1	<u>EGYPT</u>	<p><u>Health Regulations to enter Egypt:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passengers should wear face masks during the flight. • A Health Declaration form should be available on all the international flights and to be filled by the Passengers before boarding the flight (at the departure airport) and to be delivered to The Quarantine Authorities upon arrival. • Airline must provide the Health Declaration form at the departure airports and insure that the passengers have filled and signed it before boarding the flight (on the international flights) • Passengers travelling to Egypt should be screened at the airport of departure. • Passengers who are suffering from a temperature (Equal / above) 38C or those who are suffering from one of the respiratory symptoms (cough / sneezing / shortness of breath ...etc.) are not allowed to board the aircraft. • Aircraft disinfection form should be delivered to The Quarantine Authorities upon arrival for the international flights. • The disinfection of the Aircraft and the disinfection of aircraft air conditions filters should be done according to WHO guidelines and the aircraft manufacturer, Aircraft will not be allowed to take off again till obtaining a sanitary quarantine approval from the Egyptian Quarantine Authorities. • In case of any of the respiratory symptoms appear on a passenger during the flight, all necessary precautions must be taken if possible by (separate the suspected passenger in an area far from the rest of the passengers / assign one of the cabin crew members to serve the sick passenger / provide a bathroom for the sick passenger only). • <u>Global Health insurance is no more mandatory. (optional)</u> • All Passengers arriving to Egypt from (Ethiopia - Eritrea - Senegal – Sudan - Somalia - Congo - Niger - Angola - Uganda - Benin - Burkina Faso - Burundi - Chad - Togo – Tanzania - Gambia - South Sudan- Central African Republic - Democratic Republic of Congo - Sierra Leone -Rwanda - Zambia - Ghana - Guinea - Guinea Bissau - Equatorial Guinea - Côte d'Ivoire - Kenya - Liberia - Mali - Mauritania – Nigeria-Cameroon –Gabon - Brazil - Argentina - Ecuador - Paraguay -

Panama - Peru – Trinidad and Tobago- Guyana - French Guiana - Suriname - Venezuela – Colombia) must be in possession of **Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate**.

- All Passengers arriving to Egypt from (Pakistan - Afghanistan –Somalia- Nigeria -Niger - Malaysia - Philippines - China- Myanmar - Democratic Republic of the Congo - Kenya -Chad - Cote d'ivoire - Angola - central republic of Africa - Ethiopia - Ghana - Togo - Zambia -Benin - Burkina Faso - Cameroon) must be in in possession of **Poliomyelitis Vaccination Certificate**.

PCR:

- **Effective from 1st Sep.2020 and till further notice.**

- All passengers "including Egyptians" travelling to Egypt MUST be in possession of negative PCR test (72) hours (**before departure time of the last direct flight to Egypt**).
- **Exception** is made for passengers travelling from (Japan / China / Thailand / North America / South America / Canada / **London (Heathrow) /Rome** / Paris / Frankfurt / New Zealand / Australia/**South Korea**) PCR test will be 96 hours before departure time.
- All children "regardless their nationalities" under 6 years old are exempted from PCR test.
- **Transit Passengers** (who are not entitled For Hotel Accommodation and **will be staying** at Cairo Airport till their onward Flight) don't require having a PCR Test upon Arrival.
- **Transit Passengers** (who are entitled For Hotel Accommodation and **will not be staying** at Cairo Airport till their Onward Flight) must be in Possession of Negative PCR Test even if their Final Destination don't need require a Negative PCR Test to be able to accommodate them in Hotel.
- The minister of foreign affairs will coordinate with the concerned authorities regarding the procedures for PCR test and precautionary measures planned to be implemented for the members of diplomatic missions coming from abroad after the end of their work period.
- **The submitted PCR certificate will be accepted if it meets these requirements:**
- It includes the hour and the date of sampling, which is the date on which the 72 hours will be counted.
- Issued by an authorized accredited laboratory and stamped with the laboratory's stamp and does not contain scraping, cancellation or addition.
- Indicating the type of sample taken for the swab.
- Indicating that the type of test is (RT - PCR).
- Certificate is accepted in Arabic or English language.
- International Passengers (**who are travelling directly**) to (Sharm el Sheikh / Taba / Hurghada / Marsa Alam) airports who failed to submit a valid PCR test (72 hours before flight departure

		<p>time), shall undergo the PCR test upon arrival to those airports with charge of 30 USD. “<u>Those passengers will be isolated in their hotels till the PCR test result is received and “In case the PCR is positive, passenger will be self-isolated in his / her room at the hotel and to coordinate with the Egyptian Ministry of health”.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>PCR test certificate EXPIRES as soon as the passenger used it to travel outside Egypt (as it can’t be used again to return back)</u> • In the event of violating the above-mentioned procedures, the necessary legal measures will be taken against EgyptAir. <p><u>QUARANTINE:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Passengers coming to Egypt will be followed up for 14 days by The Quarantine Authorities and Ministry of Health Offices
2	<u>Qatar</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Effective from 18th January 2021, Flights between Cairo and Doha will be resumed.</u> • <u>All passengers arriving to Qatar must install “EHTERAZ” application on their cell phones.</u> <p><u>First: Countries in “the Green List:</u> (Oman / Brunei Darussalam / Thailand / China / Vietnam / Malaysia / South Korea / Singapore / Japan / Myanmar / Maldives / Australia / New Zealand / Mexico / Cuba / Mauritius / Iceland / Ireland):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Passengers arriving from “Green Countries” countries are accepted on board flights heading to Hamad International Airport, and must be informed about the following:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1- <u>Passengers will be required to do a PCR test upon arrival to airport.</u> 2- <u>Sign a commitment for one-week self-quarantine (Home Quarantine).</u> 3- <u>Passenger will proceed to one of the accredited health centers on the 6th day of his arrival to do the PCR test, and according to the test result, passengers will then follow the rest of procedures published on the Ministry of Public Health website.</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Passenger will be exempted from doing the PCR test upon arrival to the Airport in case he is carrying a (COVID-19) Disease-Free certificate from an accredited medical Center from the country of his departure, provided that the date of this certificate do not exceed 48 hours prior to the travel time, then rest of above mentioned procedures to be followed</u> <p><u>Second: Other Countries:</u> Which are other countries not included in the “Green list” and do not have accredited medical centers for COVID-19 test</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Passengers arriving from such countries are accepted on board flights heading to Hamad International Airport, and must be informed about the following:</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1- <u>To book a quarantine Hotel for one week through “Discover Qatar” website, before arriving to</u>

the state of Qatar.

