with whom they travel does not have this obligation because they have a valid Green Certificate for vaccination or recovery.
- All minors aged 6 or over are required to have a pre-departure swab test; if they do not take the swab test, they will not be exempt from quarantine.
- Entry BAN on air traffic for passengers coming from (South Africa, Lesotho, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Eswatini):
 - The ban on passengers who have stayed or transited in the aforementioned countries in the 14 days prior to entry into Italy.
 - Italian citizens residing in Italy from a date prior to that of this Ordinance together with minor children, spouse or part of a civil union and the categories referred to in art. 51, paragraph 7, letter n of the Prime Ministerial Decree of 2 March 2021, provided that they do not show symptoms from Covid 19. The categories of passengers exempted from the entry ban are obliged to:

- fill in the dPLF
- present upon boarding a negative result of a molecular swab performed in the 72 hours prior to entering the national territory;
- undergo a swab, antigenic or molecular, upon arrival at the airport;
- Undergo a ten-day period of fiduciary isolation.
- Airlines must promptly communicate the names of any passengers falling within the aforementioned exemption to the e-mail addresses usma.fiumicino@sanita.it and t.esposito@sanita.it.
- **Effective from 25th Dec, 2021:**
 - It is mandatory to wear FFP2 masks on board of all means of transport (including airplane)
 - The Italian Maritime, Air and Border Health Offices (USMAF-SASN) will perform spot checks through antigenic or PCR tests on incoming passengers entering Italy.
- **Effective 16DEC21 Till 31st January 2021** the following changes will be applied:
 1. List-C (UE-Schengen-EEA) – same list of countries but different conditions of entry.
 - Entry without fiduciary isolation: presentation of dPLF, a negative swab certificate (-48h for molecular, -24h for antigenic) together with a Covid green certificate of immunization (vaccination, recovery, recovery after vaccination).
 - Entry with fiduciary isolation: 5 day quarantine period is needed for all those who, despite presenting a negative swab result, do not have the Covid green certificate of immunization. A final swab is required at the end of the isolation period.

PCR:

- **Till 15th December 2021**, a molecular or antigen swab test needs to be performed **within 72 hours** prior to entry into Italy for those coming from or having stayed at/ transited through, in the previous 14 days, (Minors under the age of 6 are exempted from having a pre-departure swab test) one or more states or territories listed in lists D and E (**Egypt in list E**).
- **Till 31st January 2021:**
 - List-D Countries: added Argentina, Colombia, Indonesia and Perù, removed Singapore, Ucraina, Kosovo and Jordan. Reduced deadlines for the antigen test to entry Italy (to 24h)
 - List-E Countries: reduced deadline for the antigen test to entry Italy (to 24h) (Egypt in List E)
- **Exemptions:**
Exemption from the swab test taken in the 72 hours prior to entry to Italy, from self-isolation and the swab test at the end of self-isolation
 Without prejudice to the general conditions above, this exemption applies to the following categories:

- transport crew members
- onboard transport staff
- travel to and from the States and territories referred to in List A of Annex 20
- anyone who enters Italy for a period not exceeding one hundred and twenty hours (5 days) for proven reasons of work, health or emergency, with the obligation, at the end of this time period, to leave Italian territory immediately or, failing this, to begin the period of surveillance and self-isolation in compliance with paragraphs 1 to 5.
- anyone who transits, by private vehicle, in Italian territory for a period not exceeding thirty-six hours, with the obligation, at the end of this period of time, to leave Italian territory immediately or, failing this, to begin the period of surveillance and self-isolation in compliance with paragraphs 1 to 5
- cross-border workers entering and leaving Italy for proven reasons of work and for the subsequent return journey home or to their place of residence
- the staff of businesses and entities with registered or secondary offices in Italy for travel abroad for proven reasons of work and for trips lasting no more than one hundred and twenty hours
- pupils and students in order to attend school or university in a State other than that in which they live or are resident, to which they return every day or at least once a week .
- Diplomatic passengers will need PCR or Antigen test 72 hours prior entry to Italy as they are only exempted from self-isolation and swab test at the end of self-isolation.
- **Vaccination certificates**
 - **The certificate may be shown in paper or digital format and must be in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French or Spanish.**
 - **Certificates are valid only if they meet the following conditions:**
 - **it must be issued by the national health authority of the country the person is travelling from**
 - **the vaccine used for vaccination must be approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA): (Comirnaty by Pfizer-BioNtech / Moderna / Vaxzevria / Jansen (Johnson & Johnson)).**
- **QUARANTINE: All passengers arriving Italy (so far) are subject to self-quarantine for 14 days.**
- For passengers arriving from D and E list (**Egypt in list E**), quarantine will be **10 days at the address indicated on the Passenger Locator Form**. After 10 days quarantine passengers must take a second test. At the end of the quarantine period, an additional molecular or antigenic swab test needs to be carried out.
- Exemptions for Covid-19 **second** test and quarantine:
- Passengers that are coming for business, health or urgent reasons and will stay maximum 120 hours on Italian territory

Passengers arriving directly from Brazil, South Africa, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, India and Pakistan and passengers who had been in these countries within the last 14 days will be exempted from quarantine if they submit proof of 2 doses of vaccination (listed by WHO or turkey for emergency use) (1 dose for Johnson and Johnson) provided that the last dose was at least 14 days before arrival. Otherwise these passengers will be quarantined at their residences or addresses they submit. On the tenth day of quarantine a PCR test will be done and if result is negative, quarantine will be lifted. Passengers who do not have a PCR test on the 10th day will remain in quarantine until the 14th day.
- Passengers arriving from **Afghanistan** and those who have been in this country for the last 14 days must submit a negative PCR test result taken at most 72 hours before arrival. These passengers are subject to quarantine for 10 days at hotels determined by the governorships. Expenses for accommodation and transfers from airports will be borne by passengers. At the end of 7th day, if test result is negative, quarantine will be lifted.
- **Afghanistan** citizens who have residence or work permit in republic of turkey will be exempted from the hotel quarantine on the condition that they submit valid residence or work permit and they will be subjected to quarantine at their residence. passengers whose first entry points is out of Istanbul or Ankara will be allowed to travel to their residence only by private vehicles and will not be allowed to have domestic flights or use public transportation.
- Republic of turkey citizens arriving from **Afghanistan** will be exempted from the hotel quarantine and they will be subjected to quarantine at their residence and passengers whose first entry points is out of Istanbul or Ankara will be allowed to travel to their residence only by private vehicles and will not be allowed to have domestic flights or use public transportation.
- Passengers to be quarantined as mentioned above shall pay the hotel fees before arriving to turkey. Passengers who cannot prove that they have made the necessary payments to stay at the hotels determined by the governorships will not be allowed to board the plane by airline operators.
- Passengers arriving from the countries other than those listed in the above mentioned countries those who submit proof of 2 doses of vaccination (listed by who or turkey for emergency use) (1 dose for Johnson and Johnson) provided that the last dose was at least 14 days before arrival and/or a proof of recovery from covid-19 within the last 6 months starting from the 28th day of the first positive

 - Children aged 12 to 17: must take the PDT - COVID-19 test (PCR or Antigen) in the 2 days before travel to England and to have quarantine on arrival and take a PCR on or before day 2.
 - Children aged less than 12: are not required to take the PDT - COVID-19 test (PCR or Antigen) in the 2 days before travel to England ,
 - Children aged 5 to 17: have to follow the testing and quarantine rules for people who qualify as fully vaccinated on arrival in England. (In terms of PDT or having to quarantine on arrival and take a PCR test on or before day 2 as above mentioned).
 - This means that they have to quarantine on arrival and take a PCR test on or before day 2.
- **Fully vaccinated** passengers arriving in England from a country that is not on the red list:
 - must quarantine at home or in the place of staying
 - take a PCR test before the end of day 2 after you arrive (lateral flow tests will not be accepted)
 - quarantine can be ended if the PCR test result is negative or 14 days have passed, whichever is first
- **Approved vaccines**
 - passengers must complete course of one of the following vaccines at least 14 days before arriving in England: (Oxford/AstraZeneca / Pfizer BioNTech / Moderna / Janssen (single dose vaccine) / Sinovac-CoronaVac / Sinopharm Beijing / Covaxin)
 - The day that the passenger has his / her final dose does not counted as one of the 14 days.
 - Formulations of these vaccines, such as (AstraZeneca Covishield, AstraZeneca Vaxzevria and Moderna Takeda,) also qualify as approved vaccines. If you were vaccinated with a 2 dose vaccine, or a combination of them, you must have had both doses to be considered fully vaccinated for travel to the UK.
 - This applies in all cases, even if the passenger recently recovered from COVID-19 and have natural immunity.

- PLF is required from all passengers travelling to France.
 - 1- **“Green” countries:** countries or territories: Countries where no active viral circulation has been reported and no relevant variants identified. These are the countries of the European area, to which are added Saudi Arabia, Argentina, Australia, Bahrain, Canada, South Korea, the United Arab Emirates, Hong-Kong, Japan, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, New Zealand, Qatar, Rwanda, Senegal, Taiwan, Union of the Comoros, Uruguay, Vanuatu.
 - 2- **Orange Country:** active circulation of the virus in controlled proportions, with no distribution of variants of concern.
 - All countries, excluding “green” and “red” countries.
 - 3- **«Red» countries:** Countries where active viral circulation has been reported, including relevant variants. These include the following countries: Afghanistan, Belarus, Brazil, Costa Rica, Cuba, Georgia, Moldova, Montenegro, Pakistan, Russia, Serbia, Suriname, Turkey and Ukraine.
 - 4- **“SCARLET RED”:** This classification includes the following countries: (South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, Mauritius, Lesotho, Malawi, Mosambique, Namibia, Zambia, and Zimbabwe)

The following Measures will be applied to enter France from “SCARLET RED” country:

 - Proof of vaccination.
 - Urgent reason required. (Page 8 in the following link).

 - Negative PCR test less than 48Hrs, or Antigen test less than 24Hrs.
 - **Quarantine:** mandatory for 10 days controlled by security forces.
(In case of a positive test on arrival, a 10-day isolation measure in a location determined by the representative of the state in the department will be pronounced, after examination of the individual situation, and controlled by the forces of internal security).
- New Relaxed measures for Vaccinated passengers between **Orange zone (EGYPT)** and France as follows:
 - * **To enter France:**
 - a) If Vaccinated: Proof of vaccination + Urgent reason NOT Required + PCR test or antigenic is required + Quarantine NOT required.
 - b) if Not Vaccinated: Urgent Reason required + PCR test or antigenic + 7 days Home isolation.
 - * **To exit France:**

a) If Vaccinated: Proof of vaccination + Urgent Reason NOT required + Regulation of destination for test/Quarantine or other.

b) If Not Vaccinated: Urgent Reason Required + Regulation of destination for test/Quarantine or other.

- **Effective 04th December 2021**, any passenger (whether vaccinated or not) **12 years of age or above** coming from a foreign country not red or yellow (Orange: **Egypt** is included) must provide a result of a PCR or antigen test carried out **less than 48 hours** before the trip.
- The vaccines accepted by France are those recognized by the European Agency of the drug (EMA): Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca and Johnson & Johnson.
- Proof of vaccination should certify a complete vaccination plan, namely:
 - * 7 days after the second injection for double-injection vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca / Vaxzevria/Covishield)
 - * 4 weeks after injection for single-injection vaccines (Johnson & Johnson);
 - * 7 days after injection for vaccines in people with a history of Covid-19 (only 1 injection required).
- For persons who have received all the required doses of a WHO-licensed vaccine not approved by the European Medicines Agency, 7 days after receiving an additional dose of an EMA-approved mRNA vaccine.
- The measures applied to vaccinated adults are extended under the same conditions to their accompanying minors, whether vaccinated or not.

- **Effective from 30/01/2021;**
 - Travel (entering and leaving the territory) between France and abroad, except member states of the (European union, Andorra, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, San Marino, Switzerland and Vatican), are only be authorized for an **imperative reasons of personal or family nature, a health reason relating to the emergency** or **a professional reason that cannot be deferred**. The list of acceptable reasons for travel is given in a derogatory travel form available on the internet (ministry of interior website).
- **Effective 04th December 2021,**
 - Passengers aged twelve or above wishing to travel to the national territory from (**South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, Mauritius, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Zambia or Zimbabwe**) must be provided with a negative result of a PCR test of less than 48 hours or of an antigen test of less than 24 hours before boarding.

