Founded in 1919, The American University in Cairo (AUC) is a premier English-language institution of higher learning. The University is committed to teaching and research of the highest caliber, and offers exceptional liberal arts and professional education in a cross-cultural environment. AUC builds a culture of leadership, lifelong learning, continuing education and service among its graduates, and is dedicated to making significant contributions to Egypt and the international community in diverse fields. Chartered and accredited in the United States and Egypt, it is an independent, not-for-profit, equal-opportunity institution. AUC upholds the principles of academic freedom and is dedicated to excellence.

AUC's English-language environment is designed to promote proficient use of learning tools as well as enhance students' critical thinking capabilities, language and personal skills. AUC considers it essential to foster in students an appreciation of their own culture and heritage and their responsibilities toward society. The University's aim of promoting international understanding is supported by means of scholarship, learned discourse, a multicultural campus environment and a diversified publishing program.

Currently, AUC has 423 full-time faculty members in active teaching positions, in addition to 358 part-time faculty members (who teach the equivalent of an instruction load equal to 174 full-time faculty). AUC also has an academic program enrollment of 6,824 students, with a faculty to student ratio of 1 to 11.4. The total number of full-time faculty members, including faculty on sabbatical and other release time, as well as librarians, researchers and administrators with faculty status, is 485. Their nationalities are Egyptian (53 percent), American (31 percent) and others (16 percent).

# SCHOOL OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The School of Continuing Education (SCE) provides certificate programs; noncredit, semester-length courses; and customized courses of variable length to fulfill the continuing educational needs of individuals and organizations in Egypt and the Middle East. SCE's regularly scheduled courses and certificate programs are offered at AUC Tahrir Square, Heliopolis, Zamalek and El Gouna. Courses and certificate programs have been developed to be offered at AUC New Cairo, and customized courses may be conducted on site at the organization's facilities. Ten laboratories allow for state-of-the-art computer and English-language training in AUC Tahrir Square. Special summer youth programs provide academic enrichment and skill development for children.

# PROFESSIONAL TRAINING

The Engineering and Science Services unit provides high-quality training and services to the industrial community in Egypt and the Middle East. Its programs include intensive courses, professional certificate programs, distance education, customized training, collaborative certification programs with international agencies, technical assistance and applied research to help the local industry meet the challenges of the international market. In the fiscal year 2010 – 2011, the unit offered seven professional programs, six international certificates and more than 60 intensive courses. It served 5,000 trainees (engineers and scientists).

**The Management Center's** programs serve senior executives and middle managers by applying the latest management concepts and best practices to today's marketplace. In the fiscal year 2010 - 2011, the Management Center offered 257 programs through its three institutes. It served 6,067 trainees with total training hours of 12,849 in Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates.

The Kamal Adham Center for Television and Digital Journalism provides nondegree, professional training to the broader Egyptian and international communities, in addition to its Master of Arts program and undergraduate offerings. Media professionals may take courses in voice coaching, video editing, studio production, camera operation and television script writing. Facilities include a state-of-the-art television studio, digital newsroom and editing labs. The center also collaborates with international agencies to conduct public service and digital journalism workshops.

The International Executive Education Institute (IEEI) was established in 2008 to provide world-class, executive development programs in partnership with leading business schools in Europe, North America and Asia. In 2009 – 2010, IEEI expanded its open enrollment and company-specific programs, growing its alumni to 472 senior executives from 188 leading organizations in Egypt and the region. In the same year, IEEI launched the Real Estate Academy, in partnership with the National University of Singapore.

The Citadel Capital Financial Services Center offers students, researchers and professionals an array of services that integrate hands-on financial services practice with classroom-based financial concepts such as securities trading, risk management and asset allocation. More than 1,000 AUC students, faculty members, alumni and professionals have benefited from the center's resources and services over the past five years.

The Goldman Sachs 10,000 Women Entrepreneurship and Leadership Program, in partnership with the Wharton School of Business of the University of Pennsylvania, aims at enhancing the growth and development of female entrepreneurs in the Arab region and the Middle East through a unique blend of classroom learning, business advising, as well as mentoring and networking services. Qualified graduates are provided with access to finance through the Social Fund for Development. The program serves Egypt as well as the Middle East and Arab region, and has graduated 235 entrepreneurs since its inception in 2008.