2- Passenger will do a PCR test on day six of the Hotel Quarantine, and according to the test result, passengers will then follow the rest of procedures published on the Ministry of Public Health website.

• **For Qatari Nationals, their spouses, their husbands, their children, and companions' holders of permanent residency holders: -**

1- They can freely travel and return at any time, provided they are following the above-mentioned instructions according to the country they are coming from.

2- Passengers subject to the above-mentioned condition of Hotel-quarantine will be exempted from bearing the cost of the Hotel, in case they are having overseas medical treatment at state expenses, same as their registered companions, as well as officials on duty travels, since their sponsors will duly bear the hotel cost.

• **With reference to Residents**

1- They will be allowed to return to state of Qatar effective the 1st of August 2020, by getting a Return Permit through "Qatar Portal".

• **With reference to passengers requiring self-quarantine (Home Quarantine): -**

➤ Ministry of public health had identified categories of passengers that are requiring self-quarantine, regardless of the country of arrival, these categories are published through the Ministry of Public Health website.

Citizens, their Spouses and Children, Permanent Residency Holders, and GCC Citizens:

- Citizens, their spouses and children, permanent residency holders, and GCC citizens can return to the State of Qatar at any time, provided they adhere to the travel and return policy.
- Citizens, their spouses and children, permanent residency holders, and GCC citizens shall bear the cost of the hotel quarantine for a week, provided that the booking is made through "Discover Qatar."
- If the hotel quarantine conditions apply, the government will cover the costs for the hotel quarantine for patients receiving treatment abroad at the expense of the State, along with their escorts. The same applies to the employees who are on official missions.

Residents:

- Residents abroad may return to the State of Qatar, as of 1st August, by applying for an "Exceptional Entry Permit" through the "Qatar Portal" website.

- o The employer should submit an “Exceptional Entry Permit” application for the company or institute’s employees electronically via the “Qatar Portal” website. A similar process applies to domestic workers.
- o Residents who are currently in the State of Qatar and wish to travel and return will automatically receive an “Exceptional Entry Permit” upon departure. The resident or their employer will be able to printout the permit from the Ministry of Interior’s website at any point after their departure. Requests will no longer need to be submitted through the “Qatar Portal” website. The permit will be available automatically upon registration of the resident’s departure from Qatar. This service is not available for residents who are currently outside the State of Qatar. They are still required to get the “Exceptional Return Permit” via the “Qatar Portal” website if they wish to return to the State of Qatar.
- o **Non-Qatari passengers** are exempted from the exceptional entry permit if they are sponsored by a Qatari Company and the owner of the company (Qatari) is travelling with them to Doha on the same flight

Important Notes:

First: Categories of passengers who can enter Qatar **without** “Exceptional Entry Permit”:

- 1- Qatari Nationals, their spouses, their husbands, their children using their passports only, and their companions of domestic workers (on their personal sponsor or accompanied by one of their first-degree relatives).
- 2- GCC citizens (using their passports only), and any of their escorts either domestic workers or their first-degree relatives and GCC residents.
- 3- Holders of permanent residency.
- 4- Holders of diplomatic and administrative cards issued by ministry of foreign affairs. (protocol department).
- 5- US forces, NATO forces and their families who have accredited military cards and moving instructions. Military IDs and Movement orders.

Second: Categories of passengers that are required to **get** a prior “Exceptional Entry Permit”:

- 1- Qatar residents, holders of Qatari documents, and visitors who have Exceptional Entry Permit

issued by the supreme committee for crisis management.

- 2- Immediate Visa will be granted to new-born arrivals born outside the country till the age of 6 months, and must be accompanied at least with one of his parents who is resident in Qatar, provided that one of them is sponsored by the other, or both of them have a valid residency permits in state of Qatar, sponsored by an enterprise, and have a prior exceptional entry permit.
- 3- Above mentioned visa will not be granted if the mother is sponsored by her father, or one of them is not a resident in the country.

Third: exempted categories of passengers from hotel quarantine:

- 1- 60 years old and above Passengers arriving to the country and their companions of first-degree relatives (father, mother, spouse, husband, and children only) and this exception applies to their accompanied domestic workers who are sponsored by them or by their first-degree relatives.
- 2- Minor passengers under the age of 18 and those coming to the country on their own.
- 3- Mothers and fathers with their children under the age of 5 years or less.
- 4- People with chronic diseases identified by the Ministry of Public Health (an updated list is identified).
- 5- Only Qatari diplomatic passports holders and their accompanied of first-degree relatives or domestic workers. (this exemption does not apply to those holders of private passport, which has a diplomatic stamp on the passport pages).