- Passengers aged twelve or above wishing to travel to the national territory from (a member state of the European Union, Andorra, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, San Marino, the Holy See or Switzerland) must, if they do not have proof of their vaccination status or a certificate of recovery- be provided with the result of a PCR or antigen test carried out less 24 hours before the trip.
- Passengers twelve years of age or above wishing to travel to the national territory from a foreign country must also be provided with a sworn statement attesting that they accept that they can be tested upon arrival at the airport.
- EgyptAir must be sure that the boarding passenger can present: (the exceptional travel certificate filled in and signed / supporting documents corresponding to the admissible reason for travel indicated on the certificate). If the passenger is unable to present these documents, he/she is not allowed to board the aircraft.

PCR:

- Effective from 18th January 2021, all arriving passengers of age 12 and older are required to have a negative **PCR test dating with 72 hours of departure.**
- Children under eleven years are exempted.
- PCR test types are (RT-LAMP / QRT-PCR / LAMP / QPCR / PCR / RT-PCR Detection of RNA)
- Statement for passengers to certify that he/she do not have any symptoms of COVID-19 is now required (must be filled by the passenger before travel)
- All arriving passengers from: (South Africa, Argentina, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, United Arab Emirates, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Qatar, Sri Lanka, Turkey, Uruguay), New additional measures are as follows:
 - A- Before departure;
 - All travelers, whatever their nationality, must present to the transport company and to the border control authorities:
 - for travelers over eleven years old only, the result of a virological screening biological test "COVID RT-PCR" dating less than 36 hours before departure (departure of the first flight in the event of a connecting trip) and not conclusive not to contamination by covid-19 or the result of a biological virological screening examination (PCR) carried out less than 72 hours before departure not concluding to contamination by covid-19 and a antigenic test carried out less than 24 hours before departure not concluding to contamination by covid-19;
 - supporting documents attesting to the address of the home or of a suitable accommodation (hotel or similar), specifying, where applicable, the access procedures allowing control officers to verify compliance with the quarantine measure or isolation, except in the event of isolation in a place of

- Areas of virus variants of concern: carriers are strongly advised to regularly review the designation list at www.rki.de/covid-19-risikogebiete. Designations are subject to change at short notice. ([Egypt is still listed as high-risk at RKI](#)).
- It is mandatory for all passengers arriving from categorized risk countries to register online and get a confirmation PDF: www.einreiseanmeldung.de
- (**Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe**) have now been added to **the list of virus variant areas**. (Ban on carriage from areas of variant of concern)
- A substitute form is to be filled-in only in case passenger doesn't have internet access and not in addition to the online registration.
- In case he/she filled-in the substitute form it is not to be collected by cabin crew, but passenger will have to hand it over to Federal Police at border control in Germany.
- Temporary travel restrictions apply to all non-essential travel from third countries to the Federal Republic of Germany. (This does not include flight restrictions).**The restrictions do not apply to German citizens.**
- **Exempted** from these travel restrictions are passenger who have resided and last stayed in the following countries and regions: (Argentina, Australia, Bahrain, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Jordan, Kuwait, Macao, New Zealand, Peru, Qatar, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Taiwan, United Arab Emirates, Uruguay).
- Entry into the federal republic of Germany is permitted to all passenger from third countries who have an imperative need for travel:
 - EU citizens and third-country nationals with current right of residence in Germany,
 - healthcare workers, health researchers and Geriatric care workers,
 - skilled and highly qualified foreign workers if their employment is necessary from an economic perspective and the work cannot be postponed or performed abroad,
 - freight transport and other transport personnel,
 - seasonal workers in agriculture,
 - Seafarers,
 - Foreign students, trainees, volunteers,
 - persons immigrating into Germany for the purpose of joining their families and visits for urgent family reasons or short term visits of core family members (husband/wife, minor children, parents of minor children) or unmarried partners in a relationship with German nationals, EU citizens and third-country nationals with current right of residence in Germany

or joint short term visits of couples (third country national and German national/EU citizen) residing together in a third country for important reasons,

- Persons in need of international protection or for other humanitarian reasons,
- Diplomats, staff of international organizations, military personnel and humanitarian aid workers in the exercise of their functions,
- Ethnic German resettles,
- Passengers in transit.

- Entry from third countries into the federal republic of Germany for the sole purpose of onward travel to another EU-/Schengen state is permitted. this applies under the following conditions:
 1. The time spent in Germany is limited to the duration required for direct transit to the destination state,
 2. The third-country national is permitted to enter the destination state in accordance with annex i or annex ii of the council recommendation (EU) 2020/912 of 30 June 2020 or an individual confirmation of the granting of entry issued by the destination state.
 3. The third country is not designated as an area of virus variants of concern.

Under these conditions, entry by air and onward travel to the country of destination by land is also permitted. It is the traveller's responsibility to prove the right of entry into the country of destination and the route of travel in the event of controls.

- EgyptAir are prohibited to transport passengers from an area of VOC to Germany. This restriction applies to all travel of passengers originating from an area of voc. Exemptions: the transport ban does not apply to:
- Passengers having German nationality and passengers residing and with right of residence in Germany as well as their spouses, partners from the same household, minor children and parents accompanying their minor children,
- passengers transiting a German airport including transit from or to another Schengen country,
- transportation of personnel in the interest of public health,
- flights on behalf of the Euratom safeguards, the international atomic energy agency, the united nations and its agencies, the European union and the European center for medium-range weather forecasts,
- members of a foreign diplomatic mission or consular office as well as their accompanying spouses, partners from the same household and minor children whose appointment and arrival has been notified to the federal foreign office, -transport of persons accredited by the respective organizing committee for the preparation, participation, implementation and follow-up of international sporting events,-

transports of vaccinated passengers for which the federal government of Germany has confirmed that their transport is in the national interest.

- A proof of successful entry registration or substitute registration form must be kept by Passenger at all times and presented on request to the carrier or the competent authority.
- Carriers must only transport passenger who have presented proof of successful registration or substitute registration form.
- For passengers who intend to enter Germany and who have stayed at a high-incidence area or an area of VOC within the last 10 days prior to entry, preflight testing is mandatory. The sample collection for the test must not be older than 48hr before entry.
- Passengers who have only passed through a high-incidence area and have not had a stopover there or who enter Germany only for transit purposes and leave Germany again by the quickest route are exempted from presenting a proof of negative testing. The list of exceptions is not exhaustive. Further exemptions may apply. Please check against regulation.
- Egyptair must provide information of the German Federal ministry of health to all passengers.
- passengers who intend to enter Germany and who have stayed in an international risk area (including high-incidence area or an area of virus variant of concern) within the last 10 days prior to entry are subject to mandatory entry registration (electronically) and sars-cov-2 testing
- The above instructions including transit and transfer passengers originating from a high-incidence area or area of virus variant of concern.
- The obligation to fill out a PLF and the local quarantine regulation when returning from a risk area, high risk area or an area of VOC are still valid.
- The air carrier is obliged to inform the passengers about the new digital entry registration, and to check before the flight if the passengers have registered online. If, in exceptional cases, passenger are not able to fill out the digital registration they have to fill out a replacement registration in paper form. The carrier has to collect this paper form and has to hand it over to the Health Authorities at the first point of arrival in Germany.

PCR:

- **From 23 December 2021 until 03 March 2022.**
- **Children 6 years and older (not 12+ years anymore) must provide a negative COVID testing, proof of recovery or vaccination before boarding the flight and are – if not vaccinated or recovered - also obliged to quarantine for 5 days after returning from a high risk area or for 14 days after returning from an area of variants of concern.**

- Testing requirements if not vaccinated or recovered when returning from *high-risk areas or non-risk areas*: **Antigen testing** with the sample taken **max. 48h** before entry into Germany **or PCR testing** with a sample taken **max. 48h** before departure of the flight.
- Passengers returning from or staying within the last 10 days in an area of variants of concern before entering to Germany must provide a negative PCR test with a sample taken max. 48h before departure. *In this case, antigen tests are not valid.* Please note: Those passengers should also beware of that the authority in charge can request an additional PCR test at the German entry point or anytime within 14 days after entering Germany. This addition is not fixed in the ordinance but in the explanatory statement.
- Transfer passengers are not exempted from these regulations anymore. All transfer passengers are obliged to provide a proof of recovery, vaccination or a negative COVID test before boarding the flight via Germany. Transfer passengers on flights from an area of variants of concern must provide a negative COVID testing as well.

Vaccination:

- Entries of fully vaccinated passengers from countries outside the European Union will be allowed.
- Entry into the federal republic of Germany is permitted to all passengers who have resided and last stayed in third countries, provided they are **fully vaccinated** against sarscov-2 coronavirus.
- Persons under 6 years of age who have not yet been vaccinated may enter if accompanied by at least one fully vaccinated parent.
- The passengers is considered fully vaccinated under the following conditions:
 1. The vaccine must be listed on the website of the paul-ehrlich-institute.
 2. Passenger must have received all the necessary vaccination doses required for a complete protective vaccination as listed on the website of the paul-ehrlich-institute.
 3. At least 14 days have elapsed since the last required vaccination, except for recovered persons.
 4. Passenger has not stayed in an area of virus variants of concern during the last 10 days.
 5. Passenger is citizen of a state whose entry requirements are not subject to reciprocity. (Reciprocity reservations currently exist for the following state: china).
- On all flights to Germany carriers must only transport passengers who have presented proof of negative test for sars-cov-2 **or** a vaccination certificate or (fully vaccinated) a proof of recovery of sars-cov-2. PAX transiting via a German airport to a third country or a country in the Schengen area are exempted.

- Passenger must present a digital Covid certificate of the European Union (EU-dcc) or an equivalent proof of vaccination before departure to the carrier. EU-dcc or an equivalent proof of vaccination must be checked by carriers against ID card or equivalent prior boarding.
- The vaccination certificate must contain at least the following information:
 1. Personal data of the vaccinated person (at least surname, first name and date of birth),
 2. Date of vaccination,
 3. Number of vaccination doses,
 4. Name of the vaccine,
 5. Name of the disease against which vaccination was received, and
 6. Characteristics that indicate the person or institution responsible for carrying out the vaccination or issuing the certificate, for example an official symbol or the name of the issuer.
 7. accepted languages of proof of vaccination: German, English, French, Italian or Spanish.
- Regarding the current status of Non-EU countries recognizing the European Digital COVID certificate. Up to now, the 16 following Non-EU countries joined the EU Digital COVID Certificate System: (Albania / Andorra / Switzerland / Faroe Islands / Israel / Iceland / Liechtenstein / Morocco / Monaco / North Macedonia / Norway / Panama / San Marino / Turkey / Ukraine / The Vatican)
- The accepted Vaccines are (BioNTech / Moderna / AstraZeneca / Janssen).
- **Passengers are required to undergo testing (SARS-COV2) virus no more than 48 hours before or immediately after entry.**

QUARANTINE:

- Those travelers are obliged to go directly to their home or other suitable accommodation immediately after their return and to stay there permanently for a period of 10 days.
- **When returning from High risk areas The obligation to quarantine at home for **10 days** is still valid. The quarantine can be shortened after 5 days with a proof of a negative Covid test. With a proof of a vaccination or of recovery there is no need to quarantine. (Children **under 6 years** the quarantine is obliged but ends automatically after 5 days without having a proof of a negative test)**
- **When returning from Areas of variant of concern VOC, the quarantine obligation **14 days**. (There is no option to shorten the quarantine with a proof of vaccination, recovery or negative test.)**
- It is NOT mandatory to quarantine for the following: Traveling through, border traffic, professional activity / training / study, border commuters, private visits and special professional groups.

7	CYPRUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Effective 15th December 2021, (00:00 am): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All passengers entering the Republic of Cyprus, are required to undergo a <u>rapid antigen test upon completion of 72 hours from the time of their arrival</u>. (After arrival, Free of charge) through the mobile testing units of the Ministry of Health, upon presentation of their boarding pass card and proof of identity (identity card, passport). Excluded are those who received the booster / 3rd dose of acceptable vaccines.