# UNIQUE FEATURES AND SPECIAL SERVICES

The Rare Books and Special Collections Library is a research-level facility consisting of more than 35,000 books, as well as world-class holdings of vintage photographs, maps and archival collections in many subject areas, particularly Egyptology, Islamic art and architecture, contemporary regional architecture, photography, politics and culture.

# Special accreditation

AUC's undergraduate programs in construction engineering, electronics engineering, mechanical engineering and computer science are accredited by ABET. AUC's undergraduate programs in accounting and business administration are accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International (AACSB), as is the master's program in business administration. English 100 and the Intensive English Program are both accredited by the Commission on English Language Program Accreditation (CEA). AUC's Management Center is accredited by the Accrediting Council for Continuing Education and Training (ACCET), and the School of Continuing Education is accredited by the International Association for Continuing Education and Training (IACET).

The Mohamed Taymour Writing Center provides services to assist faculty members, as well as graduate and undergraduate students, to improve their communication and writing skills.

The Office of Student Support provides student-centered services through psychological counseling, academic mentoring, learning and physical disabilities accommodations, and conduct of ethics to all students.

**AUC Press** is recognized as the region's leading English-language publisher, with more than 1,000 publications in print and up to 100 new scholarly and general books each year, in addition to Arabic literature in English translation.

The Center for Arabic Study Abroad (CASA) offers superior-level, intensive Arabic-language training for American undergraduate and graduate students, as well as professors, specializing in various areas of Middle East studies.

Career Advising and Placement Services (CAPS) provides quality career services to students, alumni and employers in the areas of career planning and employment through a centralized, comprehensive program. Students and alumni benefit from career-advising sessions, in addition to career exploration and internship programs. They have access to more than 5,000 career opportunities announced annually by more than 500 employers.

The enrollment of students from 90 different countries during the Fall 2011 semester indicates the geographical and cultural diversity of AUC's student body.

# LIBRARIES AND LEARNING TECHNOLOGIES

Libraries and Learning Technologies includes the AUC Library, the Rare Books and Special Collections Library, and the Center for Learning and Teaching. The AUC Library and the Rare Books and Special Collections Library offer one of the most extensive research collections in Egypt. Current holdings include 501,198 print volumes (books and periodicals), 59,877 current periodical subscriptions in print and electronic format, and 168 databases.

# SPORTS AND ATHLETICS

AUC offers an extensive variety of on-campus sports programs for all students. AUC students also participate in 30 different competitive sports against other universities. Three hundred and twenty seven student athletes representing AUC in the National Universities Tournament ranked fifth among 36 Egyptian universities in 2010 - 2011. AUC athletes won 24 medals (four gold, eight silver and 12 bronze). AUC athletes also participated in African, Arab and international championships.

# PHYSICAL PLANT

The main AUC campus is located in the New Cairo district on a 260-acre site. The total built area of the campus is 200,000 square meters. In addition, AUC Tahrir Square provides facilities for continuing education located in the center of Cairo. Two additional large, multipurpose buildings in the Zamalek and Heliopolis regions of Cairo serve as satellite campuses, and faculty and staff housing units are located throughout the Cairo metropolitan area. The total area of the University's owned and leased space is about 300,000 square meters.

# RESEARCH

Teaching research methods is an integral part of AUC's academic programs. Individual faculty efforts, internally and externally funded projects, and activities conducted by the University's research centers represent AUC's strong commitment to research and service in the region.

In 2010 - 2011, AUC awarded \$364,242 and LE 349,448,92 in student financial aid. Other awarded scholarships included achievement scholarships (\$6,712,920), sports scholarships (\$234,437) and cultural scholarships (\$97,781). In addition, work-study undergraduate students earned \$90,534. Work-study graduate students earned (\$51,900), and graduate fellowship students earned \$2,217,669 toward tuition payments. Faculty, staff and their dependents were provided the equivalent of \$6,113,146 in tuition waivers as part of fringe benefits. Other scholarships included the Leadership for Education and Development (LEAD) program, as well as named and presidential scholarships.

# **GRADUATES AND ALUMNI**

AUC has 27,789 graduates of degree programs. There are also more than 10,000 alumni from the Arabic Language Institute, the Center for Arabic Study Abroad (CASA) and study-abroad programs. Additional thousands have been students in AUC's nondegree, certificate and diploma programs and in short-term classes. The alumni association has listings for 30,919 active alumni.