Forth: special conditions:

- 1- If the sponsor (head of the family) has an exceptional entry permit, then it includes his sponsored family members accompanying him, and domestic workers under his sponsorship as well.
- 2- If the resident is sponsored by an enterprise and is arriving accompanying the owner of the enterprise, then he can enter without a prior exceptional entry permit (must show the enterprise registry ID).
- 3- Only medical reports issued by governmental hospitals in the state of Qatar for identified diseases, or private hospitals are accepted since its accredited by the ministry of public health in Qatar.
- 4- All passengers arriving from/or through -transit- the UK, The Netherlands, South Africa & Denmark, they

		<p>are all subjected to Hotel quarantine without any exemptions, except the members of the foreign diplomatic missions and those who have diplomatic or administrative residences and IDs issued by the MOFA.</p> <p>5- Passengers arriving from green countries must stay at least 7 days in the green country, so they can be exempted from the Hotel Quarantine and subjected to Home quarantine.</p> <p>6- The reasons for exempting the passenger from the hotel quarantine must be taken into consideration and make sure of their clarity when exempting the passenger. (for example: granting the passenger an exemption from the hotel quarantine due to the presence of children accompanied by him during the application, but it happens is that he travels alone, so a hotel quarantine procedure is applied.</p> <p>7- To ensure that the hotel reservation statement booked via “Discover Qatar” website is authentic, by visiting the website, or to contact them, or show receipts for payment.</p> <p>8- Residents of the state of Qatar: when changing the travel document, (the previous document must be in the traveller’s possession) and the previous travel document must be expired, and in case of none of that happened the passenger must obtain a permit of passport loss through the competent authorities in the state of Qatar.</p> <p>9- Domestic workers accompanying GCC citizens must be accompanied by the sponsor or by one of the first-degree sponsor’s relatives and their residency is valid for a period of no less than 6 months in the country of residence. Their profession must be shown domestic worker or their equivalent and the travel document must be valid for a period not less than that of the residency permit.</p> <p>➤ All travel information and inquiries can be found via https://covid19.moph.gov.qa/EN/Pages/default.aspx</p> <p>PCR:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If there are MOPH approved COVID-19 testing centers at the country of travel, a COVID-19-free certificate should be obtained from one of these centers to be <u>exempted</u> from testing at the Airport. • The Certificate should not exceed 48 hours before travel, noting that the list of COVID-19 testing centers is updated regularly on the Ministry of Public Health’s website.
3	<u>KSA</u>	<p>Effective from 31st March 2021 (06:00AM):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Saudi citizens are allowed to travel abroad and return to the Kingdom. • Fully lifting of the suspension on all international flights. • Fully opening of all kingdom airports. <p>(Above instructions doesn’t apply to countries in which the concerned committee decides to suspend travel to or from due to COVID-19 outbreak)</p>

Effective from 03rd January 2021, All international flights will be resumed.

- **All non-Saudi passengers are allowed to travel outside The Kingdom (this doesn't include the countries where the new strain of Covid-19 has appeared)**
- Saudi citizens and their non-Saudi companions, and their non-Saudi spouse and children are allowed to enter the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.
- Egyptair is permitted to carry GCC citizens to / from KSA.
- Egyptair is permitted to carry non-Saudi passengers holding a valid visa (Exit / Entry / Residence "Iqamah" / Visit) to / from KSA.
- All non-Saudi nationals holding **TOURIST** visas are NOT allowed to enter KSA until the date of lifting the suspension of international flights completely.
- Non Saudi citizens travelling from UK and South Africa are allowed to enter KSA if he / she spent not less than 14 days in any country outside these countries (PCR test is required after these 14 days). (Saudi nationals are exempted in some urgent cases)
- Egyptair must distribute the disclaimer form "on board before arrival" to all passengers coming to KSA.
- All passengers must submit their filled and signed form to the airport health control center upon arrival at the airport.
- The above mentioned instructions shall not violate any conditions or approved requirements related to the restrictions or ban on travel for reasons that are not related to preventing the spread of COVID-19.
- All above doesn't apply to countries in which has been decided by the competent committee to take the necessary measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the Kingdom by suspending travel to / from those countries as a result of the outbreak of COVID-19 in it.
- Suspending travel to and from (**India, Brazil and Argentina**) including any person who has been in any of the mentioned countries in the last 14 days prior to their arrival to the Kingdom (**Passengers who have official government invitation are excluded from this**).
- **Health practitioners in India and their families are exempted from the suspension of travel to/from countries where COVID-19 outbreak.**
- **Passengers who need to travel from K.S.A before completing the approved quarantine period are permitted to leave according to the following conditions :**
 1. **Don't show symptoms of suspected infections of coronavirus**
 2. **To go directly from quarantine to the airport**
 3. **The presents of negative PCR test result for a sample taken after arrival in K.S.A with exemption for aircraft crewmember**

From arrival to the kingdom (3 days for health practitioners with negative PCR by the end of the period) at home.</u>
4	<u>JORDAN</u>	<p><u>International scheduled flights are allowed to operate from/to Jordan</u></p> <p><u>All arriving passengers are required to:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Airlines are responsible to ensure that before boarding each passenger has a valid QR code for the flight, <u>negative PCR test conducted within 72 hours before departure</u>, provided that a PCR test is submitted from the central public health laboratories – Egyptian Ministry of health approved by the Jordanian official authorities for arrivals from the Arabic Republic of Egypt. • <u>Another PCR will be done upon arrival on passengers cost (EgyptAir shall collect 28 JOD for every passenger as an EMD) except for (Any passengers have QR code/ diplomats and employees of regional and their families / Children under 5 years old)</u> • Health insurance for non-Jordanians and install (Aman mobile app).