- The entry into the Republic of any person, who within 14 days prior to arrival to the Republic of Cyprus has either stayed/lived, or passed through the following countries is forbidden: (South Africa /Namibia /Lesotho /Eswatini /Zimbabwe /Mozambique /Malawi /Botswana)
- Entry into the Republic of Cyprus is permitted only to the following categories of passengers from the same countries :
 - Cypriot citizens and members of their families (alien spouses and their underage children).
 - Citizens of EU Member States, European Economic Area countries (Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Norway) and Switzerland.
 - Passengers of third countries, legally residing in the Republic of Cyprus.
 - they possess a negative laboratory COVID-19 test, with sampling taking place within 72 hours prior to their departure to the Republic of Cyprus and undergo laboratory testing (at their own expense) upon arrival to the Republic,
 - are transferred to hotels and/or tourist facilities contracted by the Deputy Ministry of Tourism, in which they must remain in mandatory self-isolation for a period of 10 days from their arrival, with the date of their arrival counted as day “0”. It is noted that the cost of transportation to said hotels and facilities is paid for by the passengers,
 - undergo laboratory testing on the 10th day after their arrival, at the Republic’s expense, and upon negative result can then terminate their mandatory isolation.
- **All passengers, regardless of country category, shall be obliged to fill an application on the <https://cyprusflightpass.gov.cy/> within 48 hours prior to their departure flight.**
- **No passengers will be accepted without Cyprus Flight pass.**
- **Transit passengers will not be accepted via Larnaca Airport onboard low cost carriers unless passengers are in position allow to enter Cyprus with all documents needed (Visa, PCR test and Cyprus flight pass)**

- **From 06 December 2021** all passengers aged 12 years or over arrive to Cyprus will to undergo a PCR test upon arrival the cost will be borne by passengers themselves (15 Euro).
- Passengers arriving from (South Africa, Namibia, Lesotho, Eswatini, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Malawi and Botswana) due the new variant of the virus {Omicron variant} passengers will be 10 days quarantine in designated hotel the cost will be borne by passengers themselves.
- **Countries are categorized into 4 categories:**
- **1- Green Countries:** (Bahrain/ Indonesia / Kuwait/ Saudi Arabia /United Arab Emirates)
- **Passengers from Green countries:**

- Passengers should complete the Cyprus Flight Pass (<https://www.cyprusflightpass.gov.cy>) within 24 hours prior to their departure flight.
- 2- Orange Countries:** (Argentina / Australia/ Canada / Chile / China / Colombia / Greece / Hong Kong / Israel / Japan / Macao / Malta / Namibia / New Zealand / Qatar/ Rwanda / Uruguay).
- **Passengers from Orange countries:**
 - Passengers should complete the Cyprus Flight Pass (<https://www.cyprusflightpass.gov.cy>) within 24 hours prior to their departure flight.
 - **PCR/ QUARANTINE:**
 - **Passengers coming from orange countries are required to undergo a molecular test at a certified lab, with the sample taken during the last 72 hours prior to flight departure, and upload a certificate that demonstrates a negative PCR for COVID-19, on the Cyprus Flight Pass Platform.**
 - **Children below the age of 12 are exempted from testing. All travelers will also need to provide certain information and solemn declarations.**

- **PCR/ QUARANTINE:**
 - **Passengers coming from red countries are required to undergo a molecular test at a certified lab, with the sample taken during the last 72 hours prior to flight departure, and upload a certificate that demonstrates a negative PCR for COVID-19, on the Cyprus Flight Pass Platform.**
 - They will also need to pay for and undergo a molecular PCR test upon arrival to Cyprus.
 - **Only children below the age of 12 are exempted from testing.**
 - **The following persons will be allowed to enter the Republic of Cyprus having undergone a lab test at their own expense, upon entry to the Republic of Cyprus for Orange and Red Countries:**
 - Cypriot citizens and members of their families (foreign spouses and children)
 - Legal residents of the Republic.
 - Persons entitled to enter under the Vienna Convention, (**Diplomatic passports**)

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passengers entitled to enter to the Republic under the Vienna Convention These persons may choose to undergo only one lab test, namely upon their arrival to Cyprus, but must then remain in a status of obligatory self-isolation for three (3) days. 8	<u>NETHERLANDS</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Effective 22nd December 2021 (0:01 AM):</u>

- Passengers (**aged 12 or over**) travelling from outside the EU/Schengen area must always provide a negative test result to enter the Netherlands. (The test results must be from either a NAAT (PCR) test performed no more than 48 hours before departure OR an antigen test performed no more than 24 hours before departure).
- All passengers need to be able to show a completed quarantine declaration, even when they are exempt from the mandatory quarantine.
- Hard copy quarantine declarations need to be collected by the airline.
- Passengers without the correctly completed quarantine declaration shall be denied boarding.
- Passengers from **very high-risk** areas must always self-quarantine (for **10 days** even if they have proof of vaccination or proof of recovery. This quarantine period can be shortened if they get tested by the municipal health service (GGD) on day 5 of the quarantine and the result is negative).
- The above rules also apply to passengers with proof of vaccination or proof of recovery, who were previously exempt from the mandatory quarantine.
- Other exceptions to the mandatory quarantine and test requirements remain in effect
- If you are travelling by air you must fill in a health declaration (only when aged 12 or above) and carry it with you. Some airlines allow you to complete this health declaration digitally when you check in.
- Take a coronavirus test after arriving in the Netherlands. This applies even if you have been vaccinated. You can:
 - Get tested with a NAAT (PCR)-test directly after arrival (day 1) at the municipal health service (GGD) at Schiphol. Or you can take a self-test on day 1.
 - Get tested with a NAAT (PCR)-test on day 5 after your arrival at the GGD.
 - You can end your self-quarantining when your test on day 5 is negative.
- **The Red List Countries are:** (Afghanistan / Anguilla / Armenia / Barbados / Belize / Cayman Islands / Dominica / Georgia / Haiti / Jordan / Mauritius / Montenegro / Saint Kitts and Nevis / Saint Vincent and the Grenadines / Serbia / Singapore (until 16 December 2021, high-risk area from 16 December 202 onwards) / Somalia / Trinidad and Tobago / Ukraine (until 16 December 2021, high-risk area from 16 December 202 onwards) / United Kingdom / Venezuela).
- **Effective 08th August 2021**, the Dutch government announces that all ‘orange’ colour codes (do not travel unless imperative) will be removed for all countries within the EU, unless a worrisome new variant of the COVID-19 virus is found. Countries within the EU will be issued with a ‘yellow’ or ‘green’ advice instead.
- For arriving passengers, this results in the following:

- No more mandatory quarantine within the EU, unless a new worrisome COVID-19 is found.
- Proof of negative test result, recovery or vaccination is mandatory for travelling from countries with a ‘yellow’ colour code within the EU.
- Proof of negative test result or vaccination is mandatory for travelling from safe areas outside the EU.
- Urgent advice to passengers travelling with a negative test result to have themselves tested on day 2 and day 5 after arrival. This is not warranted for vaccinated or recovered passengers.
- **Time period for validity of negative PCR-test will be 48 hours, time period for rapid-antigen test will be 24 hours, before departure.**

Effective from 23rd December, 00:01 o’ clock local time in the Netherlands;

- All passenger flights departing from South-Africa, all countries within South-America (Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, French-Guyana, Guyana, Paraguay, Peru, Surinam, Uruguay and Venezuela), Dominican Republic and panama with destination Netherlands are prohibited to enter the Netherlands. This flight ban is in effect until April 1 2021, 00:01 hours Dutch local time. Any possible change of this period shall be assessed depending on further developments.
- Notice: as of march 9 2021, 00:01 hours Dutch local time, there is no longer a flight ban in effect for the United Kingdom.
- Effective from 15th May 2021, the Dutch government has issued an update on COVID-19 flight and traveller restrictions. Flight bans for the following countries have been extended until June 1st 2021 0:01 LT (**India / South-Africa**) All countries within South-America (Argentina / Bolivia / Brazil / Chile / Colombia / Ecuador / French-Guyana / Guyana / Paraguay / Peru / Surinam / Uruguay / Venezuela).
- Exception: <https://www.government.nl/topics/coronavirus-covid-19/visiting-the-netherlands-from-abroad/dutch-flight-ban-and-docking-ban>
- Safe countries outside the EU/Schengen area (Australia / New Zealand / Rwanda / Singapore / South Korea / Thailand / China (mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau)). Only if China lifts entry restrictions on European travelers. Travelers from China are not required to present a negative COVID-19 test declaration.
- Israel (as of 15 May 2021).
- **Restrictions for passenger flights will be continued**
- All non-Schengen nationals and non-EU nationals are prohibited to enter the Netherlands by order of the ministry of justice and security.
- **Exempted** from the travel restriction are residents from (Australia, New Zealand, Rwanda, Singapore, South-Korea and Thailand).

- **The following categories of travelers from non-Schengen/non EU/non UK countries not listed above are exempted specific categories of travelers with an essential function or need:**
- healthcare professionals, health researchers, and elderly care Professionals,
- Frontier workers,
- Transport personnel,
- Diplomats, staff of international organizations and people invited by international organizations whose physical presence is required for the well-functioning of these organizations, military personnel and humanitarian aid workers and civil protection personnel in the exercise of their functions,
- Passengers in transit,
- Passengers travelling for imperative family reasons,
- seafarers,
- Persons in need of international protection or for other humanitarian reasons.
- Persons on board of a state flight
- Persons in the interest Dutch economy and society , elite athletes and their support staff
- Personal in the cultural and creative sectors, journalist and researchers
- Partners in a long-distance relationship under certain conditions, for more information

- Be aware current situation health declaration: for all passengers aged 13 years or older travelling to and from the Netherlands a health declaration is mandatory before boarding.
- Passenger locator data: the local health authorities may request operators to provide passenger locator data in a very short time (including seat number) for contact tracing. Operators should therefore keep this information for at least 2 weeks after each flight. A passenger locator form drafted in accordance with international standards can be used for this purpose.

- **Netherlands has decided to allow some categories to enter the Netherlands; some of these categories are holding type D visa (long stay visa) and some categories are holding type C visa (short stay visa).**

Hereunder the list of categories which are allowed to enter the Netherlands for the time being: EU citizens, including UK nationals and members of their families* can travel freely (no specific reasons have to be documented).

Non-EU citizens covered by the under mentioned exceptions should travel well documented:

- Nationals and inhabitants of Norway, Iceland, Switzerland , Monaco, Andorra, San Marino en Vatican city, and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland. [Check whether they need a visa.](#)
- Third-country nationals holding a residence card or a residence permit in accordance with Directive 2003/109/EC (the LTR Directive) and their family if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland [First check whether they need a visa.](#)
- Third-country nationals who derive their right of residence from other European Directives or from the national law of a Member State and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland. [Check whether they need a visa.](#)
- Holders of a long-stay visa [authorization for temporary stay or 'MVV'](#)
- Holders of a valid residence permit and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland.
- Other third country nationals who have a vital function or need, including:
 - Healthcare personnel; doctors, nurses or researchers;
 - Border workers;
 - Seasonal workers;
 - Persons employed in the transport of goods and other transport personnel, where necessary, including container ships, bulk carriers (e.g. ore or coal), tankers (fuels and chemicals), fisheries, persons employed in the energy sector i.e. oil and gas platforms and wind farms as well as offshore companies providing services to this sector, and flight crew;
 - You are a cross-border commuter.
 - Seafarers in possession of a seaman's book, with the exception of seafarers on commercial and pleasure yachts;
 - Diplomats, or service passport holder in the performance of their duties;
 - Armed forces personnel, in the performance of their duties;
 - Personnel of international and humanitarian organizations;
 - Persons who have imperative reasons to visit their families; these are journeys in exceptional cases.

PCR:

Effective 6th September 2021, Passengers travelling to the Netherlands from very high risk areas must be able to show a negative (PCR) test result, in addition to proof of vaccination or recovery (72 hours after September 4th 2021).

Effective from June 1st 2021, the mandatory antigen test is NO longer needed, **EXCEPT** for passengers arriving from destinations designated as high risk areas or areas with COVID-19 virus variants.