- Another PCR test is required upon arrival.
 - PCR test is not required for children below 5 years of age.
 - Passenger must fill and **submit** the health declaration and locator form:

 - Passengers travelling to Jordan for Medical Tourism through “Salamtak Platform” are exempted from the condition of visiting <https://www.visitjordan.gov.jo/> and issuing a QR code, provided that they hold an approval from Crisis Operation Center.
 - Any passenger gives false or incorrect information is subject to a fine of 10,000 JDS.
- The accreditation laboratories for the PCR test as follows:**
- 1- The central laboratories of the armed forces.
 - 2- The central laboratories of the Egyptian Ministry of Health.
 - 3- Ain Shams Hospital Laboratories.
 - 4- Al-Borg Laboratories.
 - 5- Al-Mokhtabar Laboratories.
- INVESTORS who are in possession of (investment cards Category A & B / investor passport / investor residency) and their families are **allowed** to travel with a Negative PCR test 72 hours before STD, and are excluded from registration on the electronic platform (Visitjordan) for issuing the **QR code** paper.
 - Negative PCR test certificate which the passenger has issued from approved laboratories in Jordan before departure, can be used to return to Jordan in case of the passenger returns before 72 hours from the time of sampling when boarding the aircraft returning to Jordan.
 - Egyptian and Syrian passengers with permanent residence in the state of Kuwait are not permitted to travel to Kuwait via Amman point.
- QUARANTINE:**
- (7) Days self-quarantine after negative PCR test for other passengers arriving from all countries.
 - **Exemption of non-Jordanian nationalities from the conditions of travel health insurance for the purposes of medical tourism.**
 - **Passengers coming to Jordan for the purpose of medical tourism and who will come to Jordan through the salamtak platform do not need to obtain a QR code**
- Diplomat Passengers and their families:**
- Diplomats and employees of regional and international organizations (and their dependents and family members holding special or/and regular passports) residing in Jordan have special QR

		<p>code and are exempted from: PCR test before departure, PCR test upon arrival, health insurance.</p> <p><u>International transfer passengers are allowed at Jordanian airports as follows:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Negative PCR test is required within 72 hours before arrival from authorized laboratories. • The planned transfer time is not exceeding 10 hrs. • Any passenger who left the UK less than 14 days prior to the departure to Jordan will NOT be allowed to enter Jordan. 5	<u>KUWAIT</u>	<p>Effective till 02nd January 2021 (04:00 KWI LT), <u>All flights between Egypt and Kuwait will be resumed.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All non-Kuwaiti passengers arriving from (India / Iran / China / Brazil / Colombia / Armenia / Bangladesh / Philippines / Syria / Spain / Singapore / Bosnia and Herzegovina / Sri Lanka / Nepal / Iraq / Mexico / Indonesia / Chile / Pakistan / Egypt / Lebanon / Hong Kong / Italy / North Macedonia / Moldova / Panama / Peru / Serbia / Montenegro / Dominican Republic / Kosovo) are <u>not allowed</u> to enter Kuwait, whether they are directly from those countries or via transit through other countries not mentioned in the list, <u>UNLESS</u> they have settled in those unlisted countries for a period of 14 days at least, after the 14 days they must conduct a PCR test for COVID-19 virus and provide an approved certificate proving a negative result. (Validity of the certificate should not exceed 27 hours between the test date and arriving date to Kuwait) • Non-Kuwaiti arrival passengers - coming from the above mentioned countries – who are a first degree relative to Kuwaiti national (father / mother / husband / wife / sons / daughters) are allowed to enter Kuwait providing the proof of their relationship; this also includes the house labors accompanying the sponsor with a valid residency. (in the event of sponsor death outside Kuwait, house labors are allowed to enter Kuwait) • Valid residence passengers (+Valid card) are allowed to enter Kuwait if: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1- Left Kuwait not more than 6 months. 2- Left Kuwait after (1/9/2019). <p>If the passenger left Kuwait before (1/9/2019) will not be allowed to enter except having a valid permission for more than 6 months. - All airlines shall collect USD50 on every passenger wishing to travel to Lebanon except children under 12 years age and UNIFIL which is the cost of PCR test that every passenger shall undergo upon arrival to BRHIA through Labs authorized by the Lebanese ministry of public health at the Airport.

- **Effective 14/01/2021 till 25/01/2021:** All passengers arriving to Lebanon from (Addis Ababa / Istanbul / Adana / **CAIRO** / Baghdad) – arriving passengers means those who have performed PCR tests in those cities, not those transiting through- shall have a prepaid hotel booking for **7 DAYS** in one of the following hotels designated by the ministry of Tourism in Lebanon with discount rates at their own expenses. - **List of approved labs listed on the website (screening.purehealth.ae).**
- **Conducting a PCR test on day 6 if they are staying 6 or more consecutive days, as well as on day 12 if they are staying 12 or more consecutive days**
- Children below 12 years old **are exempted** from the initial PCR test in their Origin countries
- People of determination (medium and high) **are exempted** from the initial PCR test in their Origin countries.
- Returning UAE resident passengers from countries that don't have approved labs on UAE digital platform (screening.purehealth.ae), the airlines should coordinate with passenger to provide a negative PCR test (printed hard copy) from an approved lap in the origin country with validity of 96 hours upon arrival to Abu Dhabi.

- All arrivals passengers (including residents) should undergo PCR test upon arrival to Abu Dhabi airport,
- Egyptair must ensure passenger holding negative PCR test result of pre-testing prior checking-in from origin

QUARANTINE:

- Effective from 24th December ,2020 for all international passengers traveling to Abu Dhabi, both residents and tourists, the following will be applied:
 - All passengers coming from Green Countries (Australia, Brunei, China, Greece, Greenland, Hong Kong (SAR), Malaysia, Mauritius, New Zealand, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Taiwan-China, Tajikistan, Thailand, Uzbekistan, Vietnam) are **exempted** from Quarantine.
 - Reducing Quarantine period for all passengers coming from other countries to **10 days only.**
- 10 days Home Quarantine by giving them Medical Wristband, Passengers wishing to continue their journey to other emirates (Dubai, Sharjah etc..) may do so without the need of quarantine at Abu Dhabi and must use the dedicated Airport taxi to continue their journey
- Passenger is to download HOSN app for tracking purposes

Exceptions:

- Passengers holding diplomatic passports.
- Passengers below the age of 18
- Some of Arriving Passengers will be subject to institutional quarantine.
- **Regarding the seamen Quarantine note that it's not required if they will arrive AUH and will go direct to their ships for international destinations not domestic. For example they can't take the ship from Abu Dhabi to any other emirate such as Dubai or RAK.**

Departure passenger process:

- UAE nationals must register in TAWAJUDI other nationalities can proceed without. UAE nationals must download TAWAJUDI app.
- All departing passengers (UAE nationals and residents) must test negative within 96 hours prior traveling to any destination except China destinations.
- Passenger (UAE Nationals and other nationalities) to check destinations special medical requirements such as pre-PCR testing. Medical Insurance is recommended.
- Passenger should download ALHOSN application prior departures.

2- Dubai:

- All residents and tourists' passengers are required to obtain a negative PCR COVID19 certificate

before arriving into DXB or DWC (with certain Exceptions as stated below). Except UAE National are not required to conduct PCR test before arriving at DXB. Tested on arrival only.

- **Till 31/03/2021**, All residents can still return to Dubai even if with overstay out of state for more than 180 days, but in condition that resident permit is valid and passenger having the GDRFA return permit approval.

- **PCR: Passengers are categorized into 2 main Categories regarding PCR:**

A- Passengers arriving from the following list of 59 countries below (Whether Residents or Tourists):

- (Angola /Guinea / Kenya / South Sudan/ Zambia / Djibouti / Iran / Lebanon / Sudan / Zimbabwe / Egypt/ Iraq / Morocco / Syria / Eritrea / Israel / Rwanda / Tanzania / Ethiopia / Ivory Coast / Senegal / Tunisia / Ghana / Jordan / Somaliland /Uganda / Croatia / Georgia / Moldova / Russia / Cyprus / Hungary / Montenegro / Slovakia / Czech Republic / Malta / Romania /Ukraine / Pakistan / India / Vietnam / Tajikistan / Bangladesh / Philippine / Afghanistan / Cambodia / Nepal / Uzbekistan / Myanmar / Turkmenistan / Argentina / Chile / **Nigeria / South Africa / Indonesia**), Are Required to:

- Obtain a Negative PCR COVID19 certificate before arriving into DXB or DWC
- Print this Certificate in English or Arabic no later than 96 hours before departure; Children under 12 and passengers with moderate to severe disabilities are exempt from PCR. Hand written PCRs are not allowed.
- Undergo PCR test again at DXB before immigration and self-isolate until results.
- Passenger to stay at place of residence until PCR test results resolved.
- Transit Passengers in Dubai must have a pre-test PCR Certificate regardless of the destination point they are continuing to after Dubai if it requires PCR or not.
- Quarantine is required from passengers whose PCR tests results proved to be Positive, but Residents has to stay home until results released
- Download the COVID 19 DXB Smart App before departure. QR code to app on the declaration form.

B - Arriving at DXB from all other countries; are required to:

- Obtain a Negative PCR COVID19 certificate before arriving into DXB or DWC
- Print this Certificate in English or Arabic no later than 96 hours before departure; Children under 12 and passengers with moderate to severe disabilities are exempt from PCR. Hand written PCRs are not allowed.
- Transit passengers arriving at DXB/DWC from countries (Excluded from the list): All transiting passengers are not required to present a COVID 19 PCR test certificate unless it is mandated

by your final destination.

Exceptions:

- UAE **Residents** arriving at DXB/DWC (directly or indirectly via Cairo) from countries (Excluded from the above list): have the option to present a negative COVID 19 PCR test certificate that is valid for 96 hours from the date of the test before departure OR take the COVID 19 PCR test on arrival in Dubai.
- All Passengers arriving from GCC area (Directly or indirectly via Cairo) at DXB/DWC have the option to present a negative COVID 19 PCR test certificate that is valid for 96 hours from the date of the test before departure OR take the COVID 19 PCR test on arrival in Dubai.
- **UAE Nationals are not required to conduct PCR test before arriving at DXB. Tested on arrival only regardless from where they are coming from.**
- If passengers are arriving via Cairo for above mentioned first 3 exceptions, they should be in transit not leaving airport to entertain the exception. (if entered Cairo, then they would fall under Category A)
- **Passengers arriving from UK and Germany are not anymore exempted from PCR pre-testing before arriving to Dubai, they shall bring a Negative PCR Test Report before arriving to Dubai.**

General:

- All holders of UAE Residency regardless the residency issuing country, arriving to Dubai shall have a permit approval to enter Dubai, which is as follows:
- Residences issued at Dubai to get the usual approval from GDRFA. Link: (Smart.gdrfa.gov.ae)
- Residences issued at other emirates to get an approval from (uaeentry.ica.gov.ae)
- Tourists with valid visa or visa on arrival are not required to get any approvals from GDRFA or ICA.
- All Tourists shall have a valid health insurance in order to enter UAE, any passenger who doesn't have such a health insurance, he/she will not be allowed.
- Note: Health insurance companies not covering COVID-19 outbreak is Acceptable.
- All visit and Tourism passengers to Dubai are required to have a return ticket to the country of origin or otherwise might be refused entry.