- All travelers on flights to the Netherlands from a high-risk country outside the EU or Schengen area and to which the flight ban does not apply and/or who are exempted from the EU-entry ban, are required to meet the following conditions:
 1. a valid negative NAAT-test (either MPOCT, NAAT, PCR, RT PCR, LAMP or TMA), no older **than 48 hours** before expected arrival in the Netherlands,
 2. A valid negative NAAT-test declaration (only for travelers from outside the EU/Schengen area),
 3. A health declaration for all passengers aged 12 years or older travelling to and from the Netherlands.
- Before boarding, airlines shall verify if passengers meet these conditions. If passengers fail to meet these conditions, they shall be refused on the flight and boarding the aircraft.
- The following categories of travelers are exempted from being in possession of:
 - 1) A valid negative NAAT-TEST **no older than 48 hours** before expected arrival in the Netherlands,
 - 2) A valid negative NAAT-test declaration (only for travelers from outside the EU/Schengen area),
 - 3) A negative antigen rapid test, no older than 24 hours before boarding the aircraft heading to the Netherlands.

Exceptions:

- Passengers under the age of 12 years,
- Persons who are travelling on behalf of the minister or state secretary of justice and security. this applies in particular to flights where kmar personnel are accompany a person to or from the Netherlands.
- Travelers with a statement from the ministry of health, welfare and sport in the context of urgent medical transport.
- Travelers who have been tested positive for covid-19 previously, who no longer have covid-19-associated symptoms, are no longer contagious, who continue to test positive for a longer period of time and therefore cannot show a negative covid-19 test result. the following applies to these travelers:

- a. travelers who have been infected with covid-19 and are therefore unable to submit a negative NAAT test result may still travel if they can show the following documents:
 - i. positive NAAT-test result from a minimum of 2 to a maximum of 8 weeks old;
 - ii. positive NAAT-test result of maximum 72 hours old upon arrival in the Netherlands;
 - iii. Negative rapid test result of maximum 24 hours old before boarding.
- b. in case of a permanently positive rapid test result, travelling to the Netherlands is allowed if they can show the following documents:
 - i. positive NAAT-test result from a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 8 weeks old;
 - ii. positive NAAT-test result test result of **maximum 48** hours old upon arrival in the Netherlands;
 - iii. Signed doctor's statement of a maximum of **48 hours before** boarding that shows that this traveler is no longer covid-19 contagious.

- Cross-border commuters (including students and school children),
- (Incoming) staff of diplomatic and consular representations or international organizations in the Netherlands - including the members of their official household - and as such (to be) registered with the ministry of foreign affairs,
- Holders of non-Dutch diplomatic passports,
- Holders of Dutch diplomatic passports, if they are travelling in the exercise of their work or whose physical presence is required for work,
- heads of state and members of foreign governments,
- passengers on a direct flight from a non-risk country (who have resided there 10 days previous to the trip) to the Netherlands,
- Passengers on flights from a non-risk country (who have resided there 10 days previous to the trip) which do have a Dutch airport as their destination, who are transferring in a high-risk country and who do not leave the airport during transfer are exempted.
- A. passengers who do leave the airport during transfer, are not exempt from both the NAAT-test as well as the rapid antigen test. The rapid antigen test should at least be taken at the point of departure airport.
- passengers on flights which do not have a Dutch airport as their destination, but are diverted to a Dutch airport due to unforeseen circumstances,
- passengers with a NATO travel order or a nato-2 visum,
- aircrew (crew members or personnel operating passenger or cargo flights or travelling as passengers to or from their departure base), who do not leave the aircraft position (except for safety inspections) during turnaround and continue flying (back) immediately afterwards,

- Individuals who work on oil and gas platforms, offshore wind farms and offshore companies that provide services to the energy sector. This only includes passengers who are flying directly to the Netherlands from an (offshore) platform/wind farm.

Proof of vaccination

- Proof of vaccination is accepted only if it:
- has been issued following vaccination with a vaccine that has been approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) or is on the Emergency Use Listing of the World Health Organization (WHO);
- has been issued based on full vaccination. That means that:
- the vaccination schedule consists of a single dose and this single dose has been administered (Janssen); or
- the vaccination schedule consists of two doses and:
- both doses have been administered, or
- one dose has been administered and it has been confirmed that the person vaccinated had previously been infected with the virus SARS-CoV-2
- has been issued in one of the following languages: (Dutch / English / French / German / Italian / Portuguese / Spanish), includes the following:
- Information identifying the person who has been vaccinated.
- Information demonstrating that the person in question has been fully vaccinated against the virus SARS-CoV-2.
- The name of the vaccine and the name of the manufacturer or marketing authorisation holder of each dose of the vaccine administered.
- The date on which each dose of the vaccine was administered.
- The name of the country in which the vaccine was administered.
- The name of the issuer of the proof of vaccination.
- A signature or stamp of authenticity placed by the issuer.
- Approved vaccines; The following vaccines have been approved by the EMA/WHO: (Pfizer/BioNTech / Astra Zeneca EU / Johnson & Johnson / Moderna / Astra Zeneca-SK Bio / Serum Institute of India (Covishield) / Sinopharm / Sinovac).
- Effective 10th July 2021, the Dutch government will implement a two weeks waiting time that passengers need to abide by before they are eligible to travel using the Digital COVID-19 certificate. Vaccination is presumed to protect after a period of two weeks, hence the waiting period.

THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES OF TRAVELLERS ARE ONLY EXEMPTED FROM BEING IN POSSESSION OF:

- 1) a valid negative NAAT-test (either MPOCT, NAAT, PCR, RT PCR, lamp or TMA), no older than 72 hours before expected arrival in the Netherlands,
 - 2) a valid negative NAAT-test declaration (only for travelers from outside the EU/Schengen area),
- Seafarers (including cruise ship and ferry crew members), that possess a seamen record book if they are travelling in the exercise of their work or whose physical presence is required for work. The exemption does not apply to seafarers on commercial yachts and pleasure craft.
 - Individuals who work in the goods transport sector, and other essential transport personnel, including lorry drivers and crew members on container ships, bulk carriers (e.g. ore and coal), tankers (fuel and chemicals), fishing vessels and individuals who work in the energy sector if they are travelling in the performance of their duties or if they travel to or from their work.

Test report should include Date and time of test: must be maximum 72 hours before arrival in the Netherlands

Health declaration

The Health Declaration form also remains mandatory for all passengers arriving, departing and transiting in The Netherlands, in addition to the covid-19 test declaration.

QUARANTINE:

- **Effective 1st June 2021**, passengers will be quarantined for 5 days if they are traveling to the Netherlands after staying in certain countries. This requirement also applies even if you have been vaccinated.
- After 5 days, upon booking a test appointment and if a NAAT-test shows a negative result, the quarantine ends. Passengers can find all relevant information on the mandatory quarantine in both Dutch and English via the following links:

 - i. humanitarian forces,
 - ii. people who come for work purposes,
 - iii. an accompanying person during entry for medical reasons,
 - iv. persons who enter the country for the purpose of performing a mandatory court or official duty, such as summoning to court hearings,
 - v. Strangers, if they have a photo ID according to § 95 of the Aliens Police Act 2005, Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005.

If the medical certificate cannot be presented, a ten-day quarantine must be commenced immediately.
If a molecular biological test / antigen test carried out during this time for SARS-CoV-2 is negative, the quarantine is deemed to have ended.

- **Entry from other states and areas**

- a. passengers arriving from one of the following countries AND who have only been to these countries or in Austria within the last 10 days are free to enter Austria (no molecular-biological / Antigen-Test of SARS-CoV-2-test, no quarantine): Australia, Finland, Greece, Iceland, Japan, New Zealand, Norway, Republic Korea, Singapore, Vatican
- b. exceptions apply to the following people, who have to enter a 10-day quarantine, which is considered to have ended if a molecular biological test / antigen test for SARS-CoV-2 is carried out at the earliest on the fifth day after entry and the test result is negative:
 - i. Austrian citizens, EU / EEA citizens and people who live with them in the same household,
 - ii. Swiss citizens and citizens of the United Kingdom as well as persons who live with them in the same household,

- iii. people with residence or habitual abode in EU / EEA countries or Andorra, Monaco, San Marino, the Vatican, Switzerland or the United Kingdom and people who live with them in the same household,
- iv. entry in connection with other important events that can be planned in the family circle such as weddings, baptisms, birthday parties or the non-regular visit of the partner,
- v. foreigners, if they have a visa D issued by Austria or a photo ID according to § 95 of the Aliens Police Act 2005, Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005, vi. persons who are entitled to stay in Austria on the basis of a residence permit, a residence title or documentation of the right of residence in accordance with the Settlement and Residence Act, Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005, or the Asylum Act 2005, Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005 are, vii. members of the staff of diplomatic missions or consular posts and persons who live with them in the same household,
- viii. employees of international organizations and people who live with them in the same household,
- ix. humanitarian forces,

- x. persons who are employed by a domestic regional authority or a domestic corporation under public law and whose place of employment is abroad or whose service is performed abroad, insofar as the activity of this corporation abroad is in the interests of the Republic of Austria,
 - xi. people who come for work purposes,
 - xii. an accompanying person during entry for medical reasons, xiii. people who travel to the country to begin or continue studying or doing research,
 - xiv. people who come to attend school, or
 - xv. people who enter the country for the purpose of performing a mandatory judicial or official obligation, such as summoning to court hearings
- c. exceptions apply to the following persons, although they must present a medical certificate¹ that is not older than 72 hours and confirms that a molecular biological test / antigen test is negative for SARS-CoV-2:
- i. humanitarian forces,
 - ii. people who come for work purposes,
 - iii. an accompanying person during entry for medical reasons,

- iv. persons who enter the country for the purpose of performing a mandatory court or official duty, such as summoning to court hearings,
- v. strangers, if they have a photo ID according to § 95 of the Aliens Police Act 2005, Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005. If the medical certificate cannot be presented, a ten-day quarantine must be commenced immediately. If a molecular biological test / antigen test carried out during this time for SARS-CoV-2 is negative, the quarantine is deemed to have ended

- **Entry for medical reasons**

- a. The entry of:

- i. Austrian citizens,

- ii. persons who are subject to compulsory health insurance in Austria, or

- iii. persons who have been granted a treatment agreement by an Austrian hospital for medical reasons that are particularly worthy of consideration,

is permitted without restriction if it takes place in Austria for the use of absolutely necessary medical services. Upon entry, a confirmation of the absolute necessity of using a medical service³ must be presented.

- b. People with their place of residence or habitual abode in Austria are allowed to re-enter the country without restrictions after having used essential medical services. Upon re-entry, a confirmation of the absolute necessity of using a medical service³ must be presented.

- **General exemptions,**

regardless of where these people come from, apply to (persons neither need molecular-biological test / Antigen-Test of SARS-CoV-2 nor have to start a quarantine):

- a. to maintain goods and passenger traffic (crews),

- b. exclusively for compelling reasons of animal care or for agricultural and forestry measures in individual cases,

- c. in the context of the implementation of a professional transfer trip / a professional transfer flight,

- d. in the imperative interest of the Republic of Austria,

- e. transit passengers or the transit through Austria without a stopover, which is also the case with only essential interruptions,

- f. entry or re-entry as part of the regular commuter traffic for professional purposes, unless they are carers,

- g. entry or re-entry as part of regular commuter traffic to participate in school and study operations,

- h. entry or re-entry as part of regular commuter traffic for family purposes or to visit a partner,

- i. the crew of a repatriation trip / a repatriation flight including the accompanying organs of the public security service,
- j. for unforeseeable, urgent reasons that are particularly worthy of consideration in the family circle in individual cases (e.g. serious illnesses, deaths, funerals, births and the care of people in need of support in emergencies)
- exemptions do not release passenger/crew from foreign immigration entry regulations (visa, ...)
- **Entry from (Angola, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe) of persons who have been in one of these states or areas within the last 10 days is prohibited:**
 - **Passengers entering Austria and who can prove that they have not been in any of the countries or areas mentioned above in the last 10 days can travel freely to Austria with a proof of vaccination or a proof of recovery AND a negative test result. b. If there is no negative test result, registration must be carried out and quarantine must be commenced immediately. The quarantine is considered ended as soon as a negative test result is received. The costs for the test are to be borne by yourself. The negative test result must be presented at a control.**

QUARANTINE/ PCR:

- Negative PCR test certificate is required not more 72h (PCR / LAMP / TMA) or not more than 48h (Antigen test)
- Passengers arriving to Austria must stay for 10-days home or self-paid quarantine that can be ended if a negative SARS-CoV-2 test is carried out at the earliest on the fifth day after entry and the test result is negative, even if they present medical certificate with negative result (which is not mandatory).
- **Children under the age of 6 are exempted from any obligation to take a molecular biological SARS-CoV-2 test.**
- Medical or official recovery certificates must confirm an infection that has been overcome in the last six months or proof of neutralizing antibodies that must not be older than three months
- **Vaccination certificates must meet the following requirements:**
 - 1- second vaccination, whereby this must not be more than 270 days ago and at least 14 days must have elapsed between this and the first vaccination, or
 - 2- 21 days have passed since vaccination in the case of vaccines for which only one vaccination is planned, whereby this must not be more than 270 days ago, or
 - 3- vaccination, provided that at least 21 days before the vaccination, a disease of COVID-19 was confirmed by means of a positive PCR-/LAMP-/TMA-test for SARS-CoV-2 or proof of neutralizing antibodies, whereby the vaccination must not be more than 270 days ago, or

		<p>4- Further vaccination, whereby this must not be more than 270 days ago and between this and a vaccination in terms of points i. and iii. at least 120 days or a vaccination in terms of point ii. at least 14 days must have passed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Austrian citizens, EU / EEA citizens and people with their place of residence or habitual abode in an EU / EEA country who do not have a vaccination or recovery certificate must register and immediately start a ten-day quarantine. PCR:

- **Effective from Saturday, 4th December:** All arrivals into Switzerland (vaccinated or have recovered from the disease). In addition to taking a PCR test before travelling, required to take a second test (PCR test or rapid antigen test) must be carried out between the fourth and seventh day after arrival. Test costs must be borne by the traveler.
- **Effective from 8th February 2021,** All Passengers travelling to Switzerland (either from a country with a high risk of infection or low risk infection) must be able to show a negative PCR test result **that is no more than 72 hours old.**
 - **Effective 20th December 2021:**
 - **Rapid antigen** tests are accepted and must be performed no more than **24 hours** prior to boarding.

- Professional travels of transport personnel, freight and cargo personnel and seafarer workers, provided they have a certificate issued by the employer;
- The travel of diplomats, staff of international organizations and people who are invited by international organizations and whose physical presence is required for the well-functioning of these organizations, in the exercise of their function, provided of an essential travel certificate issued by the diplomatic mission or the Belgian consular post.
- The travels of a spouse/partner or child of a person who has the Belgian nationality or has his main residence in Belgium, provided they live under the same roof
 - Spouse/partner or child must be in possession of an “Essential Travel Certificate – issued by the Belgian embassy/consulate
 - The de facto partner must have provided plausible evidence of a stable and long term relationship
- People who travel through Belgium to the country of the European Union or Schengen zone of which they are a national or where they have their main residence

- People travelling outside the Schengen zone and the European Union (transit via a high-risk country without leaving the international zone of the airport or transit in Belgium from a high risk country without leaving the airport's extra-Schengen zone)
- persons travelling for compelling humanitarian reasons
 - Persons must be in possession of a “Certificate of compelling humanitarian reasons – issued by the Belgian embassy/consulate – approved by the Aliens Office”.
- **EPLF** is mandatory for travel to Belgium residents & all non-residents in Belgium (paper version is no longer valid).
- 3. Remarque “Color code of a zone):
 - The color code of a zone can always change during your travel <https://www.info-coronavirus.be/en/colour-codes-by-country/>
- Effective 21st December 2020, the passenger is obligated to carry the proof of submission of the completed **Electronic** Passenger Locator Form (E-PLF) during the entire journey to the final destination in Belgium and the 48 hours following arrival into BRU. If it is impossible to obtain this particular proof, the traveler must carry a copy of the completed the Electronic Passenger Locator Form (E-PLF) during the entire journey to the final destination in Belgium and the following 48 hours.
- All Passengers are obliged to (complete / Sign) The **Electronic** Passenger Locator form (EPLF) before departure via <https://travel.info-coronavirus.be/>, (**PAPER VERSION IS NOT ALLOWED**)
- Passenger will be denied boarding in case of not completing The Public Health Locator form.
- The new E-PLF form is applicable. It can be found via <https://smex-ctp.trendmicro.com:443/wis/clicktime/v1/query?url=https%3a%2f%2ftravel.info%2dcoronavirus.be%2fpublic%2dhealth%2dpassenger%2dlocator%2dform&umid=11de0703-4710-4106-b97e-5a5249c273fb&auth=e0ea8d76fb0a69b0ed7fc71e0a03902ca1384677-fe22359fe05208cdf191e5813e5574f389bbe781>
- Every passenger, regardless of the nationality, who takes an Extra-Schengen flight to Belgium is obliged to complete this form before departure. The passenger must sign and date the “Public Health Passenger Locator Form”.
- If a passenger did not complete the "Public Health Passenger Locator Form" and boarded the plane, the Belgian authorities can **refuse** the access on the Belgian territory.
- **Travelling with a visa type C is allowed**
If a passenger is in possession of a visa type C – issued after 18 March 2020 by the Belgian embassy - the passenger can travel to Belgium. I remind you that a passenger can still be refused to enter the

territory, if he/she doesn't fulfill the entry conditions according to Article 3 of the law of 15 December 1980 on access to the territory, the sojourn, the establishment and the removal of foreigners.

- Passengers holding E-Visa will be refused entry, and therefore airline should deny boarding them
- If a passenger is not in possession of a valid travel document (expired passport, expired identity card, expired visa, expired residence permit ...), the airline is requested to deny boarding.
- Passengers will be fined (up to 250EUR) if they arrive at Brussels Airport without QR-code (e-PLF) or filled in paper PLF form (back-up). The Local Police Inspectors will perform active checks to ensure that passengers comply with the new regulation.
- It is prohibited for persons who have been on the territory of (Brazil, India or South Africa at any time in the past 14 days to travel directly or indirectly to the Belgian territory, insofar as they do not have Belgian nationality or do not have their main residence in Belgium, with the exception of the following authorized essential trips:
 - o professional travels of transport personnel, freight and cargo personnel and seafarer workers, provided they have a certificate issued by the employer;
 - o the travel of diplomats, staff of international organizations and people who are invited by international organizations and whose physical presence is required for the well-functioning of these organizations, in the exercise of their function, provided of an essential travel certificate issued by the diplomatic mission or the Belgian consular post.
- Effective from 8/10/2021, **Safe countries** (residents) are (Argentina / Australia / Bahrain / Canada / Chile / Colombia / Hong Kong / Indonesia / Kuwait / Macao / New-Zealand / Qatar / Peru / Rwanda / Saudi-Arabia / South Korea / Taiwan / Uruguay/ United Arab emirates)
 - The residents of these countries can therefore travel for (non) essential travels to Belgium.
- **PCR:**
- All non-residents in Belgium, from the age of **12 years**, arriving on Belgian territory, coming from a **red zone** must have a negative PCR-test result **72 hours prior to departure**. Or a negative RAT-test (Rapid Antigen Test 36 hours before arrival on Belgian territory), **even** if they are in possession of a **certificate of vaccination**.
- All persons, coming from **a green or orange zone**, no testing nor quarantine is needed
- (countries color zones can be found via: <https://www.info-coronavirus.be/en/colour-codes-by-country/>)
- The document can be in paper format or in electronic format but must be consultable immediately.
- The document must be in English, German, French or Dutch.
- As a passenger passes the Belgian border control, he needs to have a negative PCR test.

- Any passenger from the age of 12 years old to Belgium from a country outside the European Union that is not included in ("Whitelist") must submit a negative test result since December 4th . This applies even to vaccinated persons. Persons who have their main residence in Belgium are exempt from this measure.
 - The test certificate is a digital EU-COVID certificate or another certificate in Dutch, French, German or English, which indicates:
 - either that a NAAT test (Nucleic Acid Amplification Test, PCR test) with negative result was performed in an official laboratory not more than 72 hours before arrival on Belgian territory,
 - or that a RAT test (Rapid Antigen Test) with negative result was carried out not more than 36 hours before arrival on Belgian territory by a professional.
 - The countries ("Whitelist") are listed at Kleurcodes per land | Coronavirus COVID-19 (info-coronavirus.be). For those traveling from these countries, a negative test result prior to travel is not required.
 - Travelers who only transit by air and who remain exclusively in the transit zone without entering Belgian territory as far as the travelers are not required to have a negative PCR test result to continue their journey.
- “Certificate of vaccination”:**
- “European certificate of vaccination”: A person who is in possession of a valid digital corona certificate can travel freely within the Member States of the European Union. However, some countries may impose additional conditions.
 - “Certificate of vaccination third country”: a person must be fully vaccinated (+2 weeks) with a vaccine recognized by Europe At this moment, there is no “Certificate of vaccination – issued by a third country – approved by Europe
 - Persons who are travelling to Belgium must be vaccinated with a vaccine recognized by Belgium/EU.
 - Vaccination certificates – recognized by Belgium are from (Albania / Andorra / El Salvador / Faroe Islands / Georgia / Israel / Moldova / Monaco / Morocco / New Zealand / North Macedonia / Panama / Serbia / Singapore / Togo / Turkey / Ukraine / United Kingdom (England, Northern Ireland, Wales)).
 - No other certificate of vaccination (from above-mentioned countries) is accepted anymore, only a certificate of vaccination with a QR code is accepted.
 - (RT.LAMP / RAPID ANTIGENIC TESTS / SEROLOGICAL TESTS) ARE **NOT** ACCEPTED
 - From/to red zone, the digital EU Covid certificate can be used without further measures as testing or quarantine.

QUARANTINE: Passengers could be subjected to self-isolation for 14 days.

- Before traveling to the Czech Republic, passengers from these countries must notify their arrival to the regional hygienic station competent according to the place of residence, by filling in the arrival form, and submit a confirmation of its completion to the border control upon request.
- Before starting a trip to the Czech Republic by public transport (especially by plane), passengers must have a written confirmation from the health service provider or an appropriate certificate of negative the result of the RT-PCR test (max. 72 hours from collection) from an accredited laboratory. Carriers will not allow transport by passengers who do not submit the test / test certificate and arrival form.
- After entering the territory of the Czech Republic, first undergo an RT-PCR test on day 5, but no later than day 7, to determine the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus, unless the public health authority has exceptionally decided otherwise.

Exceptions for:

I) Vaccinated persons:

- 1) persons who prove themselves by a national certificate of vaccination against COVID-19 issued in accordance with the EU Regulation on the EU digital certificate COVID, provided that vaccination has elapsed at least 14 days after completion of the vaccination schedule and who do not show any symptoms of COVID-19.
- 2) a national certificate of completed vaccination, ie a written certificate issued at least in English by an authorized body operating in a third country, or a certificate of completed vaccination issued by an authorized body operating in a third country for which an implementing act has been adopted under the EU Digital Certificate Regulation that the person has been vaccinated with an EMA registered medicinal product or a WHO approved medicinal product for emergency use (the list of products is published on the website) The written confirmation must contain the relevant data and it must be possible to verify by remote access directly from the written confirmation.

Vaccinated persons according to the above definition have an exception from the tests, the obligation of the arrival form remains!

II) *Persons with a history of Covid-19 disease, ie a person in whom at least 11 days, but not more than 180 days, has elapsed since the first positive result of the RT-PCR test for the presence of SARSCoV-2 virus, which is demonstrated:

a) the COVID-19 disease certificate issued in accordance with the EU regulation on the digital COVID certificate remains the obligation to fill in the arrival form.

b) Pax with a diplomatic note attesting to the isolated isolation due to the Covid -19 disease in the country of departure, with the obligation to fill in an arrival form.

III) Children under the age of 12 do not need to complete an arrival form or undergo an RT-PCR test to determine the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus.

OTHER EXCEPTIONS FROM TESTS AND ARRIVAL FORM FOR:

- persons who are authorized to enter the territory of the Czech Republic; who transit within 12 hours via the Czech Republic by land.