 - First PCR test shall be carried out as close as possible to the time of entry into home isolation
 - Second PCR test shall be carried out not before day 9 of isolation period. In any case, minimum time interval of 24 hours shall be maintained between both PCR tests.
- The list of the countries from which there is no obligation for a state quarantine facility will be published on the MOH website.
- EgyptAir shall confirm that all foreign passengers hold a valid entry authorization issued by the Israeli authorities before boarding the aircraft.
- The entry to Israel will be denied for any foreign passenger who does not hold such valid authorization.
 - Foreign passengers are prohibited from entering to Israel; Exception is made for foreign passengers who have received written approval from population and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- Foreign Passengers who have stayed in (The United Kingdom, Denmark and South Africa) in the last 14 days are NOT allowed to enter Israel even if they are holding a permit to enter the country.
- EgyptAir is required to notify any Passenger who holding an Israeli passport and about to return from: The United Kingdom, Denmark and South Africa or who have stayed in those countries for

the last 14 days, that upon arrival to Israel they will be evacuated to Governmental isolation.

- EgyptAir is obligate to report by phone call to the border control about any Passenger who arriving to Israel from those countries on connecting flights. (I.e. UK-FRA-TLV)
- All Passengers who are not an Israeli citizens or resident are **not allowed** to enter ISRAEL, including transit passengers except for passengers who have a specific entry approval from The Population and Immigration Authority. The airline is responsible for returning the passenger whose entry into Israel is denied to his airport of origin.
- All passengers on international flights arriving to Israel must complete a digital Health Declaration through the Israeli Ministry of Health website, not more than 24 hours prior to their flight (It is the Airlines responsibility to ask their passengers to present the Health Declaration during the boarding in the origin Stations).
- Transit process at Ben Gurion Airport is discontinued
- All pets flying to Israel must obtain a written approval letter from the veterinary services at Ben Gurion Airport.**(for more information refer to Circular no. 121 (I) / 2020/date 24/06/2020)**
- All pets owner that must be quarantined in government quarantine premises, require an import permit
- The check-in counters will open 4 hours prior to the scheduled departure.
 - All passengers on international flights arriving to or departing from Israel must complete a digital process through the Israeli Ministry of Health website, not more than 24 hours prior to their flight. - **Effective from 07/01/2021 till 20/01/2021**, all passengers out of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the Republic of South Africa with a destination in Germany **are prohibited** to be transported to the Federal Republic of Germany.
- **Exempt from the ban on carriage** are passengers who can present a negative Corona test (antigen or PCR) not older than 48 hours and who belong to one of the following groups of persons:
 - German nationals,
 - EU nationals entitled to freedom of movement as well as their family members with permanent residence in Germany
 - third-country nationals with permanent residence in Germany who hold a residence title or a visa for long-term residence for Germany, and
 - persons who do not enter Germany and are staying exclusively in airport transit and who meet the necessary requirements for this purpose.
- Passengers entering Germany from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or The Republic of South Africa; (sars-cov-2) testing is **mandatory**.
- As of January 19, 2021, at 0:00 a.m., Brazil is designated as an area at particularly high risk of

infection due to widespread occurrence of SARS-CoV-2 virus variants. passengers should be advised to complete the Digital Entry Declaration and carry a certificate of a negative test result for SARS-CoV-2 prior to travel. Carriers are required to verify the presence of both documents. Carriage is not permitted without these documents

- **PCR/ QUARANTINE:**
- **Effective from 24th January 2021**, Passengers from high incidence areas (**Egypt** is considered high incidence areas) are obliged to carry a proof of negative testing not more than 48 hours prior to entry.
- The test can be PCR or Antigen.
- Passengers are obliged to fill in DEA via (www.einreiseanmeldung.de).
- **Effective from 8th of November** new quarantine regulations will be in force for inbound passengers returning from or staying in the last 10 days in risk areas. **Egypt is still categorized as a risk country.**
- **In addition to the mentioned quarantine, passengers are required to undergo testing (SARS-COV2) virus no more than 48 hours before or immediately after entry.**
- Those travelers are obliged to go directly to their home or other suitable accommodation immediately after their return and to stay there permanently for a period of 10 days.
- In order to shorten the 10 days quarantine, a **PCR-Covid-19 test** can be done from the fifth day after entry onwards. After receiving a negative test result the quarantine ends.
- **Free tests are available for passengers returning from risk areas until 15 December 2020, in case the test is done within 10 days after entry. Starting at December 16, 2020 returning passengers –also from risk areas – have to pay for testing by themselves.**

Also Passengers who travel from Category A and/or Category B Countries but they have stayed/lived or travelled abroad within the last 14 days or that they have been passengers on an international flight to/from a country from Category C within the last 14 days

- **Passengers should complete the Cyprus Flight Pass (<https://www.cyprusflightpass.gov.cy>) within 24 hours prior to their departure flight.**

Hereunder the list of categories which are allowed to enter the Netherlands for the time being: EU citizens, including UK nationals and members of their families* can travel freely (no specific reasons have to be documented).

Non-EU citizens covered by the under mentioned exceptions should travel well documented:

- Nationals and inhabitants of Norway, Iceland, Switzerland , Monaco, Andorra, San Marino en Vatican city, and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland. [Check whether they need a visa.](#)
- Third-country nationals holding a residence card or a residence permit in accordance with Directive 2003/109/EC (the LTR Directive) and their family if they are traveling or are joining

them to Netherland [First check whether they need a visa.](#)

- Third-country nationals who derive their right of residence from other European Directives or from the national law of a Member State and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland. [Check whether they need a visa.](#)
- Holders of a long-stay visa [authorization for temporary stay or 'MVV'](#)
- Holders of a valid residence permit and their family members if they are traveling or are joining them to Netherland.
- Other third country nationals who have a vital function or need, including:
 - Healthcare personnel; doctors, nurses or researchers;
 - Border workers;
 - Seasonal workers;
 - Persons employed in the transport of goods and other transport personnel, where necessary, including container ships, bulk carriers (e.g. ore or coal), tankers (fuels and chemicals), fisheries, persons employed in the energy sector i.e. oil and gas platforms and wind farms as well as offshore companies providing services to this sector, and flightcrew;
 - You are a cross-border commuter.
 - Seafarers in possession of a seaman's book, with the exception of seafarers on commercial and pleasure yachts;
 - Diplomats, or service passport holder in the performance of their duties;
 - Armed forces personnel, in the performance of their duties;
 - Personnel of international and humanitarian organizations;
 - Persons who have imperative reasons to visit their families; these are journeys in exceptional cases.
An exceptional case is visiting a terminally ill family member and attending a funeral. It is intended for first-degree and second-degree family members. Father, mother and children are first-degree and partner, grandchildren, brothers and sisters are second degree.
 - Visiting a terminally ill family member or attending a funeral. You must be a family member in the first or second degree (as defined in Dutch law).
 - Coming to the Netherlands to be with your legal partner when they give birth. This applies to the father of the child only. If you are not legally married, you must have acknowledged paternity of the unborn child. You must also be able to prove that your partner is more

than 34 weeks pregnant.

- Citizens of non-EU+ countries can transfer to a country outside the EU+ via Amsterdam airport, if they remain in the non-Schengen transit area of the airport and if they have a ticket for a confirmed connecting flight -to an airport outside the Schengen area- that departs within 48 hours upon arrival in Amsterdam.
- Persons in need of international protection; the border procedure applies in full;
- Persons admitted for humanitarian reasons;
- Students; provided that you are in possession of a residence notification letter issued by the IND: "Study".
- Highly skilled migrants: provided that you are in possession of a notification letter issued by the IND for residence as: Highly skilled migrant.
- Long distance relationship (type C visa).

- All passengers - including Dutch citizens and transferring passengers- (Passengers aged 13 or older) **MUST** show a negative test declaration Covid-19 and the negative test result when boarding the aircraft and on arrival to The Netherlands at the Royal Netherlands Marechaussee border control filter. (LAMP (PCR) test now also allowed)
- **Effective from January 23rd 2021 0:01 LT, in addition to the mandatory negative PCR-test results, the test-declaration, the health declaration the government adds a mandatory COVID-19 negative rapid antigen-test to the spectrum of test that need to be carried out for air travel to The Netherlands. This test is also mandatory for transfer/transit passengers.**
- **The COVID-19 rapid antigen-test must be performed within 4 hours prior to departure.**
- If a passenger cannot show the negative test declaration form, then the passenger may not board.
- Passengers arriving in The Netherlands without valid negative test results and the mandatory form may be denied entry to the Netherlands and will have to depart again (on the same airline to the country of departure). Airlines carrying passengers without valid negative test results and the

accompanying form may be subject to a fine.

Exceptions to the requirement to present a negative test result

- The following people do not need a negative test result:
 - Children under 13;
 - People arriving from countries on the EU list of safe countries;
 - Cross-border commuters (including students and school children);
 - Holders of a diplomatic identity card issued by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs;
 - Holders of non-Dutch diplomatic passports;
 - Holders of Dutch diplomatic passports, if they are travelling as part of their job, in order to perform their job or after performing their job;
 - Heads of state and members of foreign governments;
 - Individuals who work in the goods transport sector, and other transportation personnel in so far as necessary. This includes lorry drivers and individuals who work on container ships, bulk carriers (e.g. of ore and coal), tankers (fuel and chemicals) and fishing vessels. It also includes individuals who work in the energy sector, including oil and gas platforms and offshore wind farms, offshore companies that provide services to this sector, and air, cruise-ship and ferry crew members if they are travelling in order to perform their job;
 - Seafarers who possess a seaman's record book if they are travelling as part of their job, in order to perform work or after performing work. This exemption does not apply to seafarers on commercial yachts and pleasure craft;
 - Passengers on flights which do not have a Dutch airport as their destination, but are diverted to a Dutch airport due to unforeseen circumstances.
 - Passengers with a NATO Travel Order or a NATO-2 visum.
- Details on test report and declaration

The following requirements are applicable for the mandatory test report:

 1. Test must be a molecular PCR Sars-Cov-2/COVID-19 test. Other types are not allowed.
 2. Test result should be negative (or non-detected)
 3. The test result should be in Dutch, English, German, French or Spanish
 4. Test report should include first and Family name, matching with the Passport

5. Test report should include Date and time of test: must be maximum 72 hours before arrival in the Netherlands

6. Details of the institute or lab that performed the test

- Every passenger, regardless of the nationality, who takes an Extra-Schengen flight to Belgium is obliged to complete this form before departure. The passenger must sign and date the “Public Health Passenger Locator Form”.
- If a passenger did not complete the "Public Health Passenger Locator Form" and boarded the plane, the Belgian authorities can **refuse** the access on the Belgian territory.

- journeys undertaken in the framework of co-parenting;

- journeys in the context of funerals or cremations in the case of a first and second degree relationship;

3- Transit in Belgium in the case of air travel from the United Kingdom, provided that the final destination is outside the European Union".

- **PCR:**

- **Effective from 25th December 2020**, a Mandatory Negative PCR test certificate is required from all passengers traveling to BELGIUM within **72** hours before arrival (**Residents and children younger than 12 years old are exempted**).

- The document can be in paper format or in electronic format but must be consultable immediately.

- The document must be in English, German, French or Dutch.

- As passenger passes the Belgian border control, he needs to have a negative PCR test.

- **Till January 15, 2021**: residents who return from a red zone and stayed longer than 48 hours are asked to have themselves tested on day 1 and day 7 of the quarantine, in a testing center. The test capacity at Brussels Airport will be expanded to this end, to allow incoming travelers to be tested there voluntarily immediately; test capacity in Charleroi and Brussels-South is being developed.