- Before entering the Czech Republic by public transport (especially by plane, train, bus), passengers must have a written confirmation from the health service provider about a negative result of the RT-PCR test (max. 72 hours from collection). In the case of citizens of the Czech Republic and their accompanying family members with a temporary residence permit issued in the Czech Republic, European Union citizens with a issued certificate of temporary residence in the Czech Republic, or foreigners with a permanent residence permit in the Czech Republic issued by the Czech Republic before entering the territory of the Czech Republic by public transport may also have a negative result of the antigen test (max. 48 hours from collection). PCR AND IGM Anti-body Test:

- Airlines must check the 'HS' green code or the Health declaration, China Custom health code AND the government code form at the check-in counter and the transfer counter for the passengers. Please make sure the code must be shown on the APP and not a picture. If the customs in HGH found any passenger arrived without any of these code, airlines will take all the responsible for it.
- **For transit passengers via CAI airport Green Health Code from Chinese Embassy in point of departure is mandatory.**
- The Government announced that in view of the latest global developments of the COVID-19 pandemic situation, (Egypt, Morocco, New Zealand and Qatar) will be specified as Group A specified places from 0.00am on December 21 to tighten the boarding and quarantine requirements for relevant inbound passengers.

QUARANTINE

- **Effective from 2 Mar 2021,**
 - **For Chinese company staff**

All passengers travel from Egypt to China must have a 14 days quarantined at home before check-in the appointed quarantine hotel in Egypt. Additionally, all passengers must get a 14 days quarantine certification letter from a local Chinese enterprise, Academic Union, Overseas Chinese Federation, or an Employment enterprises, etc. The quarantine certification must include the name, quarantine period, quarantine place and all other information inquired from the Chinese Embassy in Egypt. All these documents will submit to the embassy while apply for the HS/HDC code in Egypt. The Chinese embassy will confirm all this information before issuing the code. (**That is in addition to 5 days Hotel Quarantine in Egypt before travel**)
 - **For individual**

Needs 5 days Hotel Quarantine by Egyptair Karnak before travel.
 - All transit passengers must contact the Chinese Embassy in the point of origin for Green Code from
Point of original or will be refused from traveling in Point of original if do not have Green Code.
 - 14 days quarantine is mandatory for all kinds of passengers in designated hotels by the Chinese authorities on passenger expense when arriving China.

 - The airport quarantine will check your smartphone when you arrive in Japan. If you do not own a smartphone or if you own a smartphone that does not allow the installation of apps, please rent a smartphone at the airport at your expense upon arriving in Japan.
 - All passengers must submit a copy of this “Written Pledge” to the airport quarantine office when entering Japan
 - Passengers who stayed in (the UK, South Africa, Ireland, Israel, Brazil, United Arab Emirates, Italy, Austria, Netherlands, Switzerland, Sweden, Slovakia, Denmark, Germany, Nigeria, France, Belgium) within the last 14 days, must submit an inspection negative certificate of pre-entry test issued within 72 hours prior to departure.
 - Passengers will be tested for Covid-19 at the airport and will be quarantined in the accommodation of the government. • On the third day after entry to the accommodation, passenger will be tested again. If the result is negative, the passenger will leave the accommodation. After leaving the accommodation, passenger must remain at home, etc. for 14 days after entering Japan.
 - All passengers from designated countries / regions with “Corona Virus Variant confirmed for the first time in INDIA” are requested for the time being to stay at facilities designated by the Quarantine station. In addition, those who obtain a negative result of Covid -19 test conducted after three days of entry into Japan, may leave the facilities but still required to stay for the remaining period of 14 days after the entry into Japan at a location designated by the quarantine station.

Thailand Pass will only accept new applicants seeking to enter Thailand under Alternative Quarantine (AQ) or Phuket Sandbox only.</u> <u>Passengers who will arrive in Thailand under Test and Go and Sandbox Programme must undergo their 2nd COVID-19 test using the RT-PCR technique (not ATK self-test) at government-designated facilities (no additional cost).</u> <p><u>Effective 01st October 2021 (1700 UTC):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visa on Arrival (VOA) is no longer suspended from 1 October 2021 onwards. Passengers on visa exemption scheme are permitted to stay in Thailand for 30 days. Cambodia and Myanmar passport holders can enter Thailand without visa and permitted to stay in Thailand for 14 days.

- All passengers willing to enter Thailand need to present (individual) COE and other required documents to Thai authorities upon arrival. If they failed to present the required documents, their entry would be denied.
- **Thailand's entry measures for Thais and non-Thais effective from 1 November 2021 (as of 31 October 2021) as follows:**
 1. Exemption from Quarantine (EQ) or Test and Go
 - On 30 October 2021, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs announces updated list of countries and territories that eligible to enter Thailand on this scheme. The announcement is attached herewith for your information.
 - 17 additional eligible countries/territories for EQ are Croatia, India, Indonesia, Kuwait, Laos, Luxembourg, Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Oman, Philippines, Romania, Slovakia, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, and Vietnam (Currently, there are 63 eligible countries/territories).
 2. Sandbox Program
 - Unvaccinated Children under 18 year-old will be eligible to enter Sandbox Program if they travel with fully vaccinated parents or guardians.
 - The second test during the stay in Sandbox Program has changed to ATK test on day 6th - 7th.
 3. Insurance
 - Thai nationals are not required to have medical insurance to enter Thailand.
 - Non-Thais must obtain Insurance with minimum coverage of 50,000 USD during the period of stay in Thailand. Expats living and working in Thailand can provide a valid social security card or certified letter from their employer as equivalent document. This also apply to travellers who will travel to Thailand for international transit/transfer.
 4. COVID-19 RT-PCR Test issued within 72 hours before departure
 - All travellers entering Thailand, regardless of age and nationality must present the RT-PCR test result.
 - This doesn't apply to Thai nationals entering Thailand on AQ scheme.
 5. Thailand Pass QR code
 - Travellers obtain either COE or Thailand Pass QR code are eligible to enter Thailand.
 - The sample of Thailand Pass QR code is attached herewith for your information. You can scan the QR code by using your mobile phone to see the validity of the QR code.

According to the latest notification of the civil aviation authority of Thailand, permit for passenger aircraft will be given for flying over, flying into or out of, and taking off or landing at an international airport in Thailand only if the passengers or persons on board are one of the following categories:

- Thai nationals
- Persons with exemption or persons being considered, permitted or invited by the Prime Minister, or the head of responsible persons accountable for resolving state of emergency issues to enter the Kingdom, pertaining to necessity. Such consideration, permission or invitation may be subject to specified conditions and time limits.
- Persons on diplomatic or consular missions or under International organizations, or representatives of foreign government performing their duties in the Kingdom, or persons of other international agencies as permitted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs pertaining to necessity, including their spouse, parents, or children.
- Carriers of necessary goods, subject to immediate return after completion.
- Non-Thai nationals who are a spouse, parents, or children of a Thai national.
- Non-Thai nationals who hold a valid certificate of permanent residency in the Kingdom, or permission to take up residence in the Kingdom
- Non-Thai nationals who have work permit or have been granted permission from government agencies to work in the Kingdom, including their spouse or children.
- Non-Thai nationals who are students of educational institutions approved by Thai authorities, including the parents or guardians of the students, except for students of non-formal educational institutions under the law on Private schools and of other similar private educational institutions
- Non-Thai nationals who are in need of medical treatment in Thailand, and their attendants. However, this shall not include medical treatment for COVID-19
- Non-Thai nationals who are permitted to enter the Kingdom under a special arrangement with a foreign country or have been granted permission by the Prime Minister.

- Student entering Thailand with the purpose of short-term studying, training, or doing internship with government agencies, state enterprises, or educational establishments in Thailand approved by Thai authorities / attending religious activities organized by domestic private organization (Non-Immigrant ED Visa Holder)
 - Former Thai Citizen (Non-Immigrant O Holder)
 - Person entering Thailand with the purpose of Court Appearance (Non-Immigrant O Holder)
 - Transit Passengers (Non-Immigrant TS Holder)
 - Person entering Thailand with the purpose of participate in sport activities/Tournaments (Non-Immigrant S Holder)
- To enter the Kingdom, the persons above shall comply with Disease Prevention Measures for the Persons Entering the Kingdom to Prevent the Spread of the COVID-19 Disease Annexed to the Order of the Centre for the Administration of the Situation due to the Outbreak of the Communicable Disease Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) No. 7/2563 Issued on 30 June B.E. 2563 (2020).
 - Airlines are responsible to check that the passengers must full fill documentation requirements, such as certification of entry, COVID-19 free certificated with PCR test insurance policy covering expense on quarantine or medical care in Thailand without the proper documents the boarding must be denied.
 - Passengers or remissible persons will also be subject to disease control measures applicable at the airport of arrival which may be varied according to the seriousness of the situation
 - The immigration officers have the power to deny the entry of non –Thai nationals who have been tested positive for COVID-19 or under the suspicion of being infected or who refused to undergo such a test.
 - On 26 November 2021, the world health organization (who) announced new variant of concern (VOC) of Sars cov-2 or omicron among African countries including (Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe).
 - The department of disease control ordered the passengers departing from 8 countries mentioned above and arriving at port of entry in Thailand from 28 November 2021 (00.01 am) onward must be quarantined for 14 days in alternative quarantine (aq) regardless of vaccination status. The passenger from the said countries who has already got Thailand pass as sandbox will be changed to quarantine (aq) 14 days by port health officers.
 - The travel ban of passengers from these 8 affected countries will be enforced on 1 December 2021. The airline shall not accept the passenger from these countries to depart for Thailand and arrive on 1 December 2021 (00.01am) onward. it must be noted that Thailand pass issued to the passengers from these countries will automatically void on 1 December 2021

- Thailand pass registration is no longer available for register from today, 27 November 2021 in these countries.
 - The passenger from 8 affected countries who have Thailand pass may arrive at port of entry in Thailand until 30 November 2021 and must comply with quarantine 14 days protocol regardless of vaccine status
 - For all remaining African passengers (Africa-north/central/south), except these 8 affected countries, who have Thailand pass as sandbox will be valid thru 14 December 2021. from 15 December 2021, all African passenger (except 8 countries with travel ban) will be eligible for alternative quarantine 14 Days regardless of vaccine status.

- PCR:**
- **Effective from 1 April 2021**, for travelers arrived in from 00.01 hrs. Thailand's time onward,
 - Thai nationals are not required to present either fit to fly health certificate or medical certificate with a laboratory result indicating that covid-19 is not detected, using RT-PCR method. In case the airlines require passenger to present a COVID-free certificate as an airline policy, all passengers, including Thai nationals shall comply with the airlines policy, otherwise the passengers shall be denied to board with the flight.
 - The Ministry of Public Health has agreed to disregard the list of covid-19 risk countries and the list of countries with variant strains, therefore **CCSA has agreed to allow passengers from all countries/territories to enter the Sandbox Programme effective from 1 October 2021.**
 - Non-Thais are no longer required to present a Fit to Fly certificate to enter Thailand. They only need to present a Medical Certificate with a laboratory result indicating that COVID-19 is not detected, using RT-PCR method issued within 72 hours before departure from their port of origin (in addition to COE, **insurance** and ASQ/ALQ or other quarantine facility confirmation)
- QUARANTINE:**
- **Effective from 01st October 2021**,
 - Quarantine period is reduced from 14 days to 7 or 10 days for all air passengers. This applies to all passengers, regardless of their port of origin.
 - **Fully vaccinated** passengers are eligible to 7-day quarantine. The passengers must complete their vaccination at least 14 days before departure from their port of origin.

CANADA

Inbound flights to Canada for the transport of passengers from the United Kingdom is restricted effective at 05:00Z (00:00EST) on Monday, December 21, 2020.

- **Flights between Cairo and Canada will be resumed starting from 21st December 2021**
 - Passengers are required to register via switchhealth.ca/en/travel/pearson for the test upon arrival.
- **Effective 30th November 2021,**
 - **Fully vaccinated** individuals with right of entry to Canada who depart and re-enter the country within 72 hours of leaving Canada will not have to present a pre-entry molecular test. This exemption is only for trips originating in Canada taken by fully vaccinated Canadian citizens, permanent residents or individuals registered under the Indian Act, who depart and re-enter by land or by air and can demonstrate that they have been away from Canada for less than 72 hours. This exemption extends to accompanying children under 12, and individuals with medical contraindications to vaccination.
- **Effective 15th January 2022,** certain groups of passengers, who are currently exempt from entry requirements, will only be allowed to enter the country if they are fully vaccinated with one of the vaccines approved for entry into Canada. These groups include:
 - individuals travelling to reunite with family (unvaccinated children under 18 years of age will retain exemption if travelling to reunite with an immediate or extended family member who is a Canadian, permanent resident, or person registered under the Indian Act);
 - international students who are 18 years old and older;
 - professional and amateur athletes;
 - individuals with a valid work permit, including temporary foreign workers (outside of those in agriculture and food processing); and
 - Essential service providers, including truck drivers.
- **After 15th January 2022,** unvaccinated or partially vaccinated foreign nationals will only be allowed to enter Canada if they meet the criteria for limited exceptions, which apply to certain groups such as agricultural and food processing workers, marine crew members, those entering on compassionate grounds, new permanent residents, resettling refugees and some children under the age of 18. Exempt unvaccinated passengers will continue to be subject to testing, quarantine, and other entry requirements. Non-exempt unvaccinated or partially vaccinated foreign nationals will be prohibited entry into Canada.
- **Effective 30th November 2021,** vaccination will be required for travel within and out of Canada. A valid COVID-19 molecular test will no longer be accepted as an alternative to vaccination unless passengers are eligible for one of the limited exemptions, such as a medical inability to be vaccinated. Passengers should contact their airline or railway company to obtain the necessary form and submit it in accordance with their carrier's approval process as of November 30.

- **Effective 30th October 2021,**
 - **Air Passengers:** All travelers 12 years of age and older, boarding any flight from a Canadian airport, flying on a commercial passenger aircraft are required to be **fully vaccinated**. There will be a transition period until 30 November 2021 for travelers who are in the process of being vaccinated, and who will be able to travel if they can show a valid COVID-19 molecular test within 72 hours of travel.
 - **Non-Passengers Working in Airport Restricted Areas:** All non-passengers will be prohibited from entering the restricted area of a specified airport unless they are fully vaccinated.
 - **Mandatory Vaccination Policy / Compliance Reporting for Regulated Entities:** Air carriers would be required to implement a company-wide mandatory vaccination policy no later than 30 October 2021, for all its employees and non-passengers.
- **Effective October 30, 2021,**
 - All air travelers who are 12 years and 4 months of age or older flying on a domestic, transborder or international flight departing from a specified Canadian airport will need to be fully vaccinated. In recognition that travelers will need time to get vaccinated, travelers will be able to board with a valid COVID-19 molecular test (taken within 72 hours of travel) until November 29. On November 30, all travelers must be fully vaccinated with very few exceptions.
 - Non-passengers will also need to be fully vaccinated, unless exempt, no later than November 15, 2021.
 - Unvaccinated Canadians or permanent residents will be allowed to continue on with their domestic connection to their final destination if they can demonstrate a continuous journey from their last point of departure or direct flight to Canada. In practice, an unvaccinated Canadian or permanent resident will be allowed to board their domestic connection after entering Canada as long as no more than 24 hours has elapsed since they boarded their flight to Canada.
 - Unvaccinated foreign nationals will be allowed to continue on with their domestic connection to their final destination if they can demonstrate a continuous journey from their last point of departure or direct flight to Canada. In practice, an unvaccinated foreign national will be allowed to board their domestic connection after entering Canada as long as no more than 24 hours has elapsed since they boarded their flight to Canada. Unvaccinated foreign nationals will require a pre-departure molecular test if they plan to leave Canada between October 30 and November 29, 2021.
 - Starting November 30 there will be limited exceptions to being fully vaccinated in order to board an aircraft departing from the specified Canadian airports. Limited exceptions will include unvaccinated foreign nationals who don’t reside in Canada and who were allowed to enter Canada under the

Government of Canada's Emergency Orders-in-Council, made pursuant to the Quarantine Act. These foreign nationals will be allowed to depart Canada with a valid COVID-19 molecular test result.

- Unvaccinated temporary foreign workers or international students will be allowed to continue on with their domestic connection to their final destination if they can demonstrate a continuous journey from their last point of departure or direct flight to Canada. In practice, an unvaccinated foreign national will be allowed to board their domestic connection after entering Canada as long as no more than 24 hours has elapsed since they boarded their flight to Canada. Unvaccinated foreign nationals will require a pre-departure molecular test if they plan to leave Canada between October 30 and November 29, 2021.
- Starting November 30 there will be limited exceptions to being fully vaccinated in order to board an aircraft departing from the specified Canadian airports. Limited exceptions will include unvaccinated foreign nationals who don't reside in Canada and who were allowed to enter Canada under the Government of Canada's Emergency Orders-in-Council, made pursuant to the Quarantine Act. These foreign nationals will be allowed to depart Canada with a valid COVID-19 molecular test result.
- **Effective 07th September 2021**, the Government of Canada is allowing **fully vaccinated** foreign nationals travelling to Canada for discretionary reasons (i.e. tourism, recreation or entertainment) to enter the country as long as they have entered all of the required information in ArriveCAN before boarding their flight to Canada. EgyptAir is responsible for verifying that the information has been entered in ArriveCAN, by checking that travellers have an ArriveCAN receipt indicating that all of the requirements have been met. If the Passenger does not have an ArriveCAN receipt, and is claiming to be fully vaccinated and travelling for discretionary purposes, the air operator can advise the passenger that they will need to download the app on the spot and enter all the required information in order to obtain an ArriveCAN receipt. If the passenger does not have an ArriveCAN receipt, and does not meet the exceptions noted below, the passenger is to be denied boarding. Please refer to Annex J for a decision-making tool to assist air operators with this process.
- Accordingly foreign nationals travelling to Canada for discretionary reasons (i.e. tourism, recreation or entertainment) will the following:
 - Proper documents to enter Canada (e.g. valid visa)
 - Proof of fully vaccination with one of the approved Vaccines in Canada (Jonson /AstraZeneca / Moderna / Pfizer / Sinopharm (also referred to as Covilo) / Sinovac (also referred to as Coronavac) / COVAXIN). At least 14 days prior arrival. The certificate must be in English or French or translated via an accredited translation office.
 - PCR 72 hours from collection till departure of last direct flight to Canada
 - ArriveCan (Mandatory) the receipt will show "I" or "V".

A foreign national is prohibited from entering Canada if they arrive from a foreign country other than the United States, however this does not apply to the following people:

- An immediate family member of a Canadian citizen or of a permanent resident;
- An extended family member of a Canadian citizen or permanent resident who holds a statutory declaration attesting to their relationship with the Canadian citizen or permanent resident and is authorized in writing by an officer designated under subsection 6(1) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act to enter Canada.
- a person authorized in writing by an officer designated under subsection 6(1) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, to enter Canada for the purpose of reuniting with immediate family members;
- a person who is exempt from the requirements to obtain a temporary resident visa under paragraph 190 (2)(a) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, and the immediate family members of that person;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada at the invitation of the Minister of Health for the purpose of assisting in the COVID-19 response;
- A person who arrives by any means of conveyance operated by Canadian Forces or the Department of National Defence;
- a member of the Canadian Forces or a visiting force, as defined in section 2 of the Visiting Forces Act, and the immediate family members of that member;
- a French citizen who resides in Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon who has been only in Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon, the United States or Canada during the period of 14 days before the day on which they arrived in Canada;
- a person or any person in a class of persons who, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer, appointed under subsection 6 (1) of the Public Health Agency of Canada Act, does not pose a risk of significant harm to public health or who will provide an essential service while in Canada;
- a person or any person in a class of persons whose presence in Canada, as determined by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Citizenship and Immigration or the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, is in the national interest;
- The holder of a valid work permit or study permit, as defined under section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- A person whose application for a work permit referred to in paragraph (l) was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and who has received written notice of the approval, but who has not yet been issued the permit;

- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of attending a listed institution, and the immediate family members of that person other than a dependent child of a dependent child of the person, if the person hold a valid student permit as defined in section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, if the person may apply for a study permit when entering Canada under section 214 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, or if the person's application for a study permit was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and they received written notice of the approval but have not yet been issued the permit;
- person permitted to work in Canada as a student in a health field under paragraph 186(p) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- A person permitted to work in Canada as a provider of emergency services under paragraph 186(t) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- a licensed health care professional with proof of employment in Canada;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of delivering, maintaining, or repairing medically-necessary equipment or devices;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of donating or making medical deliveries of stem cells, blood and blood products, tissues, organs or other body parts, that are required for patient care in Canada during the validity of the Order or within a reasonable period of time after the expiry of the Order;
- a person whose application for permanent residence was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, and who received written notice of the approval before noon, Eastern Daylight Time on March 18, 2020, but who has not yet become a permanent resident under that Act;
- a worker in the marine transportation sector who is essential for the movement of goods by vessel, as defined in section 2 of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 and who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of performing their duties in that sector;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada to take up post as a diplomat, consular officer, representative or official of a country other than Canada, of the United Nations or any of its agencies or of any intergovernmental organization of which Canada is a member, and the immediate family members of that person;
- a person who arrives at a Canadian airport aboard a commercial passenger conveyance and who is transiting to a country other than Canada and remains in a sterile transit area within the meaning of section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada on board a vessel, as defined in section 2 of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001, that is engaged in research and that is operated by or under the authority of the Government

of Canada or at its request or operated by a provincial government, a local authority or a government, council or other entity authorized to act on behalf of an Indigenous group.

- A person whose application for permanent residence in Canada was approved, but has not yet become a permanent resident;
- Passengers holding a valid IM-1 visa and a confirmation of Permanent Residence (CoPR) is exempt from the travel restrictions to Canada. The criteria that the application must have been approved on or before March 18, 2020 has been removed.
- Final decision of accepting passengers onboard is subjected to the approval of the Canadian Border Service Agency.
- All passengers travelling to Canada are required to download (Arrive CAN) application to provide specific information upon entry into Canada, including providing an appropriate 14 day quarantine plan, contact information, and updates on symptoms through self-assessment.(within 48 hours before arriving in Canada)
- Air operators are to deny boarding to those eligible United States citizens or permanent residents that are coming to Canada for discretionary travel that have not uploaded their proof of vaccination in ArriveCAN, if they do not meet an exemption (e.g., the transition period is over).
- Effective 07th September 2021, The Public Health Agency of Canada traveler Contact Information Form, to be used by those passengers who are unable to enter their information digitally in ArriveCAN (due to traveler disability, a service disruption, natural disaster, lack of infrastructure or during the transition period).
- **Traveler responsibilities:**

- Currently, only individuals whose application for permanent residence in Canada was approved, and who have received written notice of that approval **before March 18, 2020**, (but have not yet become a Permanent Resident) are allowed to enter Canada under section 58 of the Quarantine Act.
- If the individual received written notice of approval **after March 18, 2020**, they are not yet permitted to enter Canada under section 58 of the Quarantine Act. Their notice of approval will explicitly state

that, due to COVID-19 travel restrictions, they should not travel to Canada at this time to become a Permanent Resident.

- Effective 20th May 2021, international commercial air flights from India and Pakistan are prohibited.
- Passenger has originated in India or Pakistan and (has / hasn't) a negative COVID-19 pre-departure molecular test performed in their country of origin (India or Pakistan) or from a third country are **NOT** allowed to board aircraft.
- Negative PCRs issued in India are not acceptable for travelling to Canada.
- The Government of Canada has exempted the Government of Canada employee who is currently posted or on temporary assignment in India and their spouse/dependents, embarking on a flight to one of the following airports in Canada and allows them to travel with PCR issued in India: (Toronto Pearson International Airport / Montreal-Trudeau International Airport / Calgary International Airport / Vancouver International Airport)
- For passengers who have a temporary exemption due to medical inability to be vaccinated, In addition to any other accommodation measures that could be required by the carrier/operator, passengers with an approved temporary exemption will also need to present to the carrier/operator results of COVID-19 molecular test taken:
 - Within 72 hours of the passenger's scheduled departure time, where the result is negative, or
 - At least 14 days before but not more than 180 days prior to the traveler's scheduled departure time (traveler eligible to travel on day 15), where the result is positive.
- A foreign national is prohibited from entering Canada if within a period of 14 days before the day on which they seek to enter Canada, they were in a country where as determined by the Chief Public Officer,
 - a- There is an outbreak of the Omicron variant; or
 - b- There is a risk of an outbreak of that variant.
- The following countries to be countries where there is an outbreak of, or a risk of an outbreak of, the Omicron variant: (Botswana / Eswatini / Lesotho / Mozambique / Namibia / South Africa /Zimbabwe).
- Passengers who have been to (Malawi / Nigeria) in the last 14 days are NOT allowed to enter Canada. This does not apply to:
 - Nationals and Residents of Canada
 - Passengers with status under Canada's Indian Act.
- However, these customers must obtain new molecular test results in their transit country prior to departure to Canada. They will be subject to arrival testing, and quarantine measure as well.