(1) For residents returning from a stay abroad for professional reasons, a derogation from the quarantine obligation can be granted **until 4 January** on the basis of a certificate from the employer that the relocation took place for professional reasons.

(2) For people (non-residents as well as residents) who fulfill critical functions in essential sectors, during the quarantine period, work at the place of employment may be allowed within the framework of the decision of the IMC dated. 2/12/2020; Here too, a certificate from the employer is required.

- a person who is exempt from the requirements to obtain a temporary resident visa under paragraph 190 (2)(a) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, and the immediate family members of that person;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada at the invitation of the Minister of Health for the purpose of assisting in the COVID-19 response;
- A person who arrives by any means of conveyance operated by Canadian Forces or the Department of National Defence;
- a member of the Canadian Forces or a visiting force, as defined in section 2 of the Visiting Forces Act, and the immediate family members of that member;
- a French citizen who resides in Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon who has been only in Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon, the United States or Canada during the period of 14 days before the day on which they arrived in Canada;
- a person or any person in a class of persons who, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer, appointed under subsection 6 (1) of the Public Health Agency of Canada Act, does not pose a risk of significant harm to public health or who will provide an essential service while in Canada;
- a person or any person in a class of persons whose presence in Canada, as determined by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Citizenship and Immigration or the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness, is in the national interest;
- The holder of a valid work permit or study permit, as defined under section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- A person whose application for a work permit referred to in paragraph (l) was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and who has received written notice of the approval, but who has not yet been issued the permit;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of attending a listed institution, and the immediate family members of that person other than a dependent child of a dependent child of the person, if the person hold a valid student permit as defined in section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, if the person may apply for a study permit when entering Canada under section 214 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations, or if the person's application for a study permit was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and they received written notice of the approval but have not yet been issued the permit;
- person permitted to work in Canada as a student in a health field under paragraph 186(p) of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- A person permitted to work in Canada as a provider of emergency services under paragraph 186(t) of the

Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;

- a licensed health care professional with proof of employment in Canada;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of delivering, maintaining, or repairing medically-necessary equipment or devices;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of donating or making medical deliveries of stem cells, blood and blood products, tissues, organs or other body parts, that are required for patient care in Canada during the validity of the Order or within a reasonable period of time after the expiry of the Order;
- a person whose application for permanent residence was approved under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, and who received written notice of the approval before noon, Eastern Daylight Time on March 18, 2020, but who has not yet become a permanent resident under that Act;
- a worker in the marine transportation sector who is essential for the movement of goods by vessel, as defined in section 2 of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001 and who seeks to enter Canada for the purpose of performing their duties in that sector;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada to take up post as a diplomat, consular officer, representative or official of a country other than Canada, of the United Nations or any of its agencies or of any intergovernmental organization of which Canada is a member, and the immediate family members of that person;
- a person who arrives at a Canadian airport aboard a commercial passenger conveyance and who is transiting to a country other than Canada and remains in a sterile transit area within the meaning of section 2 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations;
- a person who seeks to enter Canada on board a vessel, as defined in section 2 of the Canada Shipping Act, 2001, that is engaged in research and that is operated by or under the authority of the Government of Canada or at its request or operated by a provincial government, a local authority or a government, council or other entity authorized to act on behalf of an Indigenous group.
- Final decision of accepting passengers onboard is subjected to the approval of the Canadian Boarder Service Agency.
- All passengers travelling to Canada are required to download (Arrive CAN) application to provide specific information upon entry into Canada, including providing an appropriate 14 day quarantine plan, contact information, and updates on symptoms through self-assessment.(within 48 hours before arriving in Canada)
- **QUARANTINE: All travelers entering Canada are subject to 14 day quarantine upon arrival. This does not apply to medical or cargo personnel on essential movements.**

- Passengers holding visa type B1 or B2 or any other type of visa:
The restrictions only pertain to B1 / B2 visa holders that have been present in certain countries in the past 14 days. Those countries include China, Iran, EU/Schengen area, UK, Republic of Ireland, and Brazil. So essentially, if those B1B2 visa holders were NOT present in any of those countries during the 14 days prior to travel to the US, there are no restrictions.
- Passenger holding EU citizen (Schengen area)
Again, the restrictions are on where the passenger is coming from, rather than their citizenship in this case. If they hold EU citizenship but have not been present in China, Iran, UK, Republic of Ireland, Brazil or the Schengen regions in the 14 days prior to travel, then there are no restrictions.
- Passengers coming from china or Iran
Unless they fall under one of the exemptions, they will be refused entry under the Presidential Proclamations if they are coming directly from either country. The exemptions should be listed on the following website: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers>
- Temporary Suspension of Dogs Entering the United States from Egypt Dogs from Egypt may be imported only with CDC's advance written approval, including dogs imported from a third-party country if they lived in the other country for less than 6 months. For more information: CDCAnimalimports@cdc.gov
- All airlines are required to confirm a **negative COVID-19 test result** and collect a passenger attestation on behalf of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for certain passengers on aircraft departing from the United Kingdom and arriving in the United States.

Washington:

QUARANTINE: No quarantine is required.

PCR:

- Effective 26 January 2021, All passengers travelling to USA must have a negative COVID-19 test (PCR / LAMP) during the 72 Hours preceding the flight's departure from a foreign country OR Written or electronic documentation of a positive viral test result that confirms the passenger had a previous COVID-19 infection and a letter from a licensed health care provider or public health official stating the passenger is cleared to travel (so-called "Documentation of Recovery")
- Test is a nucleic acid amplification test or a viral antigen test
- EgyptAir must confirm that each passenger 2 years or older has documentation of a negative test or a Documentation of Recovery
- EgyptAir must retain a copy of each passenger attestation for 2 years.
- Passengers must retain a copy of their negative test or Documentation of Recovery and present it for