- All fully vaccinated passengers arriving by air from departure points other than the United States will be subject to arrival testing and quarantine while they await the results of their arrival test
- PCR test administered in any of these mentioned countries are not accepted to enter Canada.
- All Canadians returning to Canada should visit: <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid>.

QUARANTINE:

- **No 14 days home quarantine is required**

PCR:

- **Effective from 22nd February 2021**, all passengers (**with some exceptions**), will be required to Take a COVID-19 molecular test when they arrive Canada before exiting the airport (While waiting for their test results, passengers will be required to quarantine **for up to three nights**), and another toward the end of their 14-day quarantine period.
- **Effective January 7, 2021**, at 12:01 a.m. EST, All passengers **five years of age or older** will be required to present evidence of an acceptable negative molecular COVID-19 test result, (which includes a PCR or RT-LAMP test) **within 72 hours prior to the traveler's scheduled departure to Canada** (72 hours from Collection till the Schedule departure of the last direct departing flight to Canada).
- A negative laboratory test result must be presented before boarding (paper or electronic proof of result).
- The test result must indicate; (passenger's name and date of birth / name and address of the lab/facility that administered the test / the date on which the test was conducted / the method of test conducted, and that it is a PCR test /as negative) as The name on the result matches the name on the passenger's identification.
- **Acceptable COVID-19 Molecular tests**
The following test methods are considered acceptable molecular tests: (Polymerase chain reaction (PCR) / Real time PCR (RT-PCR) / Quantitative PCR (Q-PCR) / CT (cycle threshold) / Droplet digital PCR or digital droplet PCR (DD-PCR) / Isothermal amplification / Reverse transcription loop-mediated isothermal amplification (RT-LAMP) / CRISPR / Next generational sequencing (NGS) or whole genome sequencing (WGS) / Sequencing, Sanger Sequencing / RNA (Ribonucleic acid) / Nucleic acid technology or test (NAT) / Nucleic acid amplification / Multiplex / Assignment CID 2 / Gene / Corman assay / N gene / Orf1a/b / S gene / E gene).
- All Passengers who are NOT considered fully vaccinated with a full series of a vaccine approved by the Government of Canada for the purpose of travel will be subject to testing on arrival. Passengers who are considered fully vaccinated will be subject to mandatory random on-arrival COVID-19 molecular testing.

Please note that with the introduction of the Omicron variant, the percentage of passengers that will be tested upon arrival will be increased substantially. Therefore, you should expect to undergo testing at the airport.

- Passengers should pre-register for an on-arrival COVID-19 molecular test in advance of landing in Canada to avoid lengthy lines and delays in processing. This will be especially important as we enter the holiday travel period.
- Pre-departure tests taken in Canada cannot be used for the return flight to Canada; they must be performed outside Canada
- **The following Passengers are exempt from the requirement to provide a negative COVID-19 molecular test:**
 - A person who is less than five years of age
 - A person or any member of a class of persons who, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer, will provide an essential service, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Chief Public Health Officer to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19
 - A person who is permitted to work in Canada as a provider of emergency services under paragraph 186(t) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations and who enters Canada for the purpose of providing those services
 - An emergency service provider, including a firefighter, peace officer or paramedic, who returns to Canada after providing emergency services in a foreign country and who is required to provide their services within the 14-day period that begins on the day on which they enter Canada
 - An official of the Government of Canada or a foreign government, including a border services officer, immigration enforcement officer, law enforcement officer or correctional officer, who is escorting an individual entering or leaving Canada pursuant to a legal process such as an international transfer of an offender or deportation or extradition of a person
 - An official of the Government of Canada, the government of a province or a foreign government, including a border services officer, immigration enforcement officer, law enforcement officer or correctional officer, who enters Canada for the purposes of border, immigration or law enforcement, or national security activities, that support active investigations, ensure the continuity of enforcement operations or activities, or enable the transfer of information or evidence pursuant to or in support of a legal process
 - A person or any member of a class of persons whose presence in Canada, as determined by the Minister of Health, is in the national interest, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Minister to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19

- A member of the Canadian Forces, who enters Canada for the purpose of performing their duties as a member of those forces
- A member of an air crew of a visiting force, as defined in section 2 of the Visiting Forces Act, who enters Canada for the purpose of performing mission essential duties as a member of that force
- A person who returns to Canada after suffering hardship in a foreign country, as determined by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Minister of Foreign Affairs and developed in consultation with the Minister of Health to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19
- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident, temporary resident, protected person or person registered as an Indian under the Indian Act who resides in Canada and who received essential medical services or treatments in a foreign country, if the person has
 - (a) written evidence from a licensed health care practitioner in Canada who indicated that the medical services or treatments outside Canada are essential, unless the services or treatments are for primary or emergency medical services under an agreement with another jurisdiction; and
 - (b) written evidence from a licensed health care practitioner in the foreign country who indicated that the services or treatments were provided in that country
- A person who will, as determined by the Minister of Transport, respond to, investigate or prevent significant disruptions to the effective continued operation of the national transportation system, transportation undertakings or infrastructure, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Minister of Transport and developed in consultation with the Minister of Health to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19
- A person who, as determined by the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, will respond to, investigate or prevent events related to national security, if the person complies with any conditions imposed on them by the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness and developed in consultation with the Minister of Health to minimize the risk of introduction or spread of COVID-19
- A person who enters Canada by aircraft and who is not required under the Aeronautics Act to provide the evidence referred to in subsection 2.2(1)
- Any person who boarded a medical evacuation flight for medical purposes, if the urgency of the medical situation does not permit a COVID-19 molecular test to be administered to the person before boarding the aircraft for the flight to Canada

- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident, temporary resident, protected person or person registered as an Indian under the Indian Act who resides in Canada, who has been denied entry in a foreign country and who must board a flight destined to Canada
- A person referred to in subsection 5(1) or (2) of the Minimizing the Risk of Exposure to COVID-19 in Canada Order (Prohibition of Entry into Canada from the United States) who made a claim for refugee protection when entering Canada from the United States
- A person who plans to arrive at a Canadian airport aboard an aircraft in order to transit to a country other than Canada and to remain in a sterile transit area, as defined in section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, until they leave Canada
- A person who enters Canada regularly to go to their normal place of employment or returns from their normal place of employment in another country and who, **if they are not a fully vaccinated**, does not directly care for persons 65 years of age or older within the 14-day period that begins on the day on which the person enters Canada
- Passengers on direct flights from **India** to Canada will be required to take a pre-departure COVID-19 PCR molecular test from a PHAC-designated laboratory in India (Genestrings) within 18 hours of their scheduled departure to Canada. Air operators will verify electronically through QR scanning that the passenger has received a negative test result prior to allowing the individual to board their flight (Till 21st November, 2021).
- Boarding accredited and incoming foreign representatives from the Government of **India** and their dependents to a destination in Canada – Without a pre-arrival COVID 19 Molecular Test

Effective 9 August 2021:

- **Fully vaccinated** foreign nationals travelling to Canada for discretionary reasons (i.e. tourism, recreation or entertainment) to enter the country as long as they have entered all of the required information in ArriveCAN before boarding their flight to Canada. Air operators are responsible for verifying that the information has been entered in ArriveCAN, by checking that passengers have an ArriveCAN receipt (see Annex K for a sample ArriveCAN receipt) indicating that all of the requirements have been met. If the passenger does not have an ArriveCAN receipt, and is claiming to be fully vaccinated and travelling for discretionary purposes, the air operator can advise the passenger that they will need to download the app on the spot and enter all the required information in order to obtain an ArriveCAN receipt. If the passenger does not have an ArriveCAN receipt, and does not meet the exceptions noted below, the passenger is to be denied boarding. Please refer to Annex J for a decision-making tool to assist air operators with this process.
- Exceptions to this requirement:

- In the following situations, paper copies of a passenger’s proof of vaccination will be accepted:
 - During the transition period only (September 7-8-9, 2021): if the passenger is unable to download the new version of ArriveCAN in order to obtain a receipt.
 - There has been a natural disaster, service disruption or inadequate infrastructure which has rendered it impossible for a willing passenger to submit their information.
- **Fully vaccinated** citizens and permanent residents of the U.S., currently residing in the U.S., will be permitted to enter Canada for discretionary (non-essential) travel.(all of the required information in ArriveCAN must be done before boarding their flight to Canada)
- To be considered **fully vaccinated**, passengers must:
 - have received the full series of an accepted COVID-19 vaccine or a combination of accepted vaccines accepted by the Government of Canada
 - have received their last dose at least 14 days prior to the day they enter Canada
- Other key new measures:
- Allowing individuals who have recovered from COVID-19, but who continue to test positive, to present a positive COVID-19 molecular test result on a specimen taken 14 to 180 days prior to arrival in Canada as part of the pre-entry test requirements.
- Upon arrival in Canada unvaccinated or partially vaccinated All passengers are required to undergo a molecular COVID-19 test (e.g., a PCR or RT-LAMP test) on day-1 and day-8 following their arrival. For a list of tests that are considered molecular tests, please consult the “Accepted Types of Tests” section that can be found on the following webpage: <https://travel.gc.ca/travel-covid/travel-restrictions/flying/covid-19-testing-travellers-coming-into-canada>. Those who are fully vaccinated will be subject to mandatory random arrival testing, meaning only those passengers who were randomly selected will be subject to an arrival test on day1.
- Once the test has been administered, all passengers are free to leave the airport but unvaccinated or partially vaccinated passengers are required to quarantine for 14 days. Fully vaccinated passengers are not required to quarantine.
- Foreign nationals who are considered not fully vaccinated, must demonstrate a non-discretionary purpose of travel. Entering Canada for the purpose of studying at a designated learning institution is considered a non-discretionary purpose of travel so long as studying is the primary purpose for seeking entry to Canada. This means that the time between a student’s entry to Canada and the start date of their studies exceeds what would be considered a reasonable amount of time. For example, this could include the timeframe for that student to complete their 14-day quarantine (if applicable); as well as prepare themselves for beginning their studies (for example, move in to a residence or get vaccinated).

If the timeframe is not deemed reasonable, the primary purpose of travel may no longer be considered for study purposes and would therefore be deemed discretionary in nature.

- So, Effective November 3, 2021, unvaccinated students who are seeking to travel to Canada to study at a designated learning institution for the winter (January) 2022 semester, will be permitted to enter Canada, so long as they meet all other requirements under the Orders in Council and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.
- **Until 31st January 31, 2022**, For all passengers who have been in the Southern Africa region — including **(South Africa, Eswatini, Lesotho, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, and Namibia)** within the last 14 days before arriving in Canada, the following will be applied:
 - Foreign nationals who have travelled in any of these countries within the previous 14 days will NOT be permitted entry into Canada.
 - Canadian citizens, permanent residents and people with status under the Indian Act, regardless of their vaccination status or having had a previous history of testing positive for COVID-19, who have been in these countries in the previous 14 days will be subject to enhanced testing, screening, and quarantine measures.
 - These individuals will be required to obtain, within 72 hours of departure, a valid negative COVID-19 molecular test in a third country before continuing their journey to Canada. Upon arrival to Canada, regardless of their vaccination status or having had a previous history of testing positive for COVID-19, they will be subject to immediate arrival testing. All travellers will also be required to complete a test on day 8 after arrival and quarantine for 14 days
 - Any PCR performed in (Botswana / Eswatini / India / Lesotho / Morocco / Mozambique / Namibia / South Africa / Zimbabwe), will not be accepted for travelling to Canada.

Effective Monday 1st February 2021 at 12:00(L),

- All arriving international and transborder passengers terminating in Toronto and those connecting to other locations within the Province of Ontario (e.g. Passengers flying from London Heathrow to Toronto and then onwards to Ottawa) will be required to **test upon arrival** at Toronto Pearson. Passengers connecting on the same day to other Canadian provinces and territories or international destinations are not required to test.
- According to the airport authorities it is highly recommended that passengers pre – register the mandatory PCR tests upon arrival prior arriving to avoid long queuing time at YYZ airport. Passengers can pre- register via (<https://www.torontopearson.com/en/healthy-airport/covid-19-testing-at-toronto-pearson/arriving-into-canada>)
